The Bridge

The Bridge group began in November 2018, when 10 African American men and 10 white men gathered to talk candidly about race. For over a year they met and opened their hearts about life experiences that were the most wounding, and their entrenched beliefs about race. The separation of cultures has begun to soften because these men have simply been talking together about the serious issues of race and spending time together. These talks created a bond of trust and deep friendships which will influence families and our neighbors in incredible ways for many years to come.



Pastor Warren Henry of the Kingdom of God International Ministry invited BOTH Serenbe Interfaith and The Bridge to come to join his congregation (about 250 people)...to talk about what The Bridge has accomplished so far, and how we see our communities blending in the future. The backdrop of the conversation was a bus trip to visit to Legacy Memorial and Museum in Montgomery, Alabama, with the men and their wives. The point was to soften the segregation of culturally held beliefs right here in our own back yard.

The Bridge panel for dialogue was: Joey Mitchell, Alan Merrill, Lionel Brown, Barry Anbinder, David Daniels, George Danusis, Jaceey Sebastian, and Greg Sudmeier, with Rebecca Bradley sharing her testimony after visiting the Legacy Memorial and Museum in Montgomery, Alabama.

I (and others who staff our pantry) have been fortunate enough to work with Midwest Food Bank on behalf of the Community Brickworks Food Pantry for several years. From the very first time I went to the warehouse and to this day, I am struck by how efficient they are. They take us through the aisles with someone pushing the flat cart and someone taking note of what we take and someone else describing what is available and the quantity allowed. We have been blessed to receive canned goods, occasional fresh produce, bread, meat, frozen items, and so much more. Blankets are often available that we take and give to the fire department for emergencies they may have. While our food pantry is able to stock the basics, because of Midwest we also have extra snack things that our budget wouldn't allow for. We get cookies, pretzels and chips of some kind with each visit. When our patrons visit us they are really happy to get the extra sweet things. They pack up our cars in what seems like a nanosecond and as soon as we are finished and take a moment to express our thankfulness in prayer, were all packed and ready to go.

Going to Midwest has become something to look forward to each month. I never know what I will come back with and after working with them for so long we have developed a warm friendship and have some laughs along with the business of receiving the bounty they share with so many.

5 Ways to Support Your Local Independent Bookstore

For those who may not have been following the book industry news over the last few years, there has been a delightful and surprising resurgence of independent bookstores. According to the American Booksellers Association “there has been a 35 percent increase in the number of independent bookstore locations since 2009, existing locations are opening new locations, and established stores are being successfully sold to new owners, often younger owners as a new generation of booksellers enters the industry.” And this happened after nearly a decade of declining numbers as the industry struggled to adapt to the onslaught of Amazon and e-commerce. Even with this good news showing the impressive resilience of indie booksellers, we are facing a tough climate. Amazon’s share of the print book market expanded from 37% in 2015 to over 50% for the first time in 2019. All this is to say: if you are a lover of independent bookstores, please don’t get complacent at the news of our revival, we still have a lot of work to do. It is part of our personal mission to be part of a national movement to revive the independent neighborhood bookstore. To that end, here are some ways you can support your local independent bookstore that you may not have thought about.

3. Create a Home Library
4. Bring Friends and Out-of-Town Visitors to the Bookstore

Morgan Boszilkov Lindsey is a self-taught artist using clay, fabric and paint to create two-dimensional and sculptural vibrant works of art. She comes from a family of professional artists and inspired by nature, her travels to Asia and Europe, and the various materials with which she works, Morgan taught herself to knit and sew growing up in Atlanta, to paint in Boston, to crochet in Madrid, intricate beadwork in Kyushu, Japan, to make handbags and clothing in Wilkes-Barre, to felt wool, design landscapes and carve wood in Alpharetta, and most recently to produce ceramics in Decatur.

Her eclectic travels and self-taught craftsmanship culminated into a successful line of eco-friendly wedding gowns, Natural Bridal Collection by Morgan Boszilkov. Her gown designs were featured in *Brides Magazine*, *Skirt!*, CNN,



OneWed, and *Style Me Pretty* and she even designed a dress for Melissa Rivers, during TLC's "Who are you wearing?" design challenge, and won the competition. Her current ceramic work featuring handmade tiles has been highlighted in the *Atlanta Journal Constitution* and HGTV.

She experiments with the concept of wabi-sabi and beauty in imperfection, exploring various materials and always experimenting with new techniques. The process of art is an impatient meditation that brings her joy and fulfillment.

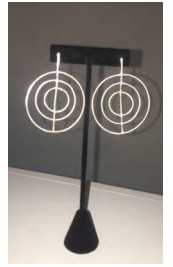
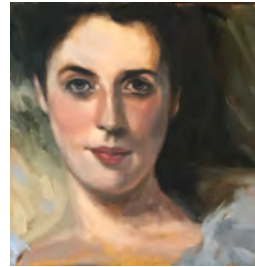
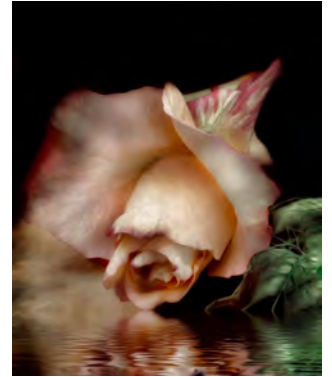

Kristin Andreassen is a songwriter and percussive dancer who merges those skills in performances and recordings that are both inventive and deeply rooted in American traditional music. 2015 saw the release of her first studio album *Gondolier*, with tours supporting Black Prairie, Dawn Landes, Aoife O'Donovan, Mipso and Noam Pikelny. Her debut record *Kiss Me Hello* included the award-winning "Crayola Doesn't Make a Color for Your Eyes" which went to #1 on kids' radio and has been covered by dozens of artists

ranging from Tyne Daly to high school marching bands.

While she's best known for her smart and emotive original lyrics, Kristin got her start in traditional music – she played guitar and fiddle with the groundbreaking string band *Uncle Earl* (w/ Abigail Washburn, Rayna Gellert & KC Groves) and danced with the

Growing up in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, singer-songwriter Caleb Caudle was raised on rock n' roll and Southern hospitality. Influenced by bands like The Clash and Velvet Underground, Caudle was playing North Carolina's punk rock circuit by the age of 15. Naturally, his music matured with his age and he became more lyrically driven, adopting a love for music history and collecting vinyl.

In 2012, he decided to quit his day job and focus solely on music—seven years and four albums later, Caudle is gaining the traction he deserves. He was recently dubbed one of “10 New Country Artists You Need To Know” by Rolling Stone. He's played Willie Nelson's Luck Reunion, Nashville's famed AmericanaFest multiple times,

A Proactive Citizen and Community Health Care Initiative

ChattCare is a "community paramedicine" program of the Chattahoochee Hills Fire Rescue Department to initiate proactive contact with "at risk" persons having emergent, terminal or age-related health conditions.

Co-directed by Dr. Chris Edens, Medical Director for the department, ChattCare has four basic objectives ...

1. Identify, contact and follow-up with "at risk" patients and/or specific residents to offer assistance
2. Provide regular monitoring of health conditions, vital signs, medication compliance and limited wound care
3. Interface with physicians to assist with coordination of further evaluation/care and transport, as required
4. Provide regular education and individual assessment opportunities in public venues



Citizens (only) may complete a "ChattCare medical profile" to register at-risk family members.

Qualified registrants might present with two or more of any of the following conditions ...



- Oxygen-dependent
- Diagnosis of high blood pressure
- LVAD cardiac support
- Non-ambulatory
- COPD
- Dialysis
- Recent surgery
- Congestive heart failure
- Recent amputation
- Bed-bound
- Advanced dementia
- Other potentially debilitating conditions

We do have some limitations ...

- ChattCare (Fire Department) personnel cannot write prescriptions
- Expenses for medication, transportation and physician care are not managed within the ChattCare program and are the express responsibilities of the patient. ChattCare representatives cannot assist with matters related to healthcare insurance.
- Hospice care patients are not exempt but general care must remain the responsibility of the hospice care provider.
