# CITIZENS POLICE ACADEMY

The Auburn Hills Police Department's mission is to continually improve the safety and quality of life within our community through a broad base of traditional and innovative services, while protecting constitutional and basic human rights. All members of this department will at times stand accountable for their conduct.

The Citizens Police Academy was designed to give our community an idea of how the Police Department takes our mission and applies it to the relationship we strive to have with the community on a daily basis.

The Auburn Hills Police Department is currently seeking interested candidates who would like to participate in the Citizens Police Academy. The academy is designed to give the applicant a better working knowledge of the Police Department's personnel and operations.

## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The Citizens Police Academy is a FREE program designed to give attendees an interactive, hands-on guide through the complexities of police work and an in-depth view of the Auburn Hills Police Department.

Attendees will learn the whys and hows of policing by working through a simulated criminal case from beginning to end. The class is limited to 20 students.

# FIRE PREVENTION

Fire Prevention and Inspections are a critical component of a city's strategy to ensure safety, protect property, and promote a thriving community. One of the best strategies for fighting fires in Auburn Hills is preventing fires from starting through a comprehensive fire prevention and life safety initiative.

The Auburn Hills Fire Prevention Bureau (FPB) consists of three (3) Fire Inspectors who manage all plan reviews, building inspections, permitting, and occupancy data for the entire city. They are also responsible for handling hazardous material classification and pre-incident plans for over 200 occupancies that house regulated quantities of hazardous materials. Additionally, they conduct acceptance tests of fire protection and life safety systems as required by fire codes and standards to make sure the systems are installed and operate correctly when a new building is constructed, or an existing building is modified.

Inspector Fred Solomon has been with the department for 31 years as an inspector and 22 years as a fire investigator. Inspector Jon Toss has been with the department for 30 years, 5 years as an inspector, and 3 years as an investigator. He also handles public education and fire extinguisher training. Inspector Nelson Webb was recently added to the division in 2023 after serving as a firefighter/paramedic since 1994.

The fire department is required to determine the origin and cause of all fires. When the cause of a fire is not obvious, Fire Investigators are called to the fire scene and try to determine both the origin and cause of the blaze. Fire Investigators work closely with insurance company investigators to quickly process insurance claims. They also work with local law enforcement to investigate suspicious fires and assist with collecting evidence to prosecute arsonists. Their findings can even lead to product recalls if, for example, a particular appliance is found to be the cause of multiple fires.

Since adding a third inspector, overall inspection activities have dramatically increased. The total number of inspections increased from 652 in 2022 to 1,014 in 2023. That is an increase of 56%. Annual inspections increased by one hundred and four (104), or 63% and follow-up inspections more than doubled, jumping from 200 in 2022 to 404 in 2023.



Completing more fire inspections can help the city in several important ways:

- Regular inspections enhance public safety and can help reduce property damage;
- Assuring regulation compliance can also help lower insurance costs for business owners;
- Residents and visitors can have confidence that the city is actively working to prevent fires and save lives by ensuring that buildings have proper safety measures in place.

### Confirm Voter Registration & Location of Precinct

Log on to [michigan.gov/vote](https://michigan.gov/vote) to confirm that you are registered to vote and the location of your precinct.

### Registering to Vote

You may register to vote by mail, at the City Clerk's Office, County Clerk's Office or any Secretary of State office up to 15 days prior to an election.

You may register in person at the City Clerk's Office within 14 days of an election, up to and including Election Day. If registering within the final 14 days, you must show proof of residency, in addition to proof of identity. (Proof of residency includes a current utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check, or other government document containing the applicant's name and current address.)

All Michigan voters must use the same residential address for voter registration and driver's license.

## Voting by Absentee Ballot

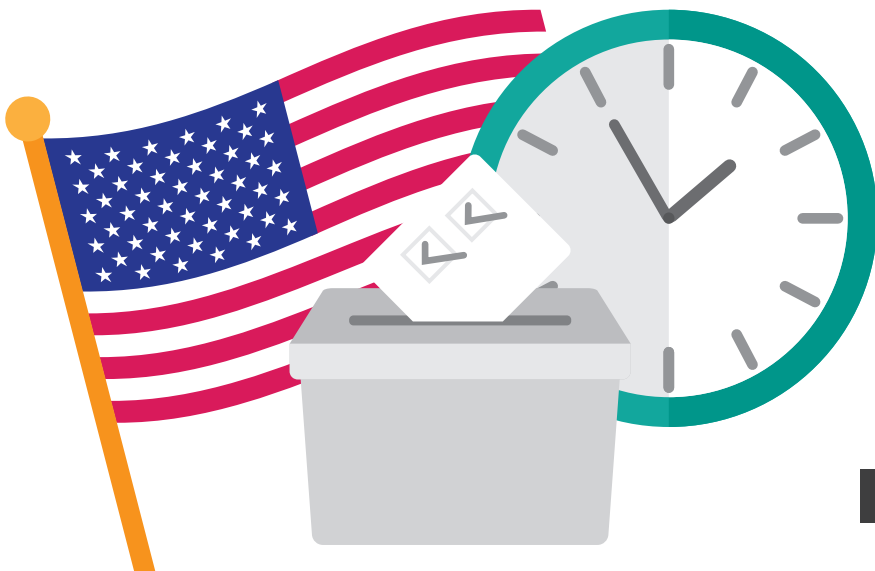
Absentee voting allows you to complete your absentee ballot at home or at the Clerk's Office. You can then submit your ballot in the envelope by mail, in person, or by drop box. After an absentee ballot is received by the Clerk's Office, your absentee ballot is processed and tabulated by election officials.

- Drop Box Locations: Inside City Hall, In Parking Lot 2 at City Hall, attached to the outside of the City Hall building, in the DPW Parking Lot.
- You may also return your absentee ballot, in person, to your precinct or to the early voting site and then you can personally insert the ballot into the tabulator at that location.

## MOSQUITO SMARTS KNOW THE BUZZ ABOUT MOSQUITO BITES

The City of Auburn Hills and Oakland County residents are urged to follow prevention tips to protect themselves from mosquito-borne diseases. Some diseases that are spread by mosquitoes include West Nile virus, Zika virus, St. Louis Encephalitis (SLE), Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE), and LaCrosse (LAC) virus. The best way to prevent diseases spread by mosquitoes is to avoid being bitten.

### FOLLOW THESE TIPS TO PROTECT YOU AND YOUR FAMILY:

#### PREVENT MOSQUITO BITES

- Use Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)-registered insect repellent. All EPA-registered insect repellents are evaluated for safety and effectiveness.
- Always follow the product label instructions.
- Do not use insect repellent on babies younger than two months of age.
- Do not apply insect repellent on a child's hands, eyes, mouth, cut or irritated skin.
- Adults: spray insect repellent on your hands and then apply to a child's face.
- Wear protective clothing such as long-sleeved shirts and pants.
- Avoid areas where mosquitoes may be present, including indoor areas.

#### CONTROL MOSQUITOES AT HOME

- Maintain window and door screens to keep mosquitoes out of buildings. Do not prop open doors.
- Get rid of mosquito breeding sites by removing standing water in and around your home.
- Once a week, empty and scrub, turn over, cover, or throw out items that hold water, such as tires, buckets, planters, toys, pools, birdbaths, flowerpots, roof gutters, or trash containers.

## MAINTAIN A HEALTHY LAWN

### MOW HIGH, RECYCLE CLIPPINGS

- Mow at least three inches high
- Return clippings to recycle nutrients
- Sweep or blow clippings from walks and driveways onto the lawn
- Taller grass will discourage weeds and promote deeper roots, helping the lawn survive droughts

### BE SMART WITH FERTILIZER

- Be patient in the spring - wait until May to fertilize
- Don't fertilize if the ground is frozen or saturated with water
- Choose lawn fertilizers with low or no phosphorus (the middle number) and follow the directions
- Confirm spreader setting before applying
- Don't fertilize or discharge clippings near lakes, rivers, streams or storm drains
- Sweep fertilizer granules from walks and driveways onto the lawn
- Wash your spreader on the grass

### WATER REMINDERS

- Watering should not produce puddles. Lighter, more frequent watering is best
- Brown lawns are OK; dormancy is a natural response to drought; however, some water may be necessary in a drought of more than a month

## CAR WASHING AND MAINTENANCE

Washing cars in your driveway can add pollutants to our waterways. Wash water that enters storm drains often contains detergents, oil, grease, heavy metals, and dirt. Vehicle fluids dumped down a storm drain or directly into a waterway can cause serious problems. The amount it takes to fill your automobile's engine can form an eight acre oil slick in a river. Other vehicle fluids are poisonous to people, fish, and wildlife.

### WASHING TIPS

- Wash your car at commercial carwashes that use water efficiently and dispose it properly
- Remove dirt around wheels first with a wire brush. Collect the soil with a broom and dispose of it in a manner that will keep it out of storm drains
- Use non-phosphate biodegradable detergents and mild soaps, such as vegetable oil-based soaps
- Wash one section of the car at a time and rinse it quickly using a pistol grip nozzle with high pressure and low volume

### MAINTENANCE TIPS

- If you change vehicle fluids at home, take the waste fluids to a recycling center or an oil change facility
- Always use a drip pan under your work and use funnels when transferring fluids
- Never mix waste oil with gasoline, solvents or other liquid
- Change vehicle fluids in the garage whenever possible
- If a spill occurs, pour kitty litter, saw dust or cornmeal on spill to absorb the liquid. Place the waste material in a strong plastic bag and dispose of it with your trash

# FALL CLEANUP

Residential yard waste will be retrieved through the second full week of December. Please be sure to set out any yard waste on your regularly scheduled pickup day through December 15th. Please continue to use paper yard waste bags or properly marked bins, up to 32-gallons in capacity.

Branches up to three inches in diameter and four feet in length can be bundled together if the bundles are less than 18 inches around and less than 50 pounds.



# 2024 HAZARDOUS WASTE DAY

For one day a year, the Department of Public Works (DPW) partners with a company that specializes in the proper recycling, treatment and/or disposal of hazardous waste. The event is held exclusively for Auburn Hills residents (with proof of residency) at the DPW off Brown Road. This year's event was held on May 11<sup>th</sup> and was a huge success.

In total, we had 258 residents deliver over 23,000 pounds of hazardous waste! The most common materials that were dropped off were electronic devices (10,080 pounds), miscellaneous toxic products (2,657 pounds), batteries (2,040 pounds), automotive fluids (4,218 pounds), and oil-based paints and solvents (1,144 pounds). Pesticides, pharmaceuticals, propane, light bulbs, and aerosols were also dropped off, among other items.

The next Household Hazardous Waste Day will happen sometime in Spring 2025. Once the exact date is determined, the DPW will publish the date on the City's website. The information will also be shared on social media and the insert that accompanies the utility bill that is distributed the month prior to the event.

Thank you for doing your part in protecting our water supply, air, and soil by properly disposing of hazardous waste.

# A RIVER DAY CELEBRATION

On Saturday, June 8, 137 junior anglers and their families cast their lines in the waters of the Clinton River for the Auburn Hills Fishing Derby. The Fishing Derby is an annual event held at Riverside Park in conjunction with the Clinton River Watershed Council's River Day.

Not long after the 8:00 AM start time, participants began catching fish, some as large as 15 inches in length. One of the main reasons so many kids caught trout was largely due to the generous donations made by Clinton Valley Trout Unlimited and the Detroit Area Steelheaders. Their generous donations enabled the City to release 775 rainbow trout specifically for this event.

The derby ended with a raffle and many participants took home prizes including, tackle, new fishing poles, tackle boxes, fishing nets, hats, tumblers, and Uncle Buck cheese puffs.

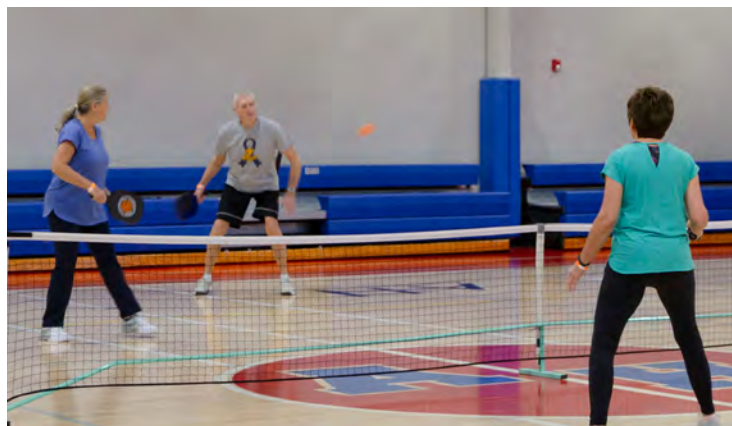

## FILE OF LIFE PROGRAM (All Ages)

The File of Life is a paper emergency information system sponsored by the Auburn Hills Fire, Police and Recreation and Senior Services Departments. The File of Life is a magnetic file that is placed on the front of the refrigerator. Inside the file is emergency information that first responders may need to access in case of a medical emergency. This is a free program. Stop by the Community Center to pick up a File of Life or call 248-370-9353 to schedule a trained volunteer to visit you and help you complete your File of Life information.

## RESIDENTIAL ROPER LOCKBOX SAFETY PROGRAM (All Ages)

Participants in this program will have a secure lockbox installed on the exterior of their home which contains a key to the home. Only the Auburn Hills Fire Department personnel will have a master key to unlock this box to gain secure entry into the home in the event of an emergency. Lock boxes can be purchased at cost through the Recreation and Senior Services Department or contact us to see if you qualify for a limited supply of free boxes for low-income residents.

## KIT - KEEP IN TOUCH PHONE PAL PROGRAM (55+)

The KIT program provides a weekly phone call to homebound seniors to give a friendly hello and have some great conversations. This phone pal program is good for seniors who live alone and would do well with a weekly phone call. Phone calls are made by trained OU Pre-Med student volunteers. This is not a substitute for personal medical alert systems. For more information and to sign up please call the Community Center.

## TRANSPORTATION (60+)

Transportation available for senior city residents aged 60 and older and/or disabled city residents. Transportation is for medical appointments (non-emergency or surgical), business appointments, shopping days and visits to the Community Center for luncheon activities. Not available for work-related transportation. The fee is \$2.00 each way. For information call: 248-370-9353. Must call in advance; at least 48-hour notice is required.

## NO EXCUSE FOR ELDER ABUSE

If you are a senior citizen or know someone who is being hurt, having money taken or used without permission, are being forced to do things against their will, are being neglected, or are unable to care for themselves, then they are suffering from elder abuse. Neglecting to care for a dependent older adult or leaving them in an unsafe situation, whether you mean to or not, is elder abuse.
