WHEREAS, in 2012, the State of Michigan created the "Secure Cities Partnership" with the goal of combatting high violent crime rates in the cities of Flint, Saginaw, Detroit, and Pontiac; and

WHEREAS, the Office of the Prosecuting Attorney received \$250,000.00 in grant funds for FY2012-13 and \$200,000.00 in funds for each fiscal year thereafter to create and maintain a "Major Cases Bureau," which consists of two senior-level assistant prosecutors and one paralegal; and

WHEREAS, the total salary and fringe benefits costs for the Major Cases Bureau is \$241,465.00, with the \$41,465.00 not covered by the grant being included in the Office of the Prosecuting Attorney's general fund budget; and

WHEREAS, the State of Michigan has informed the county that it will not provide funding after FY2016-17, because the purpose of the Secure Cities Partnership was to assist the local municipalities in establishing and providing a foundation for the program and;

WHEREAS, with increased revenue streams through the Title IV-E and Crime Victim Services grants, the much-needed Major Cases Bureau program will be able to continue through the Office of the Prosecuting Attorney's general fund budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by this Board of County Commissioners of Genesee County, Michigan, that the request by the Office of the Prosecuting Attorney to authorize maintaining and fully funding the Major Cases Bureau through the general fund for FY2017-18 is approved (a copy of the memorandum request

WHEREAS, this Board, acting pursuant to MCL §141.414, now desires to amend the Proposed Budget from that which appeared in the attachment to Resolution 17-416.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by this Board that:

- 1. The heretofore Proposed Budget set forth in the attachment to Resolution 17-416, which Proposed Budget now is before this Board for any further action as may be desired pursuant to MCL §141.414, is amended to constitute in its entirety the document attached to this Resolution, being the document entitled "GENESEE COUNTY, MICHIGAN ADOPTED BUDGET Fiscal Year 2017/2018," which document is hereinafter referred to as the Fiscal Year 2017/18 Budget.
- 2. The estimated revenues which constitute the revenues component of the Fiscal Year 2017/18 Budget are those summarized at pages I through IV of that Budget and detailed, as to General Fund revenues, at pages V through VIII of that Budget in the columns captioned "2017/2018 Adopted Budget," and, as to other revenues, at pages 2 through 208 of that Budget, in the lines making up each "REVENUE Total" and within the columns captioned "2017/2018 Adopted Budget."
- 3. The expenditures component of the Fiscal Year 2017/18 Budget is a line item expenditures budget, which is summarized at pages IX through XI of that Budget, the specific line items of which, including without limitation the amounts for each such item, and the other designations and respective amounts for which, are all as fully set forth in the Fiscal Year 2017/18 Budget, at pages 2 through 208, with the budgeted expenditures being those entered in the lines making up each "EXPENSE Total" and within the columns under the captions "2017/2018 Adopted Budget".
- 4. A summary of the Fiscal Year 2017/18 Adopted Budget, with the estimated Fund Balance of the General Fund on October 1, 2017, and the projected Fund Balance of the General Fund on September 30, 2018, is shown on page XII of that Budget.

- 5. The Proposed Budget, as above amended, is by this Board legislatively found and declared to reflect a reasonable allocation of revenues to the various County funded budgetary centers, and is so found and declared to allow all mandated or required programs and activities to be performed at reasonable, necessary and serviceable levels or at even more adequate levels of performance. In making these findings this Board has considered not only information received by this Board and this Board's Finance Committee during presentations and deliberations formally described as relating to the Fiscal Year 2017/18 Budget, but also other information received by this Board, and by all of its Committees having all County Commissioners as members, regarding County budgetary centers and County funded programs and activities, irrespective of whether such other information was received during presentations or deliberations formally described as relating to that Budget.
- 6. Any above provisions of this Resolution notwithstanding, the heretofore Proposed Budget, as approved in Resolution 17-416, but as above amended, is adopted as the Budget for Genesee County for the fiscal year commencing October 1, 2017, and ending September 30, 2018, and the line item appropriations necessary to support the budgeted line item expenditures in that Budget are made, and such Fiscal Year 2017/18 Budget is Genesee County's "general appropriations act" within the meaning of Act 2.
- 7. The Fiscal Year 2017/18 Budget includes the total number of mills of ad valorem property taxes to be levied to support that Budget, as set forth at pages II and III thereof, and the purposes for which that millage is to be levied, as set forth in pages IX through XI thereof, and this Board orders such taxes in the component levies specified at pages II and III, and specific taxes the revenue from which also is included in that Budget,

to be raised, subject to constitutional and statutory limitations. This Board's Chairperson and the County Clerk/Register are authorized to sign State form L-4029 for 2017, on behalf of the County, certifying these levies.

- 8. The Controller is authorized to execute transfers between appropriations in the Fiscal Year 2017/18 Budget, to the extent provided for on page XI of that Budget.
- 9. The following fee schedules of the Genesee County Health Department, copies of which are attached to this Resolution, are approved and adopted to be in effect commencing October 1, 2017: a four page schedule for the Division of Environmental Health Services, the first listed fee of which is for "Satellite school kitchen, Senior center...." and the last listed fee of which is for "Tobacco Retailer License." All of the fees on these schedules are to be in effect October 1, 2017, and are to remain in effect, even subsequent to year 2017, unless and until hereafter amended, and the Health Officer is authorized to amend the Fee Schedule throughout the fiscal year, as necessary, in response to manufacturers' price increases.
- 10. Any and all authority of this Board to amend the herein adopted Fiscal Year 2017/18 Budget, including without limitation any authority to reduce an appropriation herein provided for and the authority to provide for allotment of any appropriation, is fully reserved, and the preceding reference to providing for allotment through Board action is not intended to, and does not, diminish any otherwise existing authority of the County Controller to cause appropriations to be divided into allotments.
- 11. The provisions of this Resolution, in their applicability to any one budgetary center, or to any one office, position, person or line item, are severable from their applicability to any other budgetary center, office, position, person or line item.

- 12. Any previous resolution of this Board, or any document adopted in any such resolution, including without limitation the County's Personnel Policy Manual, is rescinded to the extent of application, if any, but only to such extent of application, that would be inconsistent with this Resolution.
- 13. This Board's Coordinator is directed to inform all Department Heads of the adoption, and to provide each of them with a copy, of this Resolution.

GENESEE COUNTY, MICHIGAN PROPERTY TAX MILLAGES RELATING TO 2017-2018 ADOPTED BUDGET

The 2017 ad valorem property taxes levied and to be levied by Genesee County will be:

- 5.5072 mills for general operations
- 0.4847 mills for emergency medical services
- 0.7500 mills for parks and recreation
- 0.7000 mills for senior services
- 1.0000 mills for uninsured health services delivery system
- 0.1000 mills for veterans services
- 0.0400 mills for MSU extension services
- 0.2000 mills for animal control services

8.7819 Total Mills

Subject to constitutional and statutory limitations and subject to any revisions hereafter authorized by the County's electorate, the County's 2018 ad valorem property taxes will be the same 8.7819 mills, with the same components and purposes, as are stated above with respect to the 2017 taxes. Constitutional and statutory limitations could require these millages to be reduced for the 2017 taxes.

The County's 2017-2018 Budget (the Budget) will be funded by a portion of the revenues from the County's 2017 summer ad valorem property tax, the revenues from the County's December 2017 ad valorem property tax, the revenues from the County's 2018 summer ad valorem property tax, and revenues from sources other than the ad valorem property tax.

The December 2017 levy will include 0.4847 mills for emergency medical services, 0.7500 mills for parks and recreation, 0.7000 mills for senior services, 1.0000 mill for uninsured health services delivery system, 0.1000 mills for veterans services, 0.0400 mills for MSU Extension services, and 0.200 mills for animal control services.

The above identified December 2017 levies are to be used to fund the Budget, to the extent of \$4,141,460 for emergency medical services (also identified as paramedics), \$6,408,284 for parks and recreation, \$5,981,065 for senior services, \$8,544,378 for uninsured health services delivery system, \$854,438 for veterans services, \$341,775 for MSU Extension services, and \$1,708,876 for animal control services.

Subject to constitutional and statutory limitations, and to any revisions hereafter authorized by the County's electorate, the County's 2018 summer tax will be 5.5072 mills for general operations. The estimated revenues from this levy are \$46,770,752. In addition, an estimated \$4,677,075 in collections from the County's 2017 summer tax will be recognized as revenue for general operations for use in the County's 2017/2018 fiscal year.

The mills to be levied in support of this Budget thus are 5.5072 for general operations, 0.4847 for emergency medical services, 0.7500 for parks and recreation, 0.7000 for senior services, 1.0000 for uninsured health services delivery system, 0.1000 for veterans services, 0.0400 for MSU Extension services, and 0.2000 for animal control services for a total of 8.7819 mills. The total revenue estimated from these mills is \$79,728,103.

The various purposes for which the above identified general operations revenue is to be utilized are those identified in pages IX through XI for which there is an amount stated in the column under the heading "General Fund." The respective amounts allocated to those purposes are those stated in that "General Fund" column.

THIS FIRST SUPPLEMENT, dated as of September 1, 2017 (this "Supplement"), is entered into by and among the KAREGNONDI WATER AUTHORITY, a municipal authority and public body corporate of the State of Michigan (the "Authority"), the CITY OF FLINT, located in the County of Genesee, State of Michigan (the "City of Flint"), and the COUNTY OF GENESEE, State of Michigan (the "County of Genesee"). The City of Flint and the County of Genesee may be referred to herein individually as a "Local Unit" or collectively as the "Local Units."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Authority has been incorporated under the provisions of Act No. 233, Public Acts of Michigan, 1955, as amended ("Act 233"); and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Act 233, the Authority and the Local Units have entered into that certain Karegnondi Water Authority Financing Contract, dated as of August 1, 2013 (the "Financing Contract"), wherein the Authority agreed to acquire, construct and equip a water supply system to provide untreated water to the Local Units, as more particularly described in the Financing Contract (the "System"); and

WHEREAS, in order to finance the costs of the acquisition, construction and equipping of the System, the Financing Contract authorizes the issuance of bonds of the Authority, in one or more series, in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$300,000,000, to be secured by the contractual obligations of each Local Unit as specified in the Financing Contract; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Financing Contract, the Authority has previously issued its Water Supply System Bonds (Karegnondi Water Pipeline), Series 2014A, dated April 16, 2014, in the aggregate principal amount of \$220,500,000; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Financing Contract, the Authority has previously issued its Water Supply System Bonds (Karegnondi Water Pipeline), Series 2016, dated June 10, 2016, in the aggregate principal amount of \$74,370,000 (the "Series 2016 Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the Series 2016 Bonds have a stated maturity date of May 1, 2018, and the Authority and the Local Units have determined that it is necessary and in the best interests of the Authority and the Local Units that the Authority refund all of the outstanding Series 2016 Bonds in order to establish permanent long-term financing for the capital costs of the System; and

WHEREAS, the Authority and the Local Units have further determined that it is necessary for the Authority to issue additional bonds under and pursuant to the terms of the Financing Contract, in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$4,200,000, to pay or to reimburse the Authority for the costs of completing the acquisition, construction and equipping of the System; and

WHEREAS, in order to finance the costs of completing the acquisition, construction and equipping of the System, and to pay the costs of refunding the Series 2016 Bonds, the Authority and the Local Units have determined that it is necessary for the Authority to issue additional bonds under and pursuant to the terms of the Financing Contract, as supplemented by this Supplement, in one or more series, in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$79,000,000 (the "Series 2017 Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority and the Local Units desire, by the execution of this Supplement, to approve of the issuance of the Series 2017 Bonds by the Authority for the aforesaid purposes and to confirm the contractual obligations of each Local Unit with respect to the Series 2017 Bonds as specified in the Financing Contract; and

WHEREAS, prior to execution of this Supplement, each Local Unit has duly authorized and approved the execution and delivery of this Supplement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the covenants made herein, THE PARTIES HERETO AGREE THAT THE FINANCING CONTRACT SHALL BE SUPPLEMENTED AND AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

1. <u>Issuance of Series 2017 Bonds by the Authority</u>. Each Local Unit hereby approves of the issuance of the Series 2017 Bonds by the Authority under and pursuant to the terms of the Financing Contract, as supplemented by this Supplement, in one or more series, in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$79,000,000, for the purposes of: (i) paying the costs of completing the acquisition, construction and equipping of the System; (ii) refunding all of the outstanding Series 2016 Bonds; (iii) making any required deposit to the debt service reserve account established for the purpose of securing the Series 2017 Bonds and other bonds of the Authority issued pursuant to the Financing Contract (the "Debt Service Reserve Account"); and (iv) paying costs incidental to the issuance and sale of the Series 2017 Bonds, including the cost of obtaining a municipal bond insurance policy for the Series 2017 Bonds, if determined to be advisable by the Authority in consultation with the Authority's financial advisor (collectively, the "Plan of Financing").

In order to accomplish the issuance of the Series 2017 Bonds for the foregoing purposes in accordance with the provisions of Act 233 and Act 34, Public Acts of Michigan, 2001, as amended, the Authority shall take the following steps:

(a) The Authority will adopt a resolution (the "Series 2017 Bond Resolution") providing for the issuance of the Series 2017 Bonds, in one or more series, in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$79,000,000, to pay the costs of the Plan of Financing. The Series 2017 Bonds shall mature serially or be subject to mandatory sinking fund redemption, as authorized by law, and shall have a final maturity date of not later than November 1, 2045. The Series 2017 Bonds shall be issued in anticipation of and shall be secured by the contractual obligations of each Local Unit as provided in the Financing Contract and as hereinafter provided in this Supplement. After due adoption of the Series 2017 Bond Resolution, the Authority will take all legal procedures and steps within its control necessary to effectuate the sale and delivery of the Series 2017 Bonds.

- (b) The Authority, upon receipt of proceeds of sale of the Series 2017 Bonds, will comply with all provisions and requirements of law, the Series 2017 Bond Resolution, the Financing Contract and this Supplement relative to the disposition and use of the proceeds of sale thereof.
- (c) The Authority may temporarily invest any proceeds of the Series 2017 Bonds or other funds held by it for the benefit of each Local Unit as permitted by law, and investment income shall accrue to and follow the fund producing such income. The Authority shall not, however, invest, reinvest or accumulate any moneys deemed to be proceeds of the Series 2017 Bonds pursuant to Section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the applicable regulations thereunder (the "Code"), in such a manner as to cause the Series 2017 Bonds to be "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Section 148 of the Code.
- (d) The Authority, upon receipt of the proceeds of sale of the Series 2017 Bonds, shall take all steps necessary to refund the Series 2016 Bonds.
- 2. Continuing Effectiveness of Financing Contract; Series 2017 Bonds Governed by Financing Contract. Except as amended by or expressly provided to the contrary in this Supplement, all of the provisions of the Financing Contract shall remain in full force and effect and shall apply with equal effect to the Series 2017 Bonds the same as though the provisions of this Supplement were fully set forth therein. The Series 2017 Bonds constitute "bonds" of the Authority as described in and as contemplated by the Financing Contract, and each reference in the Financing Contract to the "bonds" or to a "series of bonds" shall be construed as referring to, and shall be deemed to include, the Series 2017 Bonds.

Without limiting the foregoing, each Local Unit acknowledges and confirms its contractual obligation, as specified in Section 9 of the Financing Contract and in Exhibit B to the Financing Contract, to pay to the Authority, in the manner and at the times required by the Financing Contract, (i) its share of each annual installment of principal coming due on the Series 2017 Bonds by maturity or mandatory redemption, and (ii) in addition to said principal installments, as accrued interest on the principal amount of the Series 2017 Bonds remaining unpaid, an amount sufficient to pay its share of all interest due on the Series 2017 Bonds on the next succeeding interest payment date for the Series 2017 Bonds. In addition to the foregoing, each Local Unit acknowledges and confirms its contractual obligation as provided in Exhibit B to the Financing Contract to replenish the Debt Service Reserve Account in the event that the Authority is required to draw funds from the Debt Service Reserve Account due to such Local Unit's failure to pay any of its contractual obligations required by the Financing Contract. In the event that the City of Flint fails to fulfill its payment obligations under the Financing Contract, including the obligation of the City of Flint to pay its share of principal of and interest on the Series 2017 Bonds in accordance with the Financing Contract, the County of Genesee has irrevocably covenanted and agreed, in accordance with Exhibit B of the Financing Contract, to make such missed payment within 15 days of being notified of the missed payment.

Pursuant to Section 10 of the Financing Contract, each Local Unit has irrevocably pledged its full faith and credit for the prompt and timely payment of its obligations pledged for

payment of the bonds of the Authority issued pursuant to the Financing Contract, including the Series 2017 Bonds. Pursuant to such pledge, each Local Unit acknowledges and confirms its obligation, as specified in Section 10 of the Financing Contract, to levy an ad valorem tax on all the taxable property in such Local Unit in an amount which, taking into consideration estimated delinquencies in tax collections, will be sufficient to pay such obligations under the Financing Contract becoming due before the time of the following year's tax collections. Such annual tax levies shall be subject to applicable constitutional, statutory and charter tax limitations. Nothing in the Financing Contract or in this Supplement shall be construed to prevent a Local Unit from using any, or any combination of, the means and methods provided in Section 7 of Act 233, as now or hereafter amended, for the purpose of providing funds to meet its obligations under the Financing Contract, and, if at the time of making the annual tax levy there shall be either funds on hand earmarked and set aside, or funds provided in the annual budget of the water supply system of the Local Unit, for the payment of the contractual obligations due prior to the next tax collection period, then such annual tax levy may be reduced by such amount.

Each Local Unit and the Authority covenants and agrees that it will comply with its respective duties and obligations under the terms of the Financing Contract, as supplemented by this Supplement, promptly at the times and in the manner therein set forth. The Authority shall be vested with all rights and remedies provided by the Financing Contract, and as otherwise provided by law or contract, to enforce the obligation of each Local Unit to make its payment obligations with respect to the Series 2017 Bonds in the manner and at the times required by the Financing Contract.

- 3. <u>Surplus Proceeds</u>. After payment of all costs of the Plan of Financing, any surplus remaining from the proceeds of sale of the Series 2017 Bonds shall be credited by the Authority toward the next payments due to the Authority by the Local Units under the Financing Contract for the payment of debt service on the Series 2017 Bonds.
- 4. <u>Amendment to Section 18 of the Financing Contract</u>. Section 18 of the Financing Contract is hereby amended and restated in its entirety as follows:

"This Contract shall remain in full force and effect from the effective date hereof (as provided in Section 20) until each series of bonds issued by the Authority is paid in full, together with any deficiency or penalty thereon, at which time this Contract shall terminate."

- 5. <u>Binding Upon Successors</u>. This Supplement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the respective parties hereto, their successors and assigns.
- 6. <u>Effective Date of Supplement</u>. This Supplement shall become effective upon (i) due authorization and approval by each Local Unit, (ii) due authorization and approval by the Board of the Authority and (iii) due execution by the authorized officers of each Local Unit and by the Chairman and Secretary of the Authority.
 - 7. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Contract may be executed in several counterparts.

WHEREAS, MCL 46.11(p) authorizes county boards of county commissioners to represent the county and have the care and management of the property and business of the county if other provisions are not made, and provides counties with the power and authority to enter into contracts; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Act no. 261 of the Public Acts of Michigan, 1965, as amended, MCL 46.351 et seq. (Act 261), the county board of commissioners of a county (county board), by resolution adopted by a 2/3 vote of all of its members, may create a county parks and recreation commission which shall be under the general control of the county board; and

WHEREAS, the Genesee County Board of County Commissioners, then known as the Genesee County Board of Supervisors (this Board) so created the Genesee County Parks and Recreation Commission (Parks Commission) by its adoption on April 7, 1966, of the resolution captioned, *Genesee County Parks and Recreation Commission Resolution* (Enabling Resolution); and

WHEREAS, the Parks Commission is an agency of the county, and the County Board may make rules and regulations with respect to the Parks Commission as the County Board considers advisable; and

WHEREAS, certain amendments of the Enabling Resolution creating the Parks Commission, being the amendments adopted in this present Resolution, would improve accountability with respect to the parks and recreation system; and

WHEREAS, on September 18, 2017, the Public Works Committee of this

Board directed Corporation Counsel to draft an amendment to the Enabling Resolution to

require the Parks Commission to adhere to Genesee County's Travel and Purchasing

Policies (a copy of the memorandum request dated September 14, 2017, to be placed on

file with the official records of the September 18, 2017, meeting of the Public Works

Committee of this Board).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by this Board of County

GENESEE COUNTY PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION RESOLUTION

A Resolution to provide a County Parks and Recreation Commission for the County of Genesee, as authorized and empowered by Act No. 261 of the Public Acts of 1965, as amended, with the powers and duties as therein set forth, and as provided hereunder, for the purpose of acquiring, developing, maintaining, operating, and managing County Parks, preserves, parkways, and other recreation and conservation facilities to provide for the recreational needs of the people of the County of Genesee.

The Board of Commissioners of Genesee County, Michigan does resolve:

Section 1.

Under authority of Act No. 261 of the Public Acts of 1965, there is hereby established and designated the Genesee County Parks and Recreation Commission, hereinafter referred to as the Parks Commission, with powers and duties as set forth in said Act and as hereinafter provided, and in whom is vested the general administration, management, and responsibility to acquire and take title to lands, and develop, maintain and operate such lands for County Park, preserve, parkway and recreation and other conservation purposes in cooperation with the Genesee County Metropolitan Planning Commission and with other duly constituted authorities of the County and its constituent incorporated and unincorporated areas within said County, as best serve the present and future recreation needs of the inhabitants of the County of Genesee.

PARKS COMMISSION MEMBERSHIP:

- Section 2. The Parks Commission shall consist of ten (10) Commissioners, as follows:
 - a. There shall be seven (7) appointed Commissioners, provided, however, at least one (1) and not more than three (3) of the appointed Commissioners shall be members of the Board of County Commissioners, sitting ex officio.
 - b. The other three (3) Commissioners shall be the Chairperson of the County Road Commission or another Road Commissioner designated by the Board of County Road Commissioners, the County Drain Commissioner, and the Chairperson of the County Planning Commission or another member of the County Planning Commission designated by the County Planning Commission.¹

METHOD OF APPOINTMENT AND TERM OF OFFICE OF COMMISSIONERS:

- Section 3. The Chairperson of the Board of County Commissioners of Genesee

 County, Michigan, is hereby delegated the authority to recommend
 individuals for appointment to the Parks Commission subject to
 actual appointment by the Board of Commissioners of said Genesee

 County.
 - a. The term of each appointed member, as defined in Section 2,
 above, shall be three (3) years except upon the first

appointment of the membership, the terms of office of each member shall be as follows:

(1) Two members for a term ending one year from January1, 1967.

Two members for a term ending two years from January 1, 1967.

Three members for a term ending three years from January 1, 1967.

- (2) The terms of County Board members of the Parks
 Commission, as defined in Section 2, above, shall
 correspond to their respective official tenures;
 provided, however, that a term shall not exceed three
 (3) years.
- (3) Each term shall expire at noon on January 1.
- (4) Vacancies, including those for an unexpired term, shall be filled in the same manner as a regular appointment.
- (5) Any appointed commissioner can be reappointed.

REMOVAL OF COMMISSIONERS:

Section 4. The Genesee County Board of County Commissioners may remove any member of the Parks Commission for habitual, serious or willful neglect in the performance of duty, extortion, conviction of intoxication, conviction of a felony, or incompetency, or official misconduct in a manner as provided by law.

COMPENSATION OF MEMBERS:

Section 5.

All members of the Parks Commission shall receive such per diem allowance and mileage for attendance at meetings as may have been approved by the Board of County Commissioners from time to time.

OFFICERS OF THE PARK COMMISSION:

Section 6.

The Parks Commission shall elect a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, and such other officers as the Parks Commission shall deem necessary to the proper conduct of their responsibilities. All officers shall be elected by the Parks Commission at its regular meeting held on the second Thursday in January of each year. The term of office shall be for the calendar year in which elected, or until their successors are elected.

a. In the event of a vacancy occurring in any of the elective offices hereinbefore mentioned, the Parks Commission may fill such vacancy at any regular meeting subsequent to the time when said vacancy occurs.

MEETINGS:

Section 7.

Meetings of the Parks Commission shall be held at least monthly at such times and places as may be approved by the Parks Commission for the transaction of such business as may be brought before the meeting. The Regular Monthly Meeting held on the

second Thursday in the month of January shall constitute the Regular Annual Meeting of said Commission.

Meetings shall be conducted in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order (newly revised edition), the Open Meetings Act and such other Rules or Regulations as may be adopted by the Parks Commission from time to time.

SPECIAL MEETINGS:

Section 8.

Special Meetings of the Parks Commission may be called at any time by the President, or by three or more members of said Parks Commission, at such time, or place, as may be deemed necessary. The Parks Commissioners shall be notified 24 hours prior thereto. Notices of Special Meetings of said Park Commission shall specify the business to be transacted at said Special Meeting, provided, however, that any action may be taken at such special meeting when eighty percent (80%) of the membership of the Parks Commission is present, and the action is approved by sixty percent (60%) of the total membership of the Parks Commission. Any Parks Commissioner shall, however, be deemed to have waived such notice by his attendance at any such meeting. ²

QUORUM:

Section 9.

A majority of the members of the Parks Commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. It shall require the concurrence of the majority of the members present at any meeting of said Parks Commission for the passage of any resolutions, or other business. A majority vote of the Commission is required for budget approval and/or amendments thereto, the sale and/or purchase of real property, bond issues, adoption of bylaws or amendments thereto, the hiring or termination of the Executive Director, or as otherwise provided by law or By Law.

BYLAWS:

Section 10.

The Parks Commission may adopt bylaws and enter into contracts necessary to the execution of its responsibilities and within the spirit and intent of this resolution and in compliance with Act 261 of the Public Acts of 1965, as amended.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER:

Section 11.

The Parks Commission may employ an Executive Officer to be known as the Parks and Recreation Director, provided, however, that no such employment is authorized unless and until the appointment of the person selected by the Parks Commission has been confirmed by the Genesee County Board of County Commissioners (the County Board). One employed as Parks and Recreation Director shall serve at the pleasure of the Parks Commission, provided,

however, that the position of Parks and Recreation Director, as with any personnel position available for employment by the Parks Commission, is subject to elimination by the County Board, and further provided that involuntarily termination of any person serving as Parks and Recreation Director will not be effective unless confirmed by the County Board. The Genesee County Personnel and Labor Relations Department will be utilized in advertising an opening in the position of Parks and Recreation Director and in administratively processing applications for the position. The County Board establishes the compensation of the Parks and Recreation The Parks Commission shall be provided a 30-day Director. opportunity to make a recommendation to the County Board regarding the compensation of the Parks and Recreation Director prior to the compensation being changed by the County Board. The compensation for the Parks and Recreation Director shall be provided for within the budget of the Park Commission. The Parks and Recreation Director will be responsible, in general, for the management of the daily operation of the Genesee County parks and recreation system. The specific job description for the position of Parks and Recreation Director will be as approved by the County Board. 3

PERSONNEL:

Section 12. The Parks Commission may employ such other employees, contract for the full time, or part time, services of consultants, or technicians, as allowed by and all within a budget as approved by the County Board of Commissioners.

a. All employees shall be considered Genesee County employees and shall be under the same pay classification plan, work schedule, or benefits available to all Genesee County employees.

DUTIES OF THE PRESIDENT:

Section 13. The President shall:

- a. Preside at all meetings of the Parks Commission, and shall have a vote upon all matters as a Parks Commissioner.
- b. Shall sign, with the Secretary, in the name of the Genesee County Parks and Recreation Commission, all contracts and legal documents authorized by said Parks Commission and as allowed by and within the budget as approved by the County Board of Commissioners.

DUTIES OF THE VICE-PRESIDENT:

Section 14. In the event the office of President shall become vacant by death, resignation or otherwise, or in the event of the absence of the President, or in the President's inability to discharge the duties of the

office, such duties shall for the time being devolve upon the Vice-President.

DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY:

Section 15. The Secretary shall perform the usual duties of that office, and such other duties as the Parks Commission may direct.

REVENUES:

Section 16.

All revenues derived from fees for the use of facilities, privileges and conveniences provided within the county parks and recreation system shall be paid over to the County Treasurer and used solely for the expenses incurred in the acquisition of property and in the development, maintenance, or operation of the county parks and recreation system.

FEDERAL GRANTS:

Section 17.

The Parks Commission may apply for, receive, and accept grants from any governmental agency, or from the Federal Government, and agree to and comply with such terms and conditions as may be necessary, convenient or desirable.

GIFTS AND BEQUESTS:

Section 18.

The Parks Commission may accept any gifts or bequests and shall pay over to the County Treasurer any monetary gift or bequest, which shall be budgeted and disbursed, as provided for any other Parks Commission expenditure, unless otherwise specifically directed by the donor, in which case the direction of the donor shall be strictly adhered to, insofar as possible, provided however, the objective of any such gift or bequest shall adhere to and complement the overall plan of the parks and recreation system.

BUDGET:

Section 19.

The Parks Commission shall submit a budget as is required of any County Department. This budget shall be within the sum of money levied under such millage levy as has been authorized by the voters of the County of Genesee, together with any accepted gift or bequest and revenue derived or to be derived from any operations of the park system. The Parks Commission may submit a separate request for additional sums of money for the acquisition, development, maintenance, and operation of any park lands, which shall be subject to approval by the Board of County Commissioners of Genesee County.

EXPENDITURES AND DISBURSEMENTS:

Section 20.

All expenditures and disbursements of funds for Parks Commission purposes, shall be made through vouchers presented to the Genesee County Controller and on warrants issued by the Genesee County Treasurer and Clerk as provided by law for other County disbursements.

REPORT:

Section 21

The Parks Commission shall, on or before the first day of March of every year, submit a written report to the Board of Commissioners of the County of Genesee, Michigan, which report shall contain a statement of the doings of the Parks Commission during the preceding calendar year. ⁴
