## City of Chamblee Swears-in Elected Officials

**January 12, 2024** — On January 11<sup>th</sup>, the City of Chamblee held a swearing-in ceremony at Chamblee City Hall for District Two Councilmember Leslie Robson, District Three Councilmember Paul Stovall, and District Four Councilmember Elmer Veith. They were re-elected during the 2023 Municipal General Election on November 7, 2023.

Councilmember Leslie C. Robson was elected in 2007 and has been a Chamblee resident for more than two decades. She's been an advocate for the improvement of customer service at City Hall and was instrumental in founding Chamblee's Downtown Development Authority Board and the Public Art Commission.

"I'm so pleased to have been re-elected to my 5<sup>th</sup> term," said Leslie C. Robson, District 2 Councilmember. "I've seen so much. We've come along way and I'm so glad to be a part of this continuing journey."

Councilmember Paul Stovall was elected in 2022 and has been a resident since 2004. He is a lifetime member of Keep Chamblee Beautiful, serves on the Design Review Board, and previously served on the Dresden East Civic Association.

"Thank you, Chamblee, for the opportunity to continue serving our city in this capacity," said Paul Stovall, District 3 Councilmember. "Also, thank you to all of those who volunteer and work behind the scenes to improve our neighborhoods. I look forward to partnering with you, staff, and other local leaders to continue Chamblee's progress."

Councilmember Elmer Veith was elected in 2021 and was annexed into the City of Chamblee in 2013. Veith serves on the Discover Chamblee Advisory Committee and is an active member on the Public Art Commission.

"I want to thank the voters of Chamblee for allowing me to continue representing the city," said Elmer Veith, District 4 Councilmember. "Running unopposed tells me residents feel I am doing a good job for them, and the city is on the right track."

They will serve a four-year term from January 2024 - December 2027.
