Mayor Pacheco called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

MOTION Iannelli SECONDED Keaton to approve the consent agenda. All ayes. Motion Carried.

Approval of Regular Agenda

MOTION Keaton SECONDED Henson to approve the regular agenda. All ayes. Motion Carried.

Public Comments (available in person and via Zoom)

Kelsey Cohen, Sylvan Township resident, thanked the Police Department for supporting Pride Month events, including the Pride March. She then thanked the Police for supporting the No Kings protest on June 14th which had approximately 600 people in attendance. Ms. Cohen thanked the City for making Chelsea welcoming and inclusive.

Presentation

1. Sage Solutions Update (Sherri McDaniel)

Sherri McDaniel was present to provide an update on what Sage Solutions has been working on with the City since the beginning of their contract, including a comprehensive audit of employee records and Human Resources records and policies, updates to the personnel manual, implementation of performance evaluations, remediation of employee issues, and much more. Ms. McDaniel answered questions from Council Members.

2. Pathways to Renewal Update (Shawn Personke, Parks Commissioner)

Shawn Personke, Chair of the Parks Commission, was present to provide an update on the Pathways to Renewal project at TimberTown Park.

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Public Hearing

Council Business

1. Approval of Appointment to the Planning Commission (Mayor Pacheco)

Current Planning Commissioner Marcia White has a term on the Planning Commission scheduled to expire on June 30, 2025. She is not seeking reappointment. Alexander Rasegan applied for appointment to the Planning Commission for a three-year term ending on June 30, 2028. This fills the only open position on the Planning Commission.

MOTION Mehuron SECONDED Merkel to appoint Alexander Rasegan to the Planning Commission for a term ending June 30, 2028. All ayes. Motion carried.

2. Approval of Proclamation Declaring June 19, 2025, as Juneteenth Independence Day (Council Member Mehuron)

On behalf of the Chelsea Human Rights Commission, Council Member Mehuron submitted a proclamation declaring June 19, 2025, as Juneteenth Independence Day. In June 2021, President Joe Biden signed legislation officially designating Juneteenth as a federal holiday, and the holiday has been designated an official State of Michigan holiday for the first time in 2022. The holiday is a celebration of the Emancipation Proclamation, signed by President Abraham Lincoln on January 1, 1863, decreeing all people held as slaves be henceforward free, and paving the way for the passing of the 13th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution that formally abolished slavery in the United States of America. Juneteenth acknowledges America's pledge to support liberty and equality and pays honor to those who suffered the evils of slavery and its aftermath.

MOTION Merkel SECONDED Henson to approve the Proclamation declaring June 19, 2025, as Juneteenth Independence Day in Chelsea. All ayes. Motion carried.

3. Approval of Non-Union Salaried Employee Wage Increase (Manager Colburn)

The City proposed a wage increase of 3% for Non-Union Salaried Employees effective July 1, 2025. This increase is compatible with the current Detroit CPI projections of 2.8% - 3.5%.

MOTION Iannelli SECONDED Keaton to approve a 3% wage increase for non-union salaried employees effective July 1, 2025. All ayes. Motion carried.

4. Local Officers Compensation Commission Recommendation (Manager Colburn)

The Local Officers Compensation Commission was established by the City Council this past year. Their role is to research and discuss amounts to recommend payment for elected officials' services on behalf of the City of Chelsea. The Commission met multiple

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times, reviewed the Michigan Municipal League annual survey results, and discussed in detail. Jeff Rohrer, Local Officer Compensation Commissioner, was present to discuss the LOCC's recommendations. Council Members discussed the recommendation and asked questions from Mr. Lohrer.

MOTION Keaton SECONDED Merkel to accept the Local Officers Compensation Commission recommendations of maintaining pay rates for the Mayor and Council for the next two years. 5 ayes, 2 nays (Henson, Pacheco). Motion carried.

5. Approval of Letter of Support for Washtenaw Area Value Express (WAVE) (Manager Colburn)

The City of Chelsea and Western Washtenaw County receive public transportation services from WAVE. A significant number of residents that utilize this service are seniors and those with disabilities. The core transit services allow many with the most critical needs to have access to personal and medical services. The funding from the county-wide older persons millage must be approved by the Washtenaw County Commissioners. The City of Chelsea provided a letter of support requesting this appropriation. Over a third of the City of Chelsea residents meet the definition of older people eligible for this service. The City of Chelsea is the central hub for medical and personal services within western Washtenaw County.

MOTION Henson SECONDED Morris to approve the letter of support and to forward the letter to the Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners signed by Mayor Pacheco. All ayes. Motion carried.

6. Adoption of Resolution #2025-17 Budget Amendments for Fiscal Year 2024-2025 (Director King)

This item requests the adoption of Resolution #2025-17: Budget Amendments for Fiscal Year 2024-2025.

Budget Amendments are necessary for several reasons:

- 1. Adaptation to Changing Circumstances
- 2. Correction of Errors
- 3. Fiscal Responsibility
- 4. Economic Stability
- 5. Monitoring and Accountability

Although the 2024-2025 budget was adopted at the department level, the budget amendments are presented at the account level to increase transparency.

MOTION Merkel SECONDED Henson to adopt Resolution #2025-17 Budget Amendments for Fiscal Year 2024-2025. All ayes. Motion carried.

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7. Approval of Agreement with Wellspring Solar, LLC. (Superintendent Freeman)

In late February, Wellspring Solar, LLC contacted the City's Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) to inquire about a grant opportunity through the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) called the NEXUS grant. This program offers grants to water and wastewater treatment facilities aimed at reducing onsite energy use, with a priority on renewable energy sources.

Wellspring has played a key role in writing the grant application and has designed a solar panel project for the WWTP that is expected to produce approximately 95.4 kW of energy at a cost of \$198,423. Currently, the WWTP consumes 978,731 kW annually, resulting in an annual electricity cost of \$105,026.56. The proposed solar project is projected to save about 13% annually, translating to savings of approximately \$13,653.45.

The grant application was submitted on March 14, 2025. On June 11, 2025, the City was notified that it had been awarded a \$100,000 grant. Additionally, there is a 30% federal tax credit available, amounting to \$59,529.60. As a result, the City is responsible for only \$38,902.40 after the grant and tax credits are applied.

The work funded by the grant must be completed by August 31, 2025. Given the tight timeline and EGLE's familiarity with the Wellspring plan, the staff at the WWTP recommended awarding the project to Wellspring Solar LLC.

MOTION lannelli SECONDED Henson to approve a contract with Wellspring Solar, LLC for the installation of a solar array at the Wastewater Plant for \$198,423.00. All ayes. Motion carried.

8. Adoption of Capital Improvement Plan (Community Development Director Montagno)

The Capital Improvements Plan (CIP) is a 5-year plan of all public structures and improvements, including equipment purchases, studies, and capital improvement projects. The CIP is required by the Michigan Planning Enabling Act (MPEA) to be updated every year. The CIP is an important part of budget planning to help coordinate and prioritize major capital expenditures.

MOTION Keaton SECONDED Merkel to adopt the Capital Improvement Plan for 2025-2030. All ayes. Motion carried.

9. Adoption of Fee Schedule (Community Development Director Montagno)

The proposed fee schedule was updated to include all applications/processes involving the Community Development department as well as fees that were previously not

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posted. This includes modifications from the previous year's fee schedule to account for refined processes, additional permitting requirements, and ordinance changes. When developing the updated fees, staff considered the average time involved with each process.

MOTION Henson SECONDED Merkel to adopt the proposed 2025-2026 Community Development fee schedule. All ayes. Motion carried.

10. Approval of First Reading of Sign Ordinance (Community Development Director Montagno)

At the June 17, 2025, regular meeting, the Planning Commission passed a motion recommending approval to City Council of the proposed text amendment that would alter the existing Sign provisions in Article 9. These changes were the result of discussions at three (3) work sessions in March, April, and May. Many of the proposed changes aim to address ambiguity, offer consistent terminology, and address text errors. There are also a number of substantive changes that were the result of experience with the administration of the Ordinance and discussion by the Planning Commission.

MOTION Henson SECONDED Keaton to approve at First Reading Zoning Ordinance Text Amendments for Signs. 6 ayes, 1 Abstain. Motion carried.

11. Approval of First Reading of Bike Ordinance (Community Development Director Montagno)

At the June 17, 2025, regular meeting, the Planning Commission passed a motion recommending approval to City Council of the proposed text amendment that would introduce provisions for Bicycle Parking into the existing off-street parking area and design regulations. The proposed ordinance amendment was brought to the Planning Commission for discussion at 2 work sessions, after a request for bicycle parking requirements was made by a Planning Commissioner. The proposed provisions reflect many of the goals of the Chelsea Master Plan, including transportation, healthy community, age-friendly, recreation and entertainment, and environmental quality goals.

MOTION Keaton SECONDED Henson to approve at First Reading Zoning Ordinance Text Amendment for Bicycle Parking Requirements. All ayes. Motion carried.

Staff Reports

Manager Colburn reported that the Electric Company was currently managing a power outage. He reported that the next day was the Chelsea Area Housing Commission meeting. He's received a lot of interest in the Housing RFP.

CITY MANAGER Martin Colburn

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Manager Colburn reported on electric work within the city, including installing new poles and trenching. Then he provided an update on the water storm drain work at the Main Street Park. He provided an update on the Pathways to Renewal and TimberTown updates.

Police Chief Kazyak presented the May 2025 report of activity for the Chelsea Police Department. He reported on the fraud prevention seminar at the Chelsea Senior Center. They will participate in another fraud seminar soon. Thursday, the department held the annual Public Safety Night. He thanked supporters and attendees.

Council Reports

Council Member Mehuron attended two HRC meetings where they discussed changes to ordinance language. They will be hosting a table at Sounds & Sights and are advertising events related to Juneteenth and Pride Month. On Wednesday, June 11th she attended the Sex Education subcommittee meeting for the Chelsea School District Board of Education. Council Member Mehuron also attended the forum hosted by Congresswoman Dingell.

Council Member Merkel attended a CERC meeting on June 12th where they discussed participation in the Youth Summer Pass. There is a Teen Takeover scheduled for August 8th.

Council Member Morris attended a CAFA meeting on June 17th. Much of the meeting was in closed session. However, they discussed transfers and potential property locations outside of closed session. The WAVE meeting for June was canceled.

Council Member Henson attended Congresswoman Dingell's town hall as well. On June 11th she attended the WWRAG group where WAVE spoke about potential funding concerns. On June 9th the Chelsea School Board passed a resolution to support the CTE millage, approved a new contract for Superintendent Kapolka, and completed the policy review.

Council Member Keaton attended the SEMCOG General Assembly on June 12th. He attended a WATS policy meeting on June 18th where they approved the audit.

Council Member Iannelli attended Congresswoman Dingell's town hall as well on June 16th. He attended the Planning Commission on June 17th where they held public hearings for the signs and off-street parking ordinances. The Zero Waste Coalition was meeting today at the same time as Council so he could not attend that meeting. The WWRA will be meeting on Wednesday, 25th. He reminded everyone that the fireworks were this Saturday night at the Council Fairgrounds.

Mayor Pacheco had three meetings with City Manager Colburn to go over the agenda and current issues and projects. She had a Zoom meeting with Derrick Scott, a real estate professional. He will be hosting a meeting this Wednesday. She attended the Chelsea District Library Summer Kick-Off on June 6th. On June 10th she had a walk-through with Woda Cooper at the 1155 Old Manchester site. On June 11th she had a lunch meeting with John Sears, the City's consultant for hotel feasibility. She then attended the WWRAG that same day which had a transportation focus.

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On June 12th, Mayor Pacheco attended Sounds & Sights. On the 13th she attended a legislative breakfast at the Jackson Chamber of Commerce, where they discussed the education budget. The same day MSHDA Region K meeting was rescheduled. That night the mayor attended the Menopause Movement event in Ann Arbor. The next day she attended Congresswoman Dingell's town hall meeting. On June 17th the Mayor attended an aquatic center subcommittee meeting which also included the newly hired Director of Community Development, Sarah Bentley.

Mayor Pacheco met with the Community Development Director, Assistant City Manager, and members of the DDA to plan for a discussion regarding the Noise Ordinance. On June 21st she attended a listening tour with Jocelyn Benson and other local officials.

Upcoming meetings include a meeting with County Commissioner Maciejewski on the 24th to prepare for an upcoming quarterly meeting with the Chelsea School District. The Housing Commission and the Regional Advisory Group meet jointly four times a years, and on September 25th there will be a financiers' panel. The DDA meeting is on the 26th.

Explanation of Agenda Item: The non-motorized plan previously adopted through the Master Plan has been amended. Updates have been made based on input received through the master planning process and from a nonmotorized focus group/committee made of representatives from Washtenaw County Parks and Recreation, Huron Waterloo Pathways Initiative, 5 Healthy Towns, City staff and other regional stakeholders. 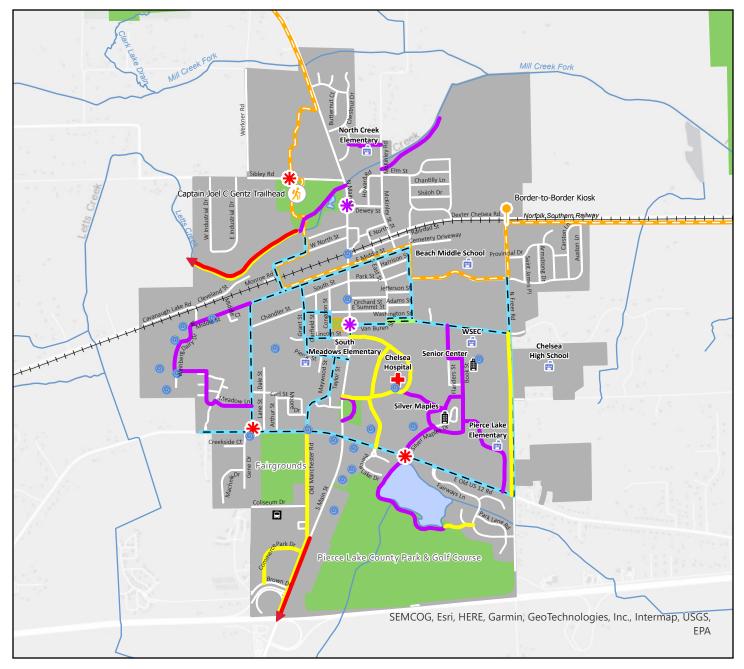

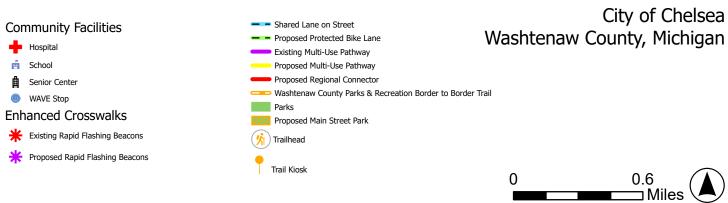

A RESOLUTION TO ADOPT A NONMOTORIZED TRANSPORATION PLAN FOR THE CITY OF CHELSEA

RESOLUTION #2025-20

WHEREAS, the City of Chelsea recognizes the growing need for a more sustainable and equitable transportation system, providing safe, efficient, and accessible alternatives to automobile travel; and

WHEREAS, the City of Chelsea's Master Plan highlights key transportation goals and policies that align with the vision for a comprehensive, multi-modal transportation system, including the establishment of complete streets, prioritizing active transportation, and promoting the public health and well-being of the community while encouraging walking, biking, and other nonmotorized forms of transportation while enhancing safety for all users; and

WHEREAS, the City of Chelsea emphasizes community health and recreation through its transportation policies, which promote accessible nonmotorized amenities and make walking and cycling viable and attractive options for all residents, recognizing the value of strategic partnerships in advancing its transportation goals, including working with Washtenaw County Parks and Recreation, the Huron Waterloo Pathways Initiative, 5 Healthy Towns, and the Safe Routes to School initiative, to enhance infrastructure, improve safety, and support healthy transportation options for residents, especially youth, seniors, and other vulnerable populations; and

WHEREAS, the City of Chelsea believes that transportation investments should not only support mobility but also contribute to broader community goals, including sustainability, public health, and economic development by committing to connecting its nonmotorized transportation network to the Washtenaw County Border-to-Border Trail, thereby enhancing regional connectivity and offering residents and visitors a continuous route for walking, biking, and other nonmotorized travel across the county; and

WHEREAS, the City of Chelsea has conducted a planning process to develop a Nonmotorized Transportation Plan that includes public input, technical analysis, and collaboration with stakeholders;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Chelsea, Michigan, that:

- 1. The City of Chelsea hereby adopts the Nonmotorized Transportation Plan as presented, ensuring alignment with the goals and policies of the City's Master Plan.
- 2. The City Council directs City staff to take all necessary actions to implement the Nonmotorized Transportation Plan in phases, prioritizing projects that enhance safety, accessibility, and connectivity for nonmotorized users, including pursuing state, federal, and local funding opportunities to support the plan's projects and initiatives.

- 3. The City Council encourages continued public involvement and collaboration with stakeholders to ensure the successful implementation and ongoing refinement of the Nonmotorized Transportation Plan.
- 4. The City of Chelsea is committed to connecting its nonmotorized transportation system to the Washtenaw County Border-to-Border Trail through the development of infrastructure and wayfinding signage where appropriate and will work with Washtenaw County, Washtenaw County Parks and Recreation, Huron Waterloo Pathways Initiative, 5 Healthy Towns, and other regional stakeholders to enhance regional access for nonmotorized travel.
- 5. The City of Chelsea will continue to collaborate with the Safe Routes to School initiative to improve safety and accessibility for students traveling to and from school and will seek to implement measures that encourage walking and biking as safe and viable options for all school-age children.

Explanation of Agenda Item:

At the June 17, 2025, regular meeting, the Planning Commission passed a motion recommending approval to City Council of the proposed text amendment that would introduce provisions for Bicycle Parking into the existing off-street parking area and design regulations. The proposed ordinance amendment was brought to the Planning Commission for discussion at 2 work sessions, after a request for bicycle parking requirements by a Planning Commissioner. The proposed provisions reflect many of the goals of the Chelsea Master Plan, including Transportation, Healthy Community, Age-Friendly, Recreation and Entertainment, and Environmental Quality goals. The requirements apply to projects undergoing site plan approval, special use approval, or a change to a more intensive use.

Section 8.11, Off-Street Parking Area Design

- N. (New Section) Bicycle Parking Requirements.
 - 1. Bicycle parking is required for all multiple family, commercial, retail, office, and industrial buildings.
 - 2. One bicycle rack/hoop must be provided for every twenty (20) parking spaces, or portion thereof.
 - 3. Location. Bicycle parking must be visible from the main entrance of the structure or facility. Bicycle racks must be securely anchored to the ground and must allow the bicycle wheel and frame to be locked to the bicycle rack. If space is not available, the Planning Commission or Community Development Director or their designee may permit an alternate location.
 - 4. Lighting. All bike parking facilities shall be lighted with fixtures that comply with Section 6.07 of this chapter.
 - 5. Size. Each bicycle parking space must be sufficient to accommodate a bicycle at least six (6) feet in length and two (2) feet wide. Bicycle racks must be installed no closer than two (2) feet from a wall or parked vehicle. The bicycle rack must be located where access is not restricted by legally parked vehicles.
 - 6. Maintenance. The surfacing of bicycle parking facilities must be designed and maintained to be clear of mud and snow.
 - 7. Design. Bicycle parking facilities must consist of a fixed bicycle rack, such as a hoop style rack or another type of rack that meets these standards mounted on a hard surface that is at least as large as the minimum size requirements above.
 - 8. Applicability. Bicycle parking requirements shall apply to development projects in the following circumstances:
 - a. Site plan approval.
 - b. Special use approval, at the discretion of the Planning Commission.
 - c. Change of use to a more intensive permitted use, at the direction of the Planning and Zoning Administrator.

At the June 17, 2025, regular meeting, the Planning Commission passed a motion recommending approval to City Council of the proposed text amendment that would alter the existing Sign provisions in Article 9. These changes are the result of discussions at three (3) work sessions in March, April, and May. Many of the proposed changes aim to address ambiguity, offer consistent terminology, and address text errors. There are also a number of substantive changes that were the result of experience with the administration of the Ordinance and discussion by the Planning Commission.

SECTION 9.01 Purpose and Intent

This Section is intended to protect and promote the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the City of Chelsea; to maintain and improve the appearance of the City; to conserve community character; to prevent traffic hazards; to provide safer conditions for pedestrians; and to promote economic development by regulating the construction, alteration, repair, maintenance, size, location, and number of signs in the community. These regulations are further intended to provide reasonable identification for businesses and other uses within the community, while protecting the First Amendment right to Freedom of Speech.

SECTION 9.02 Definitions

The following words and phrases shall have the meanings set forth in this article when they are used in this article:

- **A. Sign Types.** The following definitions apply to types of signs based on the characteristics of the sign without respect to the content of the message:
 - (1) **AIR-ACTIVATED SIGNS.** A sign that is inflated by air or uses air flow to induce movement. Inflatable objects used for signs are often made of flexible fabric and are equipped with a motor to blow air into the object. Air-activated signs are typically temporary and are restrained, attached, or held in place by a cord, rope, cable, or similar method, but can be permanent.
 - (2) ANIMATED SIGN. A sign that has any visible moving part either constantly or at intervals; flashing, scintillating, intermittent, or oscillating lights; visible mechanical movement of any description; or other apparent visible movement achieved by any means that move, change, flash, oscillate or visibly alters in appearance to depict action, create an image of a living creature or person, or create a special effect or scene. This definition does not include Changeable-Copy Signs and Electronic Message Signs that comply with this Article.



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(3) **AWNING SIGN.** A permanent sign painted, or screen printed on the exterior surface of an awning.



(4) **BANNER SIGN.** A temporary sign on paper, cloth, fabric or other flexible or combustible material of any kind that is attached flat against a permanent sign face or strung between two poles or structures.



- (5) **BENCH SIGN.** A sign applied to or affixed to the seat or back of a bench.
- (6) BILLBOARD SIGN. A large sign erected, maintained, and used for the purpose of displaying messages that can be seen from a long distance or read from a vehicle traveling at high speeds. A Billboard Sign differs from a Freestanding Sign based on its size. A Billboard Sign is 200 square feet or greater in size.



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(7) **CANOPY SIGN.** A permanent Projecting Sign affixed to the side or bottom surface(s) of an attached canopy.



- (8) **CHANGEABLE-COPY SIGN.** A permanent sign or portion thereof on which the copy or symbols change either automatically through electrical or electronic means or manually through placement of copy and symbols on a panel mounted in or on a track system.
- (9) **ELECTRONIC MESSAGE SIGN.** An electrically activated changeable-copy sign whose variable message and/or graphic presentation capability can be electronically programmed.



- (10) **FEATHER SIGN**. A type of sign designed to resemble a feather or teardrop shape.
- (11) **FESTOONS**. A string of ribbons, pennants, spinners, streamers, tinsel, small flags, or pinwheels, typically strung overhead and/or in loops.



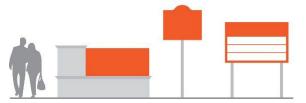
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(12) **FLAG.** A sign on paper, cloth, fabric or other flexible or combustible material of any kind that is attached to a permanent conforming pole. Flags are typically supported on one side of the sign. Flags are not considered air-activated signs for the purposes of this ordinance.



(13) **FREESTANDING SIGN.** A sign supported by one or more uprights, poles, pylons, monuments, or braces placed in the ground and not attached to any building or other structure. Freestanding signs include Monument Signs, but do not include Billboards.



- (14) INCIDENTAL SIGN. A small sign, usually two (2) square feet or less, designed and located to be viewed by persons on a property and are generally not visible or legible from the right-of- way or adjacent properties. Examples of incidental signs include, but are not limited to, credit card signs, signs indicating hours of business, no smoking signs, signs used to designate bathrooms, handicapped signs, traffic control signs that conform to the requirements of the Michigan Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices, and other signs providing information to be read at close proximity.
- (15) **INTERIOR SIGN**. A sign placed within a building but not including a Window Sign as defined by this Ordinance, that is not visible from any public street, sidewalk, alley, park or public property.

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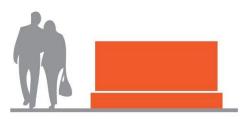

(16) **MARQUEE SIGN**. A type of projecting sign typically mounted perpendicular to the building façade in a vertical manner. Marquee Signs often include a changeable copy component in addition to the display of a permanent message but are not required to have changeable copy.



(17) **MONUMENT SIGN**. A base-mounted, freestanding sign placed on the ground and not attached to any building or other structure. A Monument Sign includes a solid supporting base of at least 24 inches in height and a width equal to or greater than the width of the sign face. Monument Signs are constructed of a decorative and durable material (e.g., masonry), and shall have no separations between the sign face and the base.



- (18) **NONCONFORMING SIGN**. A sign that was lawfully permitted at the time it was erected but is not permitted under current law.
- (19) PERMANENT SIGN. A sign constructed of durable materials intended to withstand prolonged exposure to exterior elements. Permanent signs are affixed to the ground or a structure by means of footings beneath the ground surface, bolts or screws into a structure, or other method intended to ensure the sign is displayed for an extended period of time with minimal maintenance or replacement of parts.
- (20) **PORTABLE SIGN**. A temporary sign designed to be easily movable. Portable Signs are typically held in place during the period of display by sandbags, blocks, or other easily movable anchor.

(21) **PROJECTING SIGN**. A sign attached to a building or other structure and extending beyond the attachment surface. A Projecting Sign is differentiated from a Wall Sign based on the distance the sign projects from the surface of the building.



- (22) **ROOF SIGN**. A sign that is erected, constructed, and maintained upon, against, or above the roof or parapet of a building or any portion thereof. A sign mounted upon a mansard fascia that does not project above the highest point of the roof or parapet is considered a Wall Sign.
- (23) **TEMPORARY SIGN**. A display sign, banner or other device constructed of cloth, canvas, fabric, plastic or other light temporary materials, with or without a structural frame, or any other sign intended for a limited period of display that is not permanently anchored to the ground or a building.
- (24) TRANSPORTED SIGN. A sign attached to or pulled by a vehicle that may be displayed or affixed to a movable object such as but not limited to a car, truck, trailer, or similar transportation device. A "Portable Sign" does not constitute a Vehicle Sign.



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ARTICLE 9. SIGNS



(25) **VEHICLE SIGN**. A sign, painted or otherwise, attached to an operable vehicle that is regularly used and moved, including signs on a truck trailer. A Vehicle Sign does not constitute a Transported Sign.



(26) **WALL SIGN**. A sign attached to painted on, inscribed, or otherwise set upon the exterior wall or surface of any building, no portion of which projects more than 18 inches from the wall and which does not project above the roof or parapet line. A Wall Sign shall also include a sign mounted upon a mansard fascia that does not project above the highest point of the roof or parapet. Any other sign upon, against, or above the roof or parapet of a building, or any portion thereof, is defined as a Roof Sign.



(27) **WINDOW SIGN**. A sign that is painted on or attached to a window or glass door that is intended to be viewed from the exterior, including signs located inside a building but visible primarily from the outside of the building. This definition shall not include temporary window art.



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(28) **YARD SIGN**. A small, temporary sign typically used for non-commercial purposes. Yard signs are characterized by a wire frame, non-durable message surface such as cardboard or paper, and are often inserted into a lawn with wire posts. Although variations exist to the materials of the frame and message board, a consistent physical characteristic is its temporary and disposable nature.

B. General Definitions.

ARTICLE 9. SIGNS

- (1) **ALTERATION**. Any change in size, shape, height, or type which changes the appearance of a sign or its structure, or a change in position, location, construction, or supporting structure of a sign.
- (2) **BUILDING FRONTAGE**. The length of the front (entry) portion of a building occupied by a single tenant, often facing a street fronting to the premises on which the tenants are located.
- (3) **HEIGHT, MAXIMUM**. Shall be measured from grade to the highest edge of the sign surface or its projecting structure.



- (4) **HEIGHT, MINIMUM**. Shall be measured from grade to the lowest edge of the sign surface or its projecting structure.
- (5) **LOT, ZONING**. A single tract of land, located within a single block, which at the time of filing for a sign permit is designated by its owner or developer as a tract to be used, developed or built upon as a unit, under single ownership or control.
- (6) **OWNER**. A person, firm, partnership, association, company, or corporation, or any other legal entity, and/or its legal successors, heirs, and assigns.
- (7) **PREMISES**. The contiguous land in the same ownership or control which is not divided by a public street.
- (8) SIGN. Any display or object which is primarily used to identify or display information or direct or attract attention by any means which is visible from any public street, sidewalk, alley, park, or public property and is otherwise located or set upon or in a building, structure or piece of land. The definition does not include goods displayed in a window.

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ARTICLE 9. SIGNS



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(9) **SIGN AREA**. The entire area within a circle, triangle, rectangle, oval, or other geometric shape enclosing the extreme limits of writing, representation, emblem or any figure of similar character, together with any frame or other material or element forming an integral part of the display or used to differentiate the sign form the background against which it is placed, excluding the necessary supports or uprights on which such sign is placed.

SECTION 9.03 Sign Design Standards in All Zoning Districts

- A. Construction Standards
 - (1) *General Requirements.* All signs shall be designed and constructed in a safe and stable manner in accordance with the adopted Building Code and Electrical Code that is applicable to construction within the city. All electrical wiring associated with a Freestanding Sign shall be installed underground.
 - (2) *Framework*. All signs shall be designed so that the supporting framework, other than the supporting poles on a Freestanding Sign, is contained within or behind the face of the sign or within the building to which it is attached to be totally screened from view.
- **B. Illumination.** Permanent signs may be internally or externally illuminated, except where prohibited in this Article, in accordance with the following standards. Temporary signs shall not be illuminated.
 - (1) *Non-Glare, Shielded Lighting.* Lights shall be steady, stationary, and shaded and/or shielded downward with light directed away from adjacent properties and streets.
 - (2) *Backlighting*. Signs with internal illumination shall have the lettering and graphics in a lighter color than the background to the maximum extent practical.
 - (3) Illumination Levels. Illumination levels shall not exceed 0.5 foot-candles at the property line, measured five (5) feet from the ground. Where adjacent to a residential property, illumination levels shall not exceed 0.1 foot-candles at the property line. For wall-mounted signs on buildings with zero setbacks or signs that lawfully project into the right-of-way, illumination levels shall not exceed 8 footcandles at the property line, measured facing up, 3 feet above the ground with the exception of permitted bare bulb lights.
 - (4) *Bare Bulb Illumination*. Illumination by bare bulbs or flames is prohibited, except that bare bulbs are permitted on theatre marquees, subject to the standards in Section 9.07 and Section 9.08.
- **C. Electronic Message Signs.** Electronic Message Signs may be permitted on monument signs, and billboards, and marquee signs in non-residential zoning districts, subject to the standards of this Section and the following regulations:
 - (1) *Frequency of Change*. Signs with the ability to change displays shall not change more frequently than one (1) time per one (1) minute. The display shall change instantaneously. Flashing, scrolling, fading, dissolving, oscillating, spinning, twirling, video display, or other types of motion are expressly prohibited.

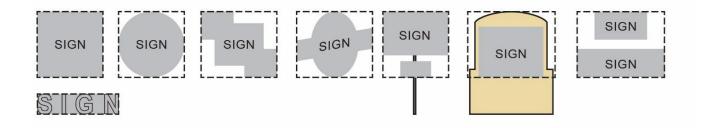


- (2) Internal Illumination. Electronic Message Signs shall not emit more than 0.3 foot-candles above ambient light levels at a distance of 50 feet from the sign face. Maximum luminance shall not exceed 0.1 foot-candles above ambient light levels at adjacent lot lines of residentially-zoned or residentiallyused lots.
- (3) *Integration into Sign*. The electronic changeable copy or electronic graphic display areas shall be part of the same sign face as any portion of the sign without electronic display technology and shall be integrated into the face of the sign.
- (4) *Number of Signs*. No more than one (1) Electronic Message Sign shall be located on a single property.
- (5) *Colors*. For Electronic Message Signs on monument signs and marquee signs, displayed messages shall be in monochrome text, and electronic display areas shall be black or similarly dark in color, as approved by the Planning and Zoning Administrator.
- (6) *Color Temperature*. The color temperature of electronic message sign lights shall not exceed 3,500 Kelvin.
- (7) Electronic Message Signs. Shall be programmed to go dark in the event of a malfunction.
- **D. Determination of Sign Area.** Signs shall not exceed the maximum sign area allowed for that type of sign and/or zoning district. The sign area shall be computed as outlined below.
 - (1) *Single-Faced Signs*. Sign area for single-faced signs shall be the square footage of the sign face as measured by enclosing the most protruding points or edges of the sign face within a parallelogram, rectangle, circle, or triangle, excluding any frame.
 - (2) *Double-Faced Signs.* Sign area for signs with multiple faces shall be the area of the largest of the sign faces, as described above, if all the faces are part of the same structure and are no more than 18 inches apart; otherwise, the sign area shall be the sum of all the areas of all the faces.
 - (3) The height of the sign shall be measured from grade. The maximum sign height shall be measured from grade to the top of the sign. The minimum height, if applicable, shall be measured from grade to the bottom of the sign.

E. Sign Location.

- (1) *Right-of-Way Prohibited.* No sign, except those established and maintained by the City, County, State, or Federal Governments shall be located in, project into, or overhang a public right-of-way or dedicated public easement, except as otherwise permitted in this Section.
- (2) *Clear Vision Triangle Area Prohibited.* No sign shall be in the clear vision triangle area described in **Section 6.05**.
- (3) Projections. Unless otherwise stated, no sign shall project beyond or overhang the wall or any permanent architectural feature (e.g., awning, canopy, or marquee) by more than 18 inches and shall not project above or beyond the highest point in the roof or parapet.
- (4) *Safety.* No sign shall be permitted at any location that, in the discretion of the Planning and Zoning Administrator, creates any type of safety hazard or visual impediment to pedestrian or vehicular traffic. In making this determination, Planning and Zoning Administrator shall cite any relevant provisions of this Ordinance or other City ordinances and findings or studies of the Chelsea Area Construction Agency, Washtenaw County Sheriff Department, and/or a traffic engineer.
- (5) *Landscaping.* The area surrounding signs shall be landscaped to match the design characteristics of the site. The landscaping shall be maintained such that the sign remains visible to passing motorists.

SECTION 9.04 Signs Exempt from Permits

The following signs shall be permitted in all zoning districts according to the regulations of this Ordinance and subject to the following provisions. No permit shall be required for signs enumerated below unless otherwise stated. Such exemptions, however, shall not be construed to relieve the owner of the sign from responsibility for its proper location, erection, maintenance, and removal.

- **A.** Address numbers, being essential for public safety and emergency response, with a numeral height no greater than six (6) inches for each dwelling unit and 18 inches for any other use, including multi-family buildings.
- **B.** Any lawful sign in a public or private right-of-way installed by an authorized public agency including, but not limited to, street signs and address signs.
- C. Flags, not to exceed 48 square feet.
- D. Historical markers and plaques up to 48 square feet.
- **E.** Incidental Signs, not to exceed two (2) square feet.
- F. Interior signs.
- **G.** Nameplates, not to exceed two (2) square feet.
- **H.** Private traffic control signs that conform to the requirements of the Michigan Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices.
- I. Signs on a City, County, State, or Federal building or land erected by the authorized public agency.
- J. Temporary signage in accordance with <u>Section 9.06</u>, <u>Section 9.07</u>, or <u>Section 9.08</u>, unless otherwise stated in this Zoning Ordinance.
- **K.** Vehicle Signs, where the vehicle on which the sign is displayed does not regularly go unoperated for a period exceeding seven (7) consecutive days.
- L. Window Signs, not to exceed 33 percent (33%) percent of the total window area of the façade facing a road. Window Signs must be placed in a manner to ensure visibility into the building for public safety.
- M. Yard Signs.
- **N.** Sign Maintenance and Message Change. No permit shall be required for ordinary servicing, repainting of existing sign message, or cleaning of a sign. No permit is required for change of message of a sign designed to allow for message change without a change of structure, such as a bulletin board or billboard. Structural changes to a sign frame or support shall require a permit.



SECTION 9.05 Prohibited Signs in All Zoning Districts

- A. Any sign not expressly permitted.
- **B.** Animated Signs (including revolving signs and rotating signs) and signs that incorporate moving features, except for changeable-copy signs explicitly permitted in this article.
- C. Festoons, except those approved in conjunction with a Temporary Zoning Compliance Permit or a Special Events Permit.
- **D.** Air-activated signs and balloon signs, except those approved in conjunction with a Temporary Zoning Compliance Permit or a Special Events Permit.
- E. Feather signs.
- **F.** Any sign that is deemed structurally or electrically unsafe by the Planning and Zoning Administrator.
- **G.** Signs attached to light poles, utility poles, street signpost, and trees. This shall not include signs lawfully installed by an authorized public entity.

SECTION 9.09 Nonconforming Signs

The continued use of legally nonconforming signs shall be permitted, shall be subject to the standards below. Such signs shall not be enlarged, expanded, or extended, with the intent that legally nonconforming signs shall eventually be eliminated or replaced upon their natural deterioration or destruction.

- **A. Structural Changes.** The faces, supports, or other parts of legally nonconforming signs shall not be structurally changed or enlarged unless the resulting changed, altered, substituted, or enlarged sign conforms to the standards of this Ordinance.
- **B. Destruction.** Legally nonconforming signs that have been destroyed or damaged by more than 50 percent (50%) of the replacement cost shall not be reconstructed except in conformity with the standards of this Ordinance.
- **C. Site Plan Review.** On any site on which a site plan is approved, all legal nonconforming signs shall be brought into compliance with the standards of this Ordinance.

SECTION 9.10 Sign Permit Process

- **A. Permit Required.** Unless otherwise exempted by this Article, it shall be unlawful for any person to erect, reerect, alter or relocate any sign without first obtaining a permit in accordance with the provisions set forth in this Article. A permit shall require the payment of a fee in accordance with the schedule adopted by resolution of the City Council. Any sign that makes use of electricity shall, in addition to a sign permit, require an electrical permit, regardless of size.
- **B. Applications.** Applications for sign permits shall be made on forms provided by the Planning and Zoning Administrator and shall contain the following information:
 - (1) *Application and Fee.* A signed and completed Sign Permit Application and fee in accordance with **Section 14.06**.
 - (2) Applicant Information. Name, address, and phone number of applicants.
 - (3) *Location*. Location of the building, structure, or lot on which the sign is to be attached or erected.
 - (4) *Zoning*. The zoning district in which the sign is to be located.
 - (5) *Position of Sign.* Position of the sign on the building, structure, or lot on which the sign is to be attached or erected. Position of the sign in relation to nearby buildings, structures, property lines, and rights-of-way, existing or proposed.

- (6) *Sign Specifications*. Two (2) copies of the plans and specifications and method of construction and attachment to the building or the ground.
- (7) Sign Erector Information. Name and address of the sign erector.
- (8) *Landscape Plan.* A landscaping plan for the area surrounding the sign base, if applicable.

C. Application Review

- (1) *Planning and Zoning Administrator Review*. The Planning and Zoning Administrator shall review the sign permit application for any sign proposed on a site or existing building where no other new construction is proposed or the only proposed construction is interior to the building.
- (2) *Issuance of Permit*. Following review and approval of a sign application by the Planning Commission or Planning and Zoning Administrator, the Planning and Zoning Administrator shall issue a sign permit.
- **D. Permit Expiration.** A sign permit shall become null and void if the work for which the permit was issued is not completed within six (6) months of the date of issue.
