**JURY CONVICTS GRAND BLANC TWP. MAN OF  
KILLING HIS WIFE LAST FALL**

**FLINT** -- A jury has convicted a Grand Blanc Township man of murdering his wife last October at the couple's home, according to Genesee County Prosecutor David Leyton.

Andrew Farley, 43, of Grand Blanc Township, was convicted of second degree murder in the October 24, 2014 slaying of his 34-year-old wife, Tiffany Caine-Smith Farley.

According to testimony and evidence at trial, Farley and his wife were in a drawn-out argument that had lasted for more than a day. The argument included his wife's extramarital affair with a co-worker and her threats to divorce him and get pregnant by another man.

According to the evidence, Farley hit his wife over the head with a flashlight knocking her to the floor while she was in the bathroom of the couple's home. Farley then proceeded to retrieve a knife from another room and came back and stabbed his wife six times, once in the heart.

Tiffany's body was later discovered by a friend of the family's and authorities were called to the scene.

During the trial, jurors were shown so-called selfie videos that Farley had made with the body of his deceased wife in view. Farley admitted in the videos that he had killed his wife due to being distraught over her extramarital affair and threats of divorce.

Farley faces up to life in prison when he is sentenced on December 14<sup>th</sup>.
