### Building and Code Web Portals available

Two new portals provide access for building permits and code compliance.

A new enhanced process has been created to make submitting various building permit applications easier and faster. Individuals, builders, and contractors can submit commercial, residential, trade, certificate of occupancy (C of O), special events and fire permit applications through the new web portal. The building web portal gives individuals the ability to view the status of their permit and schedule inspections. Inspections requests received before 11:30 AM can be scheduled for the next business day.

A new quick and convenient way for citizens to report suspected code compliance issues is available. Citizens can now submit their concerns through the Code Compliance Web Portal. Examples of typical code compliance issues are tall grass over 12 inches, accumulation of lumber, junk, debris, garbage, decaying vegetation, or tree branches, or abandoned, discarded or unused objects such as appliances, equipment, furniture, empty and discarded cans and containers, inoperable motor vehicles, car parts, and structurally unsound fences.



## **Protect our Pipes**

## CLEAN PIPES ARE GREEN PIPES

Simple steps to keep our water clean, protect public health, and avoid expensive plumbing repairs.

#### **NEVER POUR DOWN THE DRAIN OR TOILET:**



Wipes, even "flushable" ones, which can clog municipal and septic wastewater systems since they don't break down like toilet paper.



Fats, oils, and grease (FOG), including cooking oil, pan drippings, gravy, bacon grease, lard, shortening, butter, margarine, salad dressings, mayonnaise, creams, and sauces.

#### INSTEAD, RECYCLE USED COOKING OIL WHEN POSSIBLE—

contact a local cooking oil recycler for locations.



If you must dispose of cooking oil or grease, contact your local household waste program to find out how. As a last resort, seal in a container in the trash.



Use a paper towel to scrape grease from dishes and cookware into the trash (the grease from cloth towels ends up in the wastewater system when you wash them).



Use a sink strainer to catch small pieces of food and compost your food waste whenever possible.



Use environmentally safe cleaning products, such as those with the EPA Safer Choice label

## **Smoke Detector Safety**

Balcones Heights Fire Department reminds residents to check their smoke detectors to ensure they are working properly. Test the units by pressing the button.

Everyone in the household should know what the alarm sounds like in case of an emergency.

If you don't have a functioning smoke detector in your home, BHFD can install a detector at no cost to residents. Please call BHFD at 210.957.3140 to schedule an appointment.
