


## GRANITE FALLS WASHINGTON GATEWAY TO THE MOUNTAIN LOOP

### **PUBLIC WORKS—NEWS AND UPDATES**

### **Projects**

The City completed the Frank Mason parking lot project. The project included paving, striping for parking stalls, landscaping and an entrance gate. One of the parking stalls is ADA compliant, with a loading zone. It was funded in part by Snohomish County.

The 2019 sidewalk improvement project is also complete. Additional parking was created along the 100 block of Cascade Avenue, and the 100 block of South Alder Avenue. Pedestrian safety was improved at the Alder Avenue/Stanley Street intersection, and connected sidewalk sections along West Stanley Street. These improvements in particular, were designed to improve safety for youth from the Granite Falls Middle School, Crossroads High School, and the Boys and Girls Club. We thank the Washington State Transportation Improvement Board for their portion of the funding.

At our Wastewater Treatment Plant, Award Construction finished the effluent piping project. This project replaced undersized piping on the discharge line, which improves hydraulic flows and eliminates potential system issues associated with high flows during the wet weather season.

He believes in giving back, and embraces the community spirit our town is known for. Recently, he organized a volunteer party of other employees to surprise City Clerk Darla Reese at home. The group power-washed her house, removed roof moss, washed windows, and mowed the lawn.

White adds, Darin's dedication and flexibility to the City over the last 17 years paints a vivid picture of a valued employee who takes pride in calling Granite Falls home.
