Message from City Engineer

The City of Alpena is working to balance social distancing, the safety of our employees, and the work activities that have to be done. This is a difficult and trying time for our citizens and our employees, but in some cases there is work that must be done.

The City has contractors working on replacing some water services as an attempt to get the work done ahead of the proposed MDOT resurfacing project on State Street and Washington Avenue. The contractors have been directed to maintain social distancing whenever and wherever possible while performing this work. Sometimes, however, this cannot be avoided. The contractors will be starting work on several projects deemed essential to maintain our infrastructure and or stay ahead of other projects. All of the contractors working on behalf of the City are aware of the situation and our standards for social distancing.

While you may see these activities occurring, they do not mean that the “Stay Home, Stay Safe” order is not in place. We are performing work, which must be done, under these difficult times.

As a reminder, City Hall and all City offices are currently closed to the public, with many employees working from home. Some services may not be offered during this difficult time, and more could be suspended depending on future directives from the Governor. The City will continue to keep our citizens abreast of any changes.
