2019-2020 RESOLUTION NO. 8

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SODDY-DAISY, TENNESSEE,
DECLARING THE CITY A SECOND AMENDMENT SANCTUARY MUNICIPALITY.**

City Attorney Elliott stated that Vice-Mayor Cothran asked him to draw up a Resolution in regard to declaring the City of Soddy-Daisy a Second Amendment Sanctuary. He explained that this Resolution recites fundamental rights of the citizens and confirms the right to keep and bear arms. He said it has no legal effect. Vice-Mayor Cothran stated that City Attorney Elliott did a fantastic job with this Resolution.

Citizens Participation:

Curtis Cecil, Kelcurt Media, said his organization teams up with the Tennessee Ecological Services every year. He stated that they have offered his organization to purchase 50 trees free of charge and Mr. Cecil said he would like to offer the trees to the City. Mr. Cecil said he just needs to know which kind the City would like. City Manager Cagle stated that the City has to do some mitigation through TDEC, therefore, she will check with them to see what types of trees the City is allowed to plant. Mr. Cecil stated he needs to know by tomorrow.

Mayor Shipley introduced Representative Patsy Hazlewood to the audience. Representative Hazlewood stated it was her pleasure to attend the commission meeting and to be able to announce that the City of Soddy-Daisy will be getting a new boat dock at Holly Park. She thanked the TWRA and Tony Sanders for providing the necessary funding. Representative Hazlewood said the expanded boat dock should be a good economic tool for the City in being able to host fishing tournaments. City Manager Cagle thanked Representative Hazlewood and stated that Representative Hazlewood had been working on obtaining this funding for a long time. City Manager Cagle thanked Tony Sanders as well.

City Manager Cagle said the City received bids to build the boat dock at Holly Park. She stated that there was only one bid and it was from Dock It, LLC. She requested for the bid to be

awarded to Dock It, LLC subject to receiving a contract from the TWRA and to authorize the Mayor to sign the contract once it is received. Commissioner Nunley made a motion approve the purchase and authorize the Mayor to sign the contract, seconded by Vice-Mayor Cothran and the ayes were unanimous.

Mayor Shipley stated that Representative Hazlewood has been a great Tennessee State Representative.

Commissioner Nunley thanked Representative Hazlewood and the TWRA for getting this funding. He said the owners of the bait & tackle stores have been asking for a while what they could do to help the City get a bigger and better dock to bring in more fisherman.

Commissioner Lowe thanked Representative Hazlewood and the TWRA as well.

Vice-Mayor Cothran thanked Representative Hazlewood and the TWRA as well. He stated that Commissioner Adams is currently attending a dinner in honor of him being one of the inductees into the Soddy-Daisy High School Hall of Fame. Vice-Mayor Cothran said he is a great man and he is glad to be his friend.

Mayor Shipley recognized the Soddy-Daisy High School students in the audience and thanked them for attending the meeting.
