CITY OF CHAMBLEE BEGINS FIRST EVER PAVING PROJECT
Asks Public to Use Caution When Workers Are Present

April 14, 2017—The City of Chamblee’s first-ever paving project is tentatively slated to begin on Monday, April 17. Eighteen roads are included in the approximately 8-mile project. The total cost of the project is \$2.36 million. The entire project will take approximately six to eight weeks. Slated to begin the week of April 17-22, 2017 are:

“We are very excited about this project,” said Mayor Eric Clarkson. “We recently took over maintenance of approximately 76 centerline miles of roadway from DeKalb County. We routinely do a study of the roads with the IMS truck to determine our pavement conditions. The roads chosen needed the most attention. This is the first paving project that will begin to correct some of the issues with our infrastructure.”

Paving on residential streets will take place from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., while paving on North Shallowford Road. will take place from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. To minimize impacts, subdivision streets that are farthest from the I-85 bridge collapse zone will be paved first as C.W. Matthews is the contractor for both projects and will have a certified flagger in the area to handle traffic control. Please use caution while traveling through work zones, and watch for workers.

Please make sure your vehicles are not parked on the street when paving begins, or it will be towed. Also ensure your sprinkler system is not spraying into the road on the days crews are working, if applicable. Expect minor delays as you access your street while crews are working. All work should begin next week, weather permitting. Also secure any items hanging on walls, especially in the neighborhood areas, after milling and paving occurs a vibrating machine comes behind these two processes to tamp down these layers, and shaking may be felt in houses. Please secure any fragile items.
