Suspected serial stabber Elias Abuelazam bound over for trial in Burton assault with intent to murder case

BURTON, Michigan — A judge this morning decided there was enough evidence for suspected serial killer Elias Abuelazam to go to trial in the June 12 non-fatal stabbing in Burton.

Abuelazam, 34, is accused of stabbing Antoine Jackson on Saginaw Street and Jolson Avenue. The case is one of six assault with intent to murder charges and three open counts of murder charges against him.

He will be arraigned in the case in Genesee Circuit Judge Judith Fullerton's courtroom at 8:30 a.m. Jan. 24.

Abuelazam will be in court again at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday for the continuation of the preliminary examination in the Darwin Marshall homicide.

Marshall, 43, was pronounced dead at Hurley Medical Center after he was found stabbed about 1:30 a.m. July 26 on Garland Street near W. Fifth Avenue.
