2020-2021 ORDINANCE NO. 3

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SODDY-DAISY, TENNESSEE,
REZONING FROM R-2 URBAN RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT TO C-2 LOCAL BUSINESS
DISTRICT A TRACT OF LAND LOCATED AT 113 SWAFFORD ROAD.

City Manager Cagle stated that Priority Waste Services has petitioned the City to keep the residential pickup rate at \$8.16 per household due to the extraordinary amount of tonnage

being collected during the pandemic. Vice-Mayor Cothran made a motion to leave the rate at \$8.16 per pickup for July through December and revisit this issue in December, seconded by Commissioner Nunley and the ayes were unanimous.

City Manager Cagle stated the City received bids for the installation of playground equipment at the North Park. She said Copponex Group was the low bidder for a cost of \$53,750.00. Vice-Mayor Cothran made a motion to award the bid to Copponex Group, seconded by Commissioner Lowe and the ayes were unanimous.

City Manager Cagle said the fire department would like for the Board to surplus Engine 3, which is a 1991 Federal Motors Engine. She said they put one of the reserve engines in service. Vice-Mayor Cothran made a motion to surplus the engine, seconded by Commissioner Nunley and the ayes were unanimous.

City Manager Cagle requested approval to resurface White Drive, Bell Street, and a portion of East Highwater Road. Commissioner Nunley made a motion to approve, seconded by Vice-Mayor Cothran and the ayes were unanimous.

Mayor Shipley informed everyone that Hamilton County Mayor Jim Coppinger extended the mask requirement another 30 days. He stated he thought it was a good idea and the wearing of masks seems to be helping contain the spread of the coronavirus.

Mayor Shipley announced that Jim Coleman was in the audience and informed everyone that Mr. Coleman is running for City Commission.

City Manager Cagle asked if the Board was in favor of renting the Community Center again. It was the consensus of the Board to allow it. Mayor Shipley requested for it to be sanitized after each weekend going forward.

Vice-Mayor Cothran thanked Sean Sims, owner of Priority Waste Services, for doing a great job for the City. He said the service is still as good as it was five years ago when they were awarded the contract.
