

Fall 2018 Public Input Report

December 11, 2018



Public Outreach

The City of Urbana has contracted the Champaign County Regional Planning Commission (CCRPC) to develop a Bicycle Wayfinding Plan, in an effort to implement many recommendations in the 2016 Urbana Bicycle Master Plan.

CCRPC hosted a joint public meeting for the Urbana Bicycle Wayfinding Plan and Urbana Pedestrian Master Plan on Thursday, November 15, 2018 at the Urbana Civic Center. The meeting drew 31 participants, including representatives from Champaign County Bikes (CCB), Heartland Pathways, the Urbana Bicyclist and Pedestrian Advisory Commission (BPAC), Urbana Plan Commission, and Urbana City Council.

Participants were asked to provide input and choose preferences on draft sign designs, destinations, bikeway names, and corridors for implementation. Exhibit posters, maps, and comment cards were provided to participants to provide input.



These materials were also posted on the CCRPC website after the meeting, and Urbana bicyclists were able to submit comments through Monday, November 26, 2018. This report lists the results of these comments.

Sign Design Votes & Comments

Participants were asked to choose their preferred sign design on three posters: an on-street bikeway sign design (see Page 4), an off-street trail sign design (see Page 5), and a University of Illinois bikeway sign design (see Page 6). Listed below are the voting results and comments.





Comments

I would avoid this [naming Urbana's bikeways] — seems unnecessary and possibly confusing. Go with straightforward naming.

Illinois Street leads to campus, [hence the Grange Trail idea].

People know the street names, use that or don't name at all.

This idea confuses me. Is this a "take the Green Loop" or "head to the Arts District via the Red Loop," or do you want funny names – that will confuse people? Not sure how "Ebert's Way" on Washington St. gets me to the University of Illinois.
