2019-2020 RESOLUTION NO. 6

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SODDY-DAISY, TENNESSEE,
AMENDING THE PERSONNEL RULES AND REGULATIONS, SECTION VI,
BENEFITS, SUBSECTION A, ANNUAL LEAVE/PAID TIME OFF.**

City Manager Cagle stated that currently the Personnel Policy allows a part-time employee to be eligible to earn vacation time. She said she was not sure when this section was changed. She stated this amendment will delete it.

Citizens Participation:

Curtis Cecil, 9619 Dayton Pike, requested approval from the Board to use the Veterans Park on July 31st from 7:00 p.m. to 12:00 a.m. to host a “Literacy Day” event. He said they are securing donations from local businesses to help with the costs. Mr. Cecil said they will be showing Harry Potter and the Sorcerer’s Stone. He said the event is to help kids transition from summer to the school year and get them excited about learning. Vice-Mayor Cothran made a motion to approve, seconded by Commissioner Lowe and the ayes were unanimous.

Nance Jo Ogozalek, 10707 Lovell Road, said one of the stop signs at the intersection of Depot Street and Durham Street is missing.

Allen Lowe, 11619 Holly Circle, stated he would like to open a “Bed & Breakfast” for fishermen on his property. He questioned if he could do this in an R-1 Zone. Mr. Lowe said that none of his neighbors were opposed. City Attorney Elliott said he will research what is allowed and prohibited. He said he will have an answer early next week.

City Manager Cagle requested permission to order playground equipment for the North Park from Gametime for a total cost of \$203,539.45. She said the City was awarded an LPRF Grant from TDEC to purchase playground equipment along with other upgrades to this park. City Manager Cagle stated Gametime is part of the U.S Communities Cooperative Buying Program. Commissioner Adams made a motion to approve, seconded by Vice-Mayor Cothran and the ayes were unanimous.

City Manager Cagle stated the City received bids for scene lighting for three of the fire department’s trucks. She said Fire Chief Mike Guffey recommends awarding the bid to NAFECO due to the familiarity with their work and products. Mayor Shipley recused himself

from voting due to a family member working for NAFECO. Commissioner Adams made a motion to award the bid to NAFECO, seconded by Commissioner Lowe and the ayes were unanimous.

City Manager Cagle requested approval to purchase a New Holland Boom Mower off Tennessee State Contract from Maury County Equipment Company for a total cost \$106,000. She stated this is a budgeted item. Vice-Mayor Cothran made a motion to approve, seconded by Commissioner Nunley and the ayes were unanimous.

City Manager Cagle requested approval to purchase two (2) Ford F-250 trucks off Tennessee State Contract from Lonnie Cobb Ford for a total cost of \$63,446. She said Public Works Director Steve Grant only put one truck in his budget, but would like to purchase two trucks. City Manager Cagle stated that originally the Public Works Director Grant budgeted \$180,000 to purchase a knuckle boom truck, but had to use part of the funds to purchase a backhoe. She said that he will still be under budget after purchasing the second truck. Commissioner Adams made a motion to approve, seconded by Vice-Mayor Cothran and the ayes were unanimous.

Vice-Mayor Cothran questioned if it were possible for Soddy-Daisy to be a Second Amendment Sanctuary City. City Attorney Elliott stated the City would need to pass a resolution. He said he will prepare one.

Mayor Shipley stated two of "our" great families are hurting and it's been a sad week. He asked Vice-Mayor Cothran to close the meeting with a prayer.
