
# Rural Champaign County Transportation Plan Existing Conditions Analysis

October 2020









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### Introduction

Champaign County has been increasing in population since 2000. Total population is estimated to have an increase of 23 percent from 2010 to 2020 (U.S. Census Bureau). Rural Champaign County, an 888 square mile area outside of the Champaign-Urbana Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA), encompasses 25 townships, 20 incorporated villages, and is home to three nature preserves (Figure 1-1).


Population in rural Champaign County has been increasing since 2000 at a slower pace in comparison with the MPA. All the rural townships have 80 percent or more of their land dedicated to agriculture (Figure 1-2). Within rural Champaign County, the median age is 42 years old compared to the median age of 29 years old of Champaign County. The median per capita income for rural Champaign County is \$41,375 compared to \$28,463 for the entire County.

The Rural Champaign County Transportation Plan will guide where and how rural Champaign County invests in a safe, convenient, and functional transportation network to more fully realize its opportunities to better serve its residents and attract and retain businesses, people, capital, and talent. To ensure such an end is met, CCRPC has prepared an existing condition analysis for the rural Champaign County area, through creating fact sheets for each township in the study area.

The township fact sheets (Chapter A to Y) provide relevant data on demographic, socio-economic, land use, transportation network, traffic and travel patterns, such as average daily traffic (ADT), crash severity, crash types, and crash locations.


This document relies on 2017 American Community Survey 5-year data produced by the U.S. Census Bureau and 2014-2018 traffic crash data provided by the Illinois Department of Transportation, and may not reflect the recent changes that have occurred in the past few years.

### **OVERVIEW**

#### Roadways

Roadways provide rural Champaign County residents vital access to various resources within the Champaign-Urbana MPA. Most workers in rural Champaign County have a commuting time greater than 15 minutes, which means most work is found in a neighboring village or the Champaign-Urbana MPA. As such, roadway connectivity, configuration, and condition have a high impact on the livelihood of rural Champaign County residents.

Rural Champaign County area is served by Interstate 57 (I-57), which runs north-south and connects the rural townships to the Champaign-Urbana MPA. I-74, which runs east-west, provides connection to Indianapolis to the east and Bloomington to the west. In addition, U.S. Route 45 (US 45) also allows a north-south connection to the Champaign-Urbana MPA. US 136 provides important connections amongst Brown, Compromise, Condit, Hardwood, Kerr, and Newcomb Townships into the Village of Rantoul while also functioning as a feeder into I-57 (Figure 2-1).




Figure 2-2: Roadway Jurisdiction

Rural Champaign County area consists of 193 miles of Champaign County roadways, 866 miles of municipal-owned roadways, 2,812 miles of township-owned roadways, and 27 miles of private-owned roadways (Figure 2-2). The roadway ownership dictates who is responsible for the maintenance of the roadways in addition to local changes that would allow for a village or a township to grow in a more sustainable and equitable fashion.




Figure 2-3: Average Daily Traffic (2018)




Figure 2-4: Truck Routes





Figure 2-5: Truck Average Daily Traffic (2018)

Figure 2-3 shows roadway average daily traffic volume (ADT) in 2018. Figure 2-4 shows roadways designated as truck routes and Figure 2-5 shows roadways traveled heavily by trucks.

Figure 2-1: Roadway Functional Classification


#### Railroads

Railroads are important infrastructure for goods movement through rural Champaign County (Figure 2-6). Railroads allow for low-value high-weight commodities such as agricultural products to be shipped both in and out of Champaign County (Champaign-Urbana Region Freight Plan, CCRPC, 2019).

Rural Champaign County is served by Canadian National (CN) Railways along the north-south route. The Union Pacific (UP) Railway serves on the southeast side of the County and cuts through the Village of St. Joseph. In addition, the Norfolk Southern Railway runs east-west and serves the southern area of Champaign County. The CN railways are single tracked throughout most of the rural Champaign County area. Amtrak also shares the railway with CN and has trackage rights over the entire length of the north-south CN railway within Champaign County.

Champaign County is home to 19 rail-served grain elevators and 13 are within the rural Champaign County area. These elevators facilitate the transfer of agricultural products from truck to trains.

Figure 2-6: Railroad Ownership




#### **Bridges**

There are 24 major bridges within the rural Champaign County area (Figure 2-7). Three bridges in the rural Champaign County area carry railroad tracks and approximately 13 bridges carry the interstates and state routes into the Champaign-Urbana MPA.

IDOT maintains a listing of structurally deficient bridges within the region. Structural deficiency is based on condition ratings for several bridge components, including the quality of the bridge's deck, structure, and waterway adequacy, among others. A bridge that is deemed structurally deficient does not mean the bridge is unsafe, but that certain components need to be monitored and maintained on a more frequent basis.

There are currently four structurally deficient bridges in rural Champaign County. As of 2019, two of the bridges are scheduled for repair (Source: The CUUATS Transportation Improvement Program 2020-2025, CCRPC, 2020).

Figure 2-7: Bridge Condition




#### **Public Transit**

Champaign County Rural Transit System service (C-CARTS) provides a safe and reliable public transit service to rural Champaign County residents. C-CARTS provides an on-demand pick-up service that allows for transit anywhere throughout the rural Champaign County area. This service is available from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. In addition, C-CARTS provides the Village of Rantoul public transit around the area through the Eagle Express, which operates within the times of 5:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. on Monday through Friday. The Rantoul Connector links the Village of Rantoul and the cities of Champaign and Urbana. This fixed-stop commuter route allows passengers to connect with the Eagle Express in Rantoul or Champaign-Urbana Mass Transit District (C-U MTD) services in Champaign-Urbana to complete their journey (Figure 2-8).

As population continues to grow both in the Champaign-Urbana MPA and in the rural Champaign County area, on demand service needs and passenger wait time may continue to increase. As such, improved and expanded C-CARTS services, which provide increased ease of access to the MPA, would benefit rural residents.

Figure 2-8: C-CARTS Fixed Transit Routes



#### Non-Motorized Trails/Greenways

Non-Motorized greenways in rural Champaign County are mainly the Kickapoo Rail to Trail (KRT) and trails in the Village of Rantoul (Figure 2-9). The KRT is currently 6.7 miles and connects the Champaign-Urbana urbanized area to the Village of St. Joseph. The KRT will be 24.5 miles in length when constructed fully, connecting the C-U urbanized area to Ogden, Danville, and ultimately the Kickapoo State Park in Vermilion County.

### Big.Small.All (Big.Small.All, Champaign County, ACP Visioning and Planning, Ltd., 2007)

Big.Small.All is the result of a communitywide dialogue to envision Champaign County's future. This plan includes stakeholder input from across the County on issues of economics, environment, development, housing, transportation, education, recreation, and other social topics.

## Connection to the Rural Champaign County Transportation Plan:

Big.Small.All establishes an objective under the goal of A Collaborative County to implement a coordinated county-wide transportation plan produced by a representative planning program comparable to the Champaign Urban Urbanized Area Transportation Study (CUUATS). Specifically, Big.Small.All develops the following action strategies for the county-wide transportation objective:

- Conduct a county-wide transportation study to research transportation needs and required infrastructure improvements including public transit, freight movement, and alternative transportation modes.
- Land use patterns, infrastructure investments, programs, and policies will provide most people with convenient and safe transportation choices and encourage walking, biking, and public transit.

- Champaign County will be a national leader in its use of sustainable transportation modes and models.
- Identify county roads to become "complete streets" which provide infrastructure for all transportation modes, as defined by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA).
- Designate and protect selected streets or roadways that exhibit historical, cultural, or scenic value as "legacy lanes."
- Provide county residents with education on the costs and benefits of all modes of transportation.
- Provide ample parks, trails, and recreation centers to all County residents and communities.

Big.Small.All also proposes that the County, municipalities, and other governmental entities will have formal policies guiding infrastructure investment and service provisions that equitably share the costs and benefits of development. The Rural Champaign County Transportation Plan aims to incorporate the goal, objectives, and action strategies established in Big. Small.All, based on Phase I Existing Condition analysis results.

### Champaign County Forest Preservation District Master Plan (CCFPD, 2010)

The Champaign County Forest Preserve District Master Plan is used to guide long-range planning for natural areas, facilities, and programs fulfilling the Champaign County Forest Preserve District's mission. It provides an overview of existing natural resources, current preservation practices, future needs, and potential solutions and recommendations.

## Connection to the Rural Champaign County Transportation Plan:

The inventory of the natural resources in the region summarized in the Champaign County Forest Preserve District Master Plan provides the Rural Champaign County Transportation Plan a good overview of natural areas within Champaign County and their implications on the transportation system.

## Village of St. Joseph Comprehensive Plan (CCRPC, 2013)

The Village of St. Joseph Comprehensive Plan is a guiding document for future growth and development for the Village and its 1-1/2 mile surrounding area. It establishes a vision, predicts the future land use of the community, and presents a strategy of development that achieves the community's ideals.

## Connection to the Rural Champaign County Transportation Plan:

The future land use map and transportation improvement recommendations proposed in the Village of St. Joseph Comprehensive Plan provide a good foundation for the existing condition and needs analysis for the Village in the Rural Champaign County Transportation Plan.




Figure 3-3: Village of St. Joseph Comprehensive Plan




Figure 3-4: Champaign County Greenways and Trails (GT) Plan




Figure 3-5: Champaign County Greenways and Trails (GT) Plan Updated

# Champaign County Greenways and Trails (GT) Plan (CCRPC, 2004; amended 2011; updated 2014)

This plan is a guiding document for the planning and development of a county-wide greenways and trails system for Champaign County residents and visitors. It seeks to establish design guidelines, potential projects, funding mechanisms, and an implementation schedule to facilitate inter-agency cooperation for developing a regional system of greenways and trails in the County.

# Connection to the Rural Champaign County Transportation Plan:

The greenway and trail resources identified and planed for in the Champaign County Greenways and Trails Plan are important components of the existing condition analysis of the Rural Champaign County Transportation Plan. The goals and objectives identified in the Champaign County Greenways and Trails Plan will also be incorporated into the second phase of the Rural Champaign County Transportation Plan development process

# Moving St. Joseph, A vision for St. Joseph's Transportation Network (Clark Dietz, Inc., 2017)

Moving St. Joseph is Village of St. Joseph's Transportation Master Plan, which identifies the state of St. Joseph's transportation system and forms a framework for evaluating and prioritizing investment in infrastructure. It provides an overview on the existing street network, traffic volume, land use development patterns, safety issues, and pedestrian and bicyclist mobility for the Village of St. Joseph. It also projects future traffic growth and additional recreation opportunities. The plan proposes shortterm and long-term capital improvement plans and project prioritization matrix with sewer system overlay.

# 2017 Region 8 (East Central Illinois) Human Service Transportation Plan (HSTP) (CCRPC, 2017)

The Human Service Transportation Plan (HSTP) evaluates existing transportation services, identifies the transportation needs of individuals with disabilities, older adults, and people with low incomes, and establishes goals and strategies for meeting these needs in Champaign, Clark, Coles, Cumberland, DeWitt, Douglas, Edgar, Macon, Moultrie, Piatt, Shelby, and Vermilion Counties.

# Connection to the Rural Champaign County Transportation Plan:

The 2017 HSTP identifies major trip generators and transportation providers for rural Champaign County. It also highlights the needs and gaps in transit services in Champaign County.

# Champaign County Land Resource Management Plan (CCRPC, 2010; updated 2011; amended 2018)

The Champaign County Land Resource Management Plan (LRMP) was adopted by Champaign County Board in April 2010 and amended with updated information on solid waste management and land use management areas in May 2018. The Plan guides land use related decisions of appointed and elected County officials over a 20-year projected timeframe and includes all areas of the County except lands that are located within corporate

limits of a municipality or lands that are designated for non-rural land use in an adopted municipal comprehensive plan.

The LRMP provides a baseline of information regarding existing demographic conditions and land use patterns in Champaign County. The Plan identifies goals, objectives, and policies intended to guide the Champaign County Board as it manages issues and resources related to land resource management in the County through developing a future land use map (2030) and potential measurable means of implementing the recommended policy framework.

# Connection to the Rural Champaign County Transportation Plan:

The Champaign County LRMP provides a comprehensive review of land use plans and policies within Champaign County and an inventory of regional demographic, employment, economic, land use, infrastructure, public facilities and services data. The existing condition analysis portion of the Rural Champaign County Transportation Plan will build upon the LRMP analysis results and focus on updating demographic, transportation, and land use changes in rural Champaign County since 2010 at the township level.




Figure 3-8: Champaign County Land Resource Management Plan and Update

# Rural Champaign County Area Safety Plan (CCRPC, 2019)

Developed by the Regional Planning Commission with collaboration of a safety committee, the Rural Champaign County Area Safety Plan (RCCASP) serves as a foundation for safety improvements to reduce traffic fatalities and Type A-injuries (serious injuries) in the rural Champaign County area, namely area outside of the Champaign-Urbana Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA). The RCCASP compares the five-year average crashes between the 2007-2011 study period and the 2012-2016 study period and found that there was a 13 percent decrease in the total number of crashes, a 14 percent increase in fatalities, and a 21 percent decrease in A-injuries in rural Champaign County.

# Connection to the Rural Champaign County Transportation Plan:

The RCCASP summarizes crash characteristics including crash locations, collision type, crash factors, driver demographics, and identifies a list of emphasis areas with strategies and responsible parties identified. The RCCASP also highlights a list of high-priority intersections and high-priority segments under the jurisdiction of Champaign County Highway department and IDOT. The Rural Champaign County Transportation Plan build upon the analysis in the RCCASP with updated crash data from 2017 and 2018.

# The Champaign-Urbana Long Range Transportation Plan 2045 (CCRPC, 2019)

The Champaign-Urbana Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) is a federally mandated document that is updated every five years, and details how the Champaign-Urbana MPA transportation system will evolve over the next 25 years. This plan has a regional scope and is not meant to take the place of local transportation plans or comprehensive land use plans. Its main purpose is to identify major regionally beneficial transportation projects in the urban areas that can be targeted for federal funding. While smaller localized transportation projects are reviewed and taken into consideration during the planning process, the LRTP lends itself to a broader regional focus and attempts to bring multiple jurisdictions together under one common vision, which includes improving safety, multimodal connectivity, equity, economy, and the environment.

# Connection to the Rural Champaign County Transportation Plan:

While the Champaign-Urbana LRTP focuses on the transportation system within the MPA, an area that encompasses land outside the Champaign-Urbana urbanized area, the Rural Champaign County Transportation Plan focuses on the rural areas outside of MPA in Champaign County.




Figure 3-11: Village of Rantoul Transportation Plan

Figure A-1: Ayers Township Population Growth, 1970 to 2017




Figure A-2: Ayers Township





Figure A-3: Ayers Township Race and Ethnicity Profile



Figure A-4: Ayers Township Households Poverty Level





Figure A-5: Ayers Township Households Vehicle Access

Figure B-1: Brown Township Population Growth, 1970 to 2017




Figure B-2: Brown Township





Figure B-3: Brown Township Race and Ethnicity Profile

Figure B-5: Brown Township Existing Land Uses





Figure B-4: Brown Township Households Poverty Level









Figure C-1: Colfax Township Population Growth, 1970 to 2017







Figure C-3: Colfax Township Race and Ethnicity Profile

Figure C-5: Colfax Township Existing Land Uses





Figure C-4: Colfax Township Households Poverty Level





Figure C-8: Colfax Township Average Daily Traffic and Crashes



Figure D-1: Compromise Township Population Growth, 1970 to 2017







Figure D-3: Compromise Township Race and Ethnicity Profile

Figure D-5: Compromise Township Existing Land Uses





Figure D-4: Compromise Township Households Poverty Level







Figure D-8: Compromise Township Average Daily Traffic and Crashes



Figure E-1: Condit Township Population Growth, 1970 to 2017







Figure E-3: Condit Township Race and Ethnicity Profile

Figure E-5: Condit Township Existing Land Uses




Figure E-4: Condit Township Households Poverty Level





Figure E-5: Condit Township Households Vehicle Access




Figure E-8: Condit Township Average Daily Traffic and Crashes

Figure F-1: Crittenden Township Population Growth, 1970 to 2017







Figure F-3: Crittenden Township Race and Ethnicity Profile



Figure F-5: Crittenden Township Existing Land Uses






Figure F-4: Crittenden Township Households Poverty Level





Figure F-5: Crittenden Township Households Vehicle Access







Figure G-1: East Bend Township Population Growth, 1970 to 2017







Figure G-3: East Bend Township Race and Ethnicity Profile





Figure G-4: East Bend Township Households Poverty Level















Figure H-3: Harwood Township Race and Ethnicity Profile

Figure H-5: Harwood Township Existing Land Uses




Figure H-4: Harwood Township Households Poverty Level





Figure H-5: Harwood Township Households Vehicle Access





Figure H-8: Harwood Township Average Daily Traffic and Crashes



Figure I-1: Hensley Township Population Growth, 1970 to 2017







Figure I-3: Hensley Township Race and Ethnicity Profile

Figure I-5: Hensley Township Existing Land Uses




Figure I-4: Hensley Township Households Poverty Level





Figure I-5: Hensley Township Households Vehicle Access







Figure J-1: Kerr Township Population Growth, 1970 to 2017







Figure J-3: Kerr Township Race and Ethnicity Profile

Figure J-5: Kerr Township Existing Land Uses




Figure J-4: Kerr Township Households Poverty Level





Figure J-5: Kerr Township Households Vehicle Access





Figure K-1: Ludlow Township Population Growth, 1970 to 2017







Figure K-3: Ludlow Township Race and Ethnicity Profile

Figure K-5: Ludlow Township Existing Land Uses




Figure K-4: Ludlow Township Households Poverty Level





Figure K-5: Ludlow Township Households Vehicle Access







Figure K-8: Ludlow Township Average Daily Traffic and Crashes











Figure L-3: Newcomb Township Race and Ethnicity Profile

Figure L-5: Newcomb Township Existing Land Uses





Figure L-4: Newcomb Township Households Poverty Level















Figure M-3: Ogden Township Race and Ethnicity Profile





Figure M-4: Ogden Township Households Poverty Level







Figure N-1: Pesotum Township Population Growth, 1970 to 2017







Figure N-3: Pesotum Township Race and Ethnicity Profile





Figure N-4: Pesotum Township Households Poverty Level





Figure N-5: Pesotum Township Households Vehicle Access





Figure O-1: Philo Township Population Growth, 1970 to 2017







Figure O-3: Philo Township Race and Ethnicity Profile

Figure O-5: Philo Township Existing Land Uses




Figure O-4: Philo Township Households Poverty Level





Figure O-5: Philo Township Households Vehicle Access



Figure O-8: Philo Township Average Daily Traffic and Crashes





Figure O-9: Philo Township Roadway Maintenance Responsibilities

Figure P-1: Rantoul Township Population Growth, 1970 to 2017







Figure P-3: Rantoul Township Race and Ethnicity Profile

Figure P-5: Rantoul Township Existing Land Uses




Figure P-4: Rantoul Township Households Poverty Level





Figure P-5: Rantoul Township Households Vehicle Access





Figure P-8: Rantoul Township Average Daily Traffic and Crashes



Figure Q-1: Raymond Township Population Growth, 1970 to 2017







Figure Q-3: Raymond Township Race and Ethnicity Profile





Figure Q-5: Raymond Township Households Vehicle Access







Figure Q-8: Raymond Township Average Daily Traffic and Crashes



Figure R-1: Sadorus Township Population Growth, 1970 to 2017







Figure R-3: Sadorus Township Race and Ethnicity Profile





Figure R-4: Sadorus Township Households Poverty Level





Figure R-5: Sadorus Township Households Vehicle Access



Figure R-8: Sadorus Township Average Daily Traffic and Crashes









Figure S-3: Scott Township Race and Ethnicity Profile




Figure S-4: Scott Township Households Poverty Level





Figure S-5: Scott Township Households Vehicle Access




Figure S-8: Scott Township Average Daily Traffic and Crashes

Figure T-1: Sidney Township Population Growth, 1970 to 2017







Figure T-3: Sidney Township Race and Ethnicity Profile




Figure T-4: Sidney Township Households Poverty Level





Figure T-5: Sidney Township Households Vehicle Access


Figure T-8: Sidney Township Average Daily Traffic and Crashes

Figure U-1: Somer Township Population Growth, 1970 to 2017







Figure U-3: Somer Township Race and Ethnicity Profile

Figure U-5: Somer Township Existing Land Uses




Figure U-4: Somer Township Households Poverty Level





Figure U-5: Somer Township Households Vehicle Access







Figure U-8: Somer Township Average Daily Traffic and Crashes











Figure V-3: South Homer Township Race and Ethnicity Profile





Figure V-5: South Homer Township Existing Land Uses











Figure V-8: South Homer Township Average Daily Traffic and Crashes













Figure W-3: St. Joseph Township Race and Ethnicity Profile





Figure W-5: St. Joseph Township Existing Land Uses












Figure W-8: St. Joseph Township Average Daily Traffic and Crashes







Figure X-3: Stanton Township Race and Ethnicity Profile





Figure X-4: Stanton Township Households Poverty Level










Figure X-8: Stanton Township Average Daily Traffic and Crashes







Figure Y-3: Tolono Township Race and Ethnicity Profile





Figure Y-5: Tolono Township Existing Land Uses











Figure Y-8: Tolono Township Average Daily Traffic and Crashes





# SUMMARY

This chapter highlights some key findings from the socio-economic and traffic analysis of townships in rural Champaign County. This includes important trip generators within the study area, townships with a high percentage of zero-vehicle households, roadways with high Annual Average Daily Traffic (AADT), roadways with high truck AADT, and traffic crash analysis findings.

#### **Important Trip Generators**

Figure 4-1 shows the population distribution among the townships. Five townships, including Philo, Ludlow, Rantoul, St. Joseph, and Tolono, have around 2,000 or more people. Rantoul, St. Joseph, and Tolono each has a population of 5,000 or higher.


Following are some of the major trip generators in each of these three townships:

- Rantoul: Walmart, Hap Parker Family Aquatic Center, Multicultural Center, Rantoul Public Library;
- St. Joseph: St. Joseph Animal Hospital, IGA Food liner;
- Tolono: Walmart and Willard Airport.

#### Areas with High Zero-Vehicle Households

Figure 4-1 also shows the distribution of zero-vehicle households. Somer Township has the highest concentration of zero-vehicle households, with more than 11 percent of the households having no access to a personal vehicle. Among others, Harwood, Ludlow, Pesotum, and Rantoul have a relatively higher percentage of zero-vehicle households, ranging from 2.5 percent to 3.9 percent. Colfax, Crittenden, East Bend, Kerr, and Stanton are the townships where each household has access to at least one vehicle.

#### Roadways with High Traffic Volume

Figure 4-2 shows the high-volume corridors in rural Champaign County. Roadways in townships located adjacent to the Champaign-Urbana MPA or to the Interstates experience high traffic volumes compared to the other townships.


In addition to the Interstates, major east-west corridors serving rural Champaign County include:

- US 136, which provides access to Interstate 57 to northern rural Champaign County;
- County Road 2500 N, which provides access to US 45 to northern rural Champaign County;
- US 150 and IL 10, which provide access to the MPA, parallel to Interstate 72 and Interstate 74; and
- County Road 1000 N, which provides access to Interstate 57 to southern rural Champaign County.

In addition to the Interstates and US 45, major north-south corridors include:

- IL 47, which provides access to the Village of Mahomet and Interstate 74;
- County Road 900E/1000 E and IL 130, which provide north-south access to the MPA; and
- IL 49, which provides access to Interstate 74 to eastern rural Champaign County

Figure 4-2: High Traffic Volume Corridors





Figure 4-3 shows the corridors with high truck traffic. In addition to the Interstates, trucks traveled heavily on IL 47, which connects Champaign County north to west-Chicago suburbs where several major distribution centers are located (Source: Champaign-Urbana Region Freight Plan, CCRPC, 2019).

Other roadways traveled heavily by trucks include:

- US 45 connecting the MPA with the Village of Rantoul to the north;
- US 136 through the Village of Rantoul;
- County Road 900E/1000 E connecting the MPA to US 136;
- County Road 1000 N; and
- US 45, IL 130, and IL 49 connecting the MPA to the south.

Figure 4-3: High Truck Traffic Volume Corridors




#### **Crash Heat Map**

Figure 4-4 shows a heat map of traffic crash locations. While the heat map captures all the crashes in Champaign County, it is weighted based on the total number of fatal crashes. Outside of the Champaign-Urbana MPA, a relatively higher concentration of crashes can be seen in Rantoul, St Joseph, Ogden, Somer, Ludlow, and Pesotum Townships.

The following segments have been identified as high priority segments in the Rural Champaign County Area Safety Plan (CCRPC, 2019):

- US 45 between the MPA and the Village of Thomasboro;
- US 150/County Road 1600N between the MPA and the Village of St. Joseph;
- County Road1600 E/IL 130 south of the Village of Philo; and
- US 136 between the Village of Rantoul and the Village of Gifford.
