


Project Goals

- Reopen the bridge for vehicles, pedestrians & bicyclists
 - Minimize the life cycle cost of maintenance and repair
 - Restore access to the waterfront
- Provide a structure with a 75-year (minimum) service life

Existing Site




- Fiber Optic structure
- Abandoned waterline structure
- Non-ADA compliant pedestrian walkway
- Ferry St. Bridge closed

Bridge History

- Constructed by NYC&HRR
- Built c. 1905 using spans salvaged from a Hudson River crossing at Albany
- Altered multiple times
- Closed to all traffic in 2014
- Not Eligible for National Register of Historic Places

- Deteriorated truss members

Design Process


- Project Identification, Needs and Objectives
- Preliminary Engineering
 - Geometrics, Traffic, Safety, Drainage, Utilities, Right-of-Way, Pedestrians, Costs
- Environmental, Social and Economic Considerations
 - Environmental Historical resources, Air Quality, Noise, Energy
 - Social Planning, Community, Emergency Services, Social Groups
 - Economic Local Economy, Highway related businesses, Established Business Districts
 - Indirect and Secondary Impact
- Evaluation and Comparison Alternatives

Coordination with SHPO

- Hired Hartgen Archeological Associates to complete Phase 1A Literature Review and Archeological Sensitivity Assessment
 - Low likelihood of encountering intact resources
- Hartgen also completed an assessment of Historic Eligibility for the Ferry St. Bridge
 - Not eligible due to multiple past alterations
 - "...the bridge no longer reflects its original design or use."
- SHPO and FHWA concurred with the assessment on 4/19/2018 and 6/1/2018, respectively






Alternatives

 - 75-year service life
- Alternative 2
 - Bridge Replacement
 - 75-year service life
- Alternative 3
 - Bridge Rehabilitation
 - Not Considered
 - Can not provide 75-year service life


Proposed Bridge Section



Proposed Bridge Elevation




Proposed Plan





Project Funding

- Available Funding:
 - \$3.0 million (Construction & Const. Insp.)
 - 80% Federal
 - 15% State
 - 5% Local (City of Hudson)
- The City has an additional \$600,000 Capital Reserve Fund for this project, if needed

Schedule/Next Steps

- Receive public comments and adjust preferred alternative accordingly
- Final Design Report January 2019
- Design Approval January 2019
- Detail Design Complete November 2019
- Advertise for Construction January 2020
- Construction Start April 2020
- Construction End September 2020
