PROJECT SUMMARY

Austin Brothers Beer Company currently operates a brewery and restaurant within a 7,250 S. F. building on approximately 5.25 acres of I-1, Light Industrial property located at 821 W. Miller Street approximately 800 feet northeast of the street R.O.W. in the City of Alpena, MI. In 2014 the Alpena Authority for Brownfield Redevelopment (AABR) approved a Brownfield Plan to allow the company to utilize the Authority's Local Site Remediation Revolving Loan Fund (LSRRF) to finance the following eligible activities to assist in the development of the brewery: Phase 2 ESA, Baseline Environmental Assessment (BEA), Due Care Plan, and limited Site Remediation. LSRRF revenues may be used for Eligible Activities on Eligible Property, as defined by Act 381, PA 1996, as amended. The above activities were deemed Eligible Activities under Act 381 as the property qualified as a Part 201 Facility.

Over the past year the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) has conducted additional environmental site investigation on the adjacent property to the south of the brewery (former tannery site) mapping out extensive areas of contamination containing heavy metals, VOCs, other chemicals, and buried hides. MDEQ will conduct remediation activities on the property beginning in February 2017.

Following the opening of the brewery it became apparent that the existing water and sewer service connections to the building were both insufficient for their needs and in deteriorating condition. The private sewer connection is over 800 feet in length and in such disrepair and undersized as to result in weekly repairs and maintenance to keep it operational. The proximity of the MDEQ monitored contamination places into question the continued viability and safety of these deteriorating service lines. Apparent breaks in the existing sewer service line are likely resulting in additional soil contamination in this area.

In November 2016 the City installed a replacement 12" water main in an easement running parallel to the railroad tracks to the west of the brewery. When completed in the spring it will connect to existing mains on Miller Street and Long Lake Avenue. Although not fully installed that portion that has been completed has been tested, treated and made operational and available for connection to the brewery. The sewer main is fully installed and operational. Due to both the condition of the existing services and the adjacent contaminated area, both the City and the brewery determined that it would be best to immediately complete the service connections.

Austin Brothers Beer Company intends to borrow sufficient funds from the Authority's LSRRF to install the new services, which were to be completed the week of December 19, with the cost up fronted by the City's Water and Sewer Utilities. The sewer service was completed on schedule, but due to inclement conditions the water service installation will be delayed until spring 2017. The installation of the water and sewer services is an Eligible Activity under the Act based on the deteriorated condition of the existing service lines, especially the sanitary sewer line, and environmental and health issues potentially impacting these lines.

The property is capable of generating tax increment revenue; however no Tax Increment Finance (TIF) capture is proposed. The sole purpose for the amended Brownfield Plan is to include the proposed additional Eligible Activities described above for the brewery property, which was previously qualified as an Eligible Property under the approved 2014 Brownfield Plan. Inclusion of the additional Eligible Activities will allow the Company to access Site Remediation Funds to cover those costs.

Introduction

Act 381, P.A. 1996, as amended, was enacted to promote the revitalization, redevelopment and reuse of contaminated, tax reverted, blighted or functionally obsolete property through incentives adopted as part of a brownfield plan. The brownfield plan outlines the qualifications, costs, impacts, and incentives for the project.

The proposed Amendment to the approved 2014 Brownfield Plan must be approved by the brownfield redevelopment authority established under Act 381 and the governing body of the authority's municipality in order to take effect. The state must approve the eligible activities if state taxes are to be captured.

The Alpena City Council established the Alpena Authority for Brownfield Redevelopment under the procedures required under Act 381 and filed the resolution with the Secretary of State on March 21, 1997.

This Amendment to the approved 2014 Brownfield Plan is for property owned by the Austin Brothers Beer Company, LLC, through Austin Ventures LLC, upon which a brewery and restaurant are operated in the City of Alpena, Alpena County, Michigan, consistent with Act 381. The amended Brownfield Plan describes the public purpose and qualifying factors for determining the additional Brownfield Eligible Activities and estimated costs, the impacts of tax increment financing, and other project factors.

Public Purpose (MCL 125.2664(1):

The Austin Brothers Beer Company, LLC through the original 2014 Brownfield Plan completed approved Eligible Environmental Activities utilizing LSRRF funds to support the development of a brewery and restaurant at its 821 W. Miller Street property. The brewery has operated for just over a

year and has undergone substantial market growth, which is expected to continue in 2017. The existing water and sanitary sewer service connections are insufficient in size and condition to adequately handle existing demand, yet alone future anticipated growth. Both the previously mentioned site contamination and the availability of new City public water and sewer mains adjacent to the property, warrant the immediate installation of the new water and sewer service connections. The purpose of the proposed Amendment to the approved 2014 Brownfield Plan is to authorize the use of LSRRF funds for the payment of the service connections. The sewer connection was completed in late December 2016, with the water service installation delayed until in spring 2017 due to inclement conditions.

Description of Project and Plan Costs (MCL 125.2663(1)(a):

The City of Alpena through its contractor will install on behalf of the Austin Brothers Beer Company, LLC the new water and sanitary sewer service lines including piping, meters, valves, manhole and fire hydrant between the new City water and sanitary sewer mains and the brewery. Internal plumbing modifications and connections necessary to complete the water service will be through a private plumbing contractor hired by the Company. These costs will also be funded utilizing the Site Remediation Fund.

The additional Eligible Non-Environmental Activities included in this amendment are the installation of the new service connections necessitated by the deteriorated condition of the existing service lines and the proximity of known site contamination on the adjacent property immediately south of the brewery.

The maximum Non-Environmental Eligible Activity costs are estimated at \$35,000.

Summary of Eligible Activities (MCL 125.2663(1)(b):

Act 381 provides for the costs of certain eligible non-environmental activities to be reimbursed through tax increment financing. The following is a summary of all Eligible Activities.

MDEQ Environmental Eligible Activities:

There are no MDEQ Environmental Eligible Activities proposed under this Brownfield Plan amendment.

MSF Non-Environmental Developmental Eligible Activities:

Eligible Non-Environmental Activities include the installation of new water and sanitary service connections to replace existing deteriorated lines. These activities include all necessary permits, labor, materials and appurtenances.

The use of the LSRRF funds for the new services will be as a loan with terms as approved separately in a Loan Agreement executed between the AABR and the Austin Brothers Beer Company, LLC.

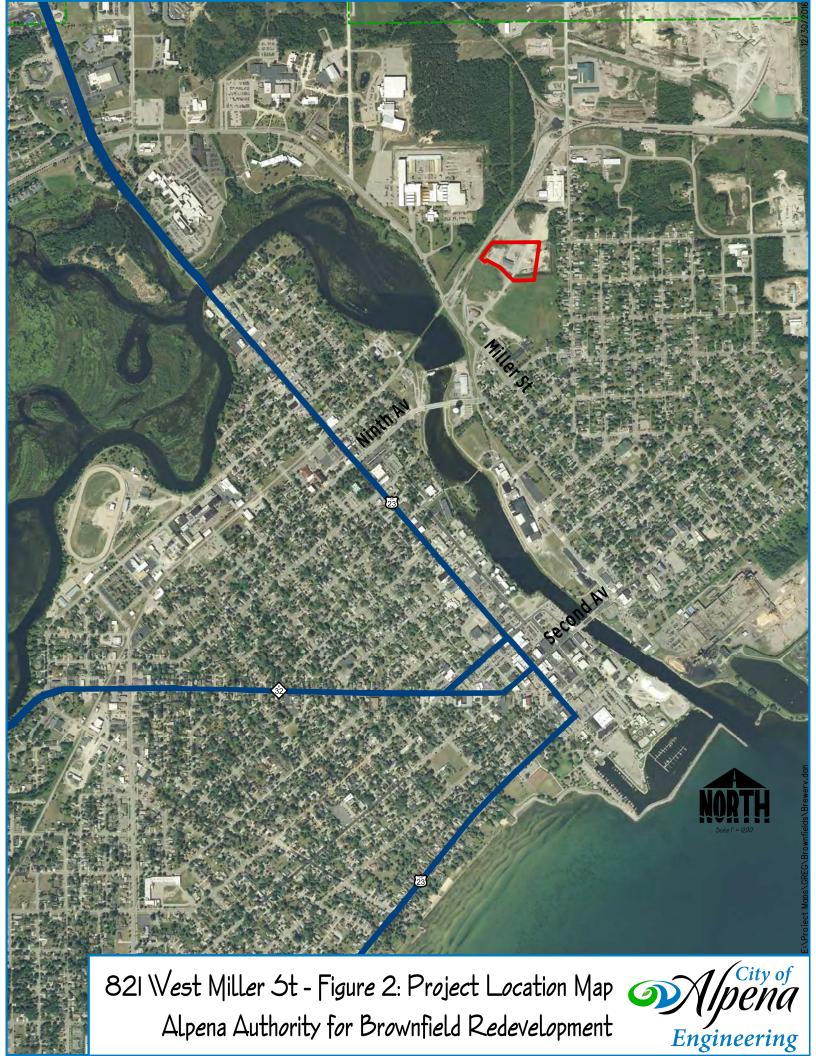

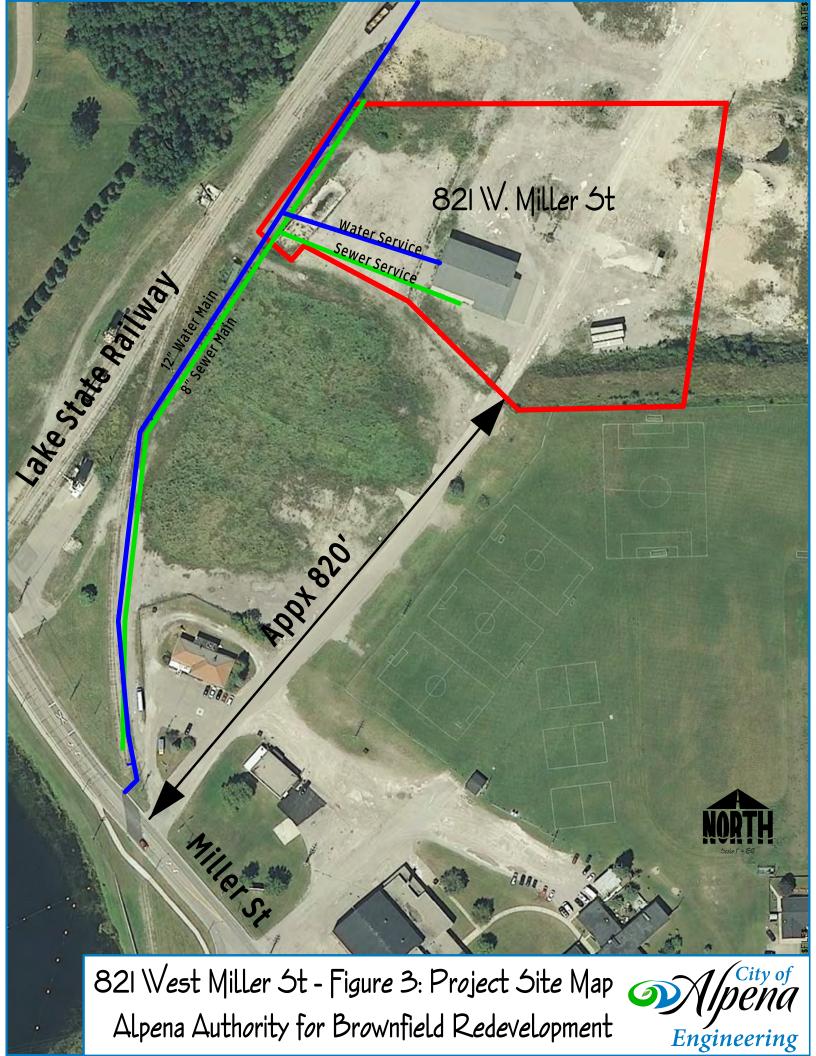

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO THE 2014 AUSTIN BROTHERS BEER COMPANY, LLC BROWNFIELD PLAN FOR THE CITY OF ALPENA PURSUANT TO AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF ACT 381 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN OF 1996, AS AMENDED

WHEREAS, the Michigan Brownfield Redevelopment Financing Act, Public Act 381 of 1996, as amended, authorizes municipalities to create a brownfield redevelopment authority to promote the revitalization, redevelopment, and reuse of contaminated, blighted, functionally obsolete, or tax reverted property through tax increment financing of eligible environmental and/or developmental activities; and

WHEREAS, the Alpena City Council established the City of Alpena Authority for Brownfield Redevelopment and filed with the Secretary of State on March 21, 1997; and

WHEREAS, the City of Alpena Authority for Brownfield Redevelopment has reviewed and approved by resolution the Amendment to the 2014 Brownfield Plan for the Austin Brothers Beer Company, LLC for property located at 821 W. Miller Street at their January 9, 2017 meeting and recommends approval by the Alpena City Council; and

WHEREAS, the Alpena City Council has made the following determinations and findings:

- A. The amended Brownfield Plan constitutes a public purpose of promoting economic development and the ongoing adaptive re-use of a former vacant commercial/industrial building;
- B. The Plan meets all the requirements for a Brownfield Plan set forth in Section 13 of the Act;
- C. The cost of the eligible activities proposed in the amended Plan are reasonable and necessary to carry out the purposes of the Act;
- D. All funds to be used for eligible activities are currently deposited in the Authority's Local Site Remediation Revolving Fund, therefore no tax increment financing will be utilized; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on the Brownfield Plan has been noticed and held on January 16, 2017 and notice to taxing jurisdictions has been provided in compliance with the requirements of Act 381;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Alpena City Council hereby approves the Amendment to the 2014 Brownfield Plan for the Austin Brothers Beer Company, LLC.

Brownfield Site Remediation Loan Agreement between Austin Brothers Beer Company LLC and the City of Alpena Authority for Brownfield Redevelopment

WHEREAS, in January 2017 the City of Alpena Authority for Brownfield Redevelopment (ABR) and the Alpena City Council approved a Brownfield Plan Amendment to provide funds from the ABR's Local Site Remediation Revolving Loan Fund (Site Remediation Fund) to Austin Brothers Beer Company LLC for the purposes of installing replacement water and sanitary sewer services connections to the brewery and restaurant located at 821 W. Miller Street; and

WHEREAS, the approved Brownfield Plan Amendment provides up to \$35,000 in Site Remediation Funds to Austin Brothers Beer Company LLC for the service connections at the 821 W. Miller property in the form of a loan; and

WHEREAS, the Austin Brothers Beer Company LLC utilized \$_____ for the installation of the new water and sanitary sewer service connections at the 821 W. Miller property and such usage was approved by the ABR Executive Director.

THEREFORE, the Austin Brothers Beer Company LLC agrees to repay to the ABR's Site Remediation Fund \$_____ per the following:

- 1. Term One (1) year commencing May 1, 2017.
- 2. Interest Rate 5% Simple Interest to be calculated annually on the remaining unpaid principal balance as of December 31, 2017.
- Monthly payments shall be \$_____.
- 4. Payments will be made by the 1st of each month commencing no later than May 1, 2017. Early payments may be made to reduce the principal and potential interest that may accrue.
- In the event the Brewery ceases operation any time during the loan period Austin Brothers Beer Company LLC and its members agree to immediately repay the balance of the loan.

At the close of the 2015-2016 fiscal year, the City of Alpena's General Fund had \$3,215,863, a 32.7% fund balance compared to a forecasted \$2,708,721 or 25.8% of fund balance. We began the fiscal year with a \$2,932,140 fund balance and forecasted that \$223,419 would be needed from reserves to cover expenditures. Of the \$3,215,863 fund balance, \$3,043,595 (or 30.9%) is unrestricted.

Our total projected revenue in the General Fund was \$10,375,567 and the actual was \$10,108,694, a difference of \$266,873. The revenue received was less than budgeted due to some State Grant revenue that was not received in time to be included in the 2015-16 fiscal year.

On the expense side, we did well in controlling costs in most areas. The majority of departments in the General Fund came in under budget. We had budgeted \$10,183,784 in expenses and spent \$9,393,571, a difference of \$790,213. The General Fund and Parks and Recreation had unfinished capital projects, which accounted for the largest part of that difference.

We must factor in that of the \$3,043,595 unrestricted fund balance, the uncompleted projects from 2015-16 will reduce the available amount accordingly.

The Municipal Council's directives (Council Policy No. 55) on the General Fund Balance, if it is above the 20% maximum, are:

When fund balance approaches its maximum threshold the following measures should be considered:

- 1. Fully fund the Employee Defined Benefit pension, if not already at full funding.
- 2. Fully fund the OPEB Annual Required Contribution, if not already at full funding.
- 3. Accelerate capital improvements in the CIP.
- 4. Move up the debt schedule for existing bond payments to lower the City's debt burden.
- 5. Reduce millage.

Other options that Council may wish to explore at a future meeting is the possibility of reinstating or expanding existing programs such as brush pick-up, sidewalks, and snow removal on sidewalks.

With State law introducing the exemption of personal property taxes, it was unknown how it would affect the City's revenue. Council approved keeping the fund balance higher than 20% until we could determine the revenue loss to the City. If we lost 100% of these taxes, it would be a loss of \$750,000. The personal property tax reimbursements from the State are still not clear. At first we were to receive

100% reimbursement, but now we are told we will be reimbursed for at least the essential services portion of revenue, which is approximately 46%. I would suggest continuing to allow a fund balance higher than 20% for the next two years to see if the details of the law become well defined.

Below are some notes on areas of the current and future budgets that are being addressed.

- 1. The Budget Stabilization Fund was designed specifically to enable municipalities to continue to provide services and avoid lay-offs wherever possible during slow economic times. The fund was used as necessary until it was depleted, and tight budgets didn't allow for replenishing until 2013-14. In 2013-14, the City began contributing \$5,000 annually, and now have \$15,000 in the fund at the end of 2015-16. This is a step in the right direction but in order to be of any use, the fund should have \$250,000 to \$500,000.
- 2. The City's contribution to the Retirement Pension Fund has been over \$600,000 since the 2009-10 fiscal year. The City's contribution for 2015-16 was \$738,836. For the current fiscal year it dropped slightly to \$722,318. The funding level continues to decrease and we are currently at 86.3%. Changes to the pension plan have been ongoing in order to lower liabilities to the City.
- 3. The City established a Post-Retirement Health Care Fund under the authority of the State of Michigan Public Employee Health Care Fund Investment Act, Public Act 149 of 1999. The purpose of this type of fund is to cover health care obligations of current and future retirees that have health benefits. A valuation is performed every three years to identify the level of funding needed to cover the cost of retiree healthcare benefits. Though the City is not obligated to make contributions in advance of when insurance premiums are due the City has attempted to advance-fund a portion of these benefits. The City budgets a percent of payroll, currently 4% or approximately \$151,000 annually. Any annual credits received from BC/BS are also deposited in this fund. Approximately \$120,000 is used annually for the current retiree's health insurance premiums. The last valuation in 2013 provided our unfunded liabilities at \$4,076,942. The fund has a \$1,023,341 balance at 6/30/2016.
- 4. Capital projects were delayed during tight budget years, but are now being addressed. The Public Safety Building has had much-needed repairs to the roof and HVAC system. City Hall has had the exterior rehabilitated, and an HVAC system installed in the next fiscal year. The Second Avenue Bridge is currently being rehabilitated.
- 5. Though there is not much in the way of new revenue, taxable values are increasing slightly each year and the ambulance transfer program has increased service revenue. We have received several grants that have helped with infrastructure projects.

There are many positive things happening in Alpena. It has been encouraging to see the Bridge at Island Park completed, the Fish Mural downtown, and the Trailhead project completed. The Dog Park will be built in the current fiscal year and the Splash Park will be built in 2017-18.
