THREE JURIES CONVICT THREE MEN IN 2010 MURDER

FLINT - Genesee County Prosecutor David Leyton said yesterday's jury verdicts in three separate murder trials will take three murderers off the streets of Flint.

Dequeue Dixon, age 22 of Flint (d.o.b. 1-25-89), Gary Robinson, age 20 of Flint (d.o.b. 4/17/1991), and Calvin LeSears, age 19 of Flint (d.o.b. 5/19/1991), were each found guilty yesterday, May 16th, in the murder of Gregory Ingram.

Ingram was walking on Holbrook Avenue in the early morning hours of February 26, 2010 when the three defendants came upon him while driving by. The three jumped out of their vehicle and each pulled various firearms, including an AK47 assault rifle, and began shooting at Ingram. Ingram was killed and an autopsy revealed bullets matching each of the three defendant's guns were found in his body.

Robinson was found guilty of first degree murder, felon in possession of a firearm, and felony firearm. LeSears was found guilty of first degree murder, carrying a concealed weapon, and felony firearm. Both face life without the possibility of parole.

Dixon was found guilty of second degree murder, felon in possession, carrying a concealed weapon, and felony firearm. He faces up to life in prison.

A sentencing date in Genesee County Circuit Court has been set for June 21, 2011.
