CITY OF CHAMBLEE NOTICE OF PROPOSED PROPERTY TAX INCREASE

Chamblee maintains millage rate for 2023, Property assessments rise

June 8, 2023 - The City of Chamblee is hosting upcoming public hearings for the 2023 millage rate. The first two public hearings will be held at the Chamblee City Hall located at 3518 Broad Street, Chamblee Georgia on **Thursday, June 15, 2023, at 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.**

A final public hearing will be held at Chamblee City Hall, located at 3518 Broad Street, Chamblee, GA 30341 on **Thursday, June 29, 2023, at 6:00 p.m.** After the final public hearing, the millage rate will be formally adopted at the regular city council meeting on Thursday, June 29, 2023, at 6:00 p.m. at the Chamblee City Hall.

The Council in December adopted a 2023 general fund budget of \$30,824,950 with an anticipated millage rate of 6.25 mills, the same rate as in 2022, 2021, 2020, and 2019. In 2019, Chamblee approved an additional homestead exemption of \$20,000 for a total homestead exemption of \$50,000.

Due to an increase in DeKalb County's reevaluation of real property tax assessments, the proposed millage rate of 6.25 mills will result in an increase in property taxes by 6.84 percent over the rollback millage rate. For example, the proposed tax increase for a home with a fair market value of \$400,000 would be approximately \$60.00, and the proposed tax increase for non-homestead property with a fair market value of \$1,275,000 is approximately \$160.00.
