2008 Child Advocacy Center's Annual Awards Dinner

Child Advocacy Centers (CACs) began developing in the late 1980s to help child sexual abuse victims. There are now more than 300 CACs across the country. They vary in size and format, but they all share a common goal: to provide a safe haven for child sexual abuse victims. Child advocacy centers coordinate services to the victim in one child friendly location, working with a multidisciplinary team that is usually comprised of representatives from child protection, law enforcement, prosecution, mental health and the juvenile/family court. This coordination expedites the investigation and prosecution of abuse cases while ensuring that victims receive effective, sensitive and immediate support in a setting that puts their needs first. The collaboration dramatically reduces the number of times a child is questioned about the abuse.
