

History of Pohatcong Creek Natural Area

The Pohatcong Creek Natural Area consists of 91 acres along the Pohatcong Creek east of Mine Hill Road, behind Warren Hills Regional High School. Access is off Mine Hill Road from a parking area near the Robert Rush Memorial Cabin and the park sign.

Hiking trails are on both sides of the creek with two bridges. Trail markers are white on the south side of the creek (.8 miles) and blue on the north side (.7 miles). The terrain is heavily wooded with wet areas with boardwalks on the blue trail.

A picnic area was created in 2003 as an Eagle Scout project and a native plant arboretum was also created in that year. Use of this property is limited to passive recreation such as hiking, fishing, and picnicking. Hunting and use of motorized vehicles is prohibited. Fishing is permitted with a license.

Over 1000 hours of work has been done over the years by Warren Hills Environmental clubs, Rutgers's Cooperative Extension, Boy Scouts of America, and many other local clubs and corporations.

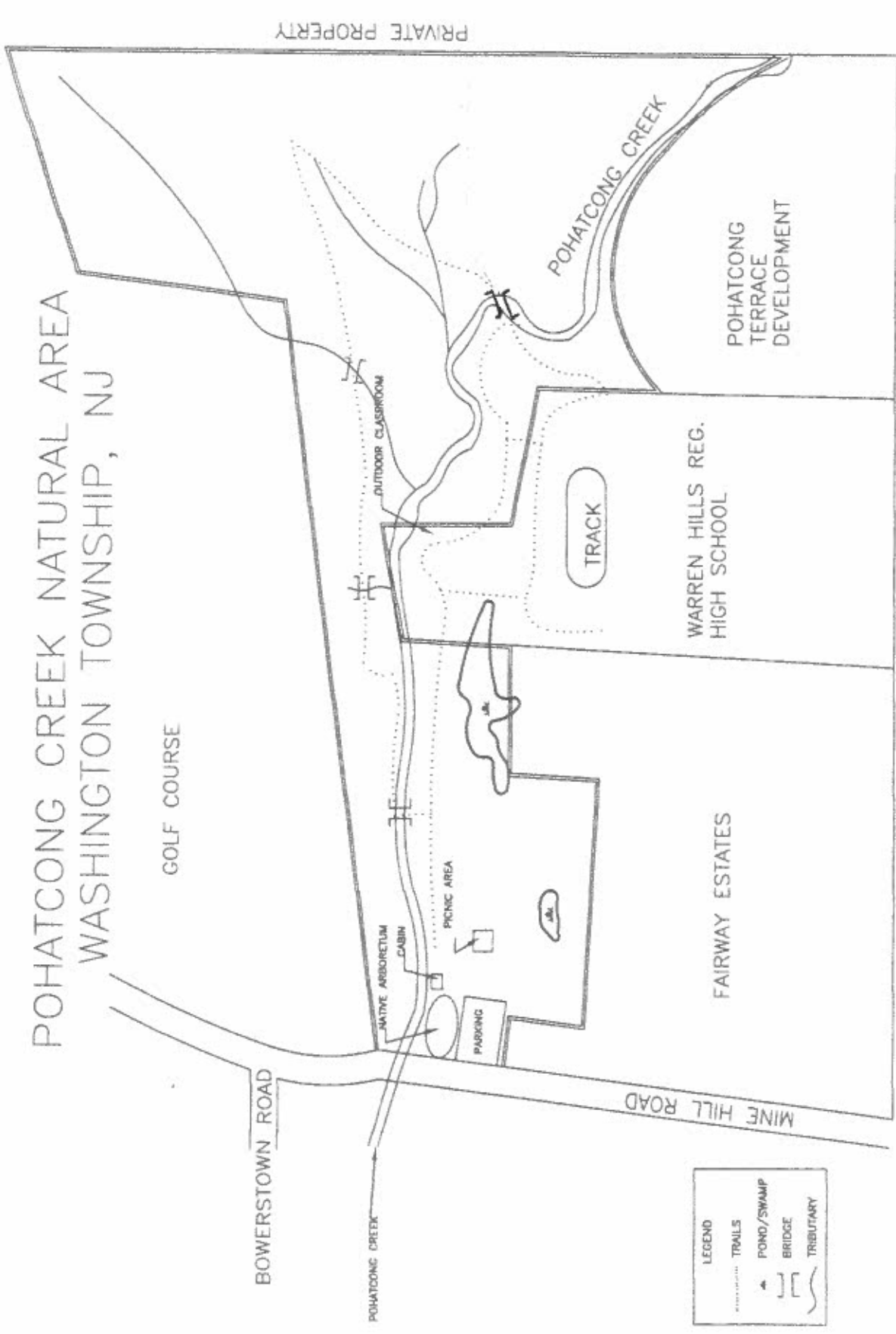
