## **Find the Reading Bug!**

You don't have to like bugs to get involved in the summer reading program. You can participate by simply visiting the library this summer. Beginning **Monday, June 2** you can pick up your Bug Notebook from any reference desk at any CMPL location. A bug puppet will be reading a book in different areas of the library over the course of the summer. Write down the book title in your bug book log each week. At the end



of the summer a random drawing of correct entries will determine a winner. The puppet will find a new location and a new book the weeks of **June 2, June 9, June 16, June 23, July 7, July 14, July 21** and

**July 28**. Please note that the puppet will be reading different books at each location. If you start playing the game at the North Branch, you will need to continue to play at the North Branch in order to complete the game with the correct answers.

Submit your completed log and you could be the winner of a great prize! Don't worry if you can't visit the library once a week. Just visit our web site and look for puzzles to help you find out what you missed. Solve the puzzle and you will get the title of the book you missed. This contest is open to children, teens and adults.



I am pleased to report that the library's Strategic Plan 2008-12 has been formally approved by the Library Board. This comprehensive report (available for review at the Adult Nonfiction Desk at the Main Library) will help guide the library over the next four years.

One of my favorite parts of the process was a very simple study we did for a one-month period. Every time a staff member had to tell a customer "no" in response to a request it was noted in a log. The requests were grouped together when possible and then tallied. Where feasible we have worked to change those "no" responses into "yes" responses and here are several examples:

• Do you have word processing at the North or South Branch? Yes.

- Do you have a fax machine for public use? Yes. We offer the ser-
- vice at the Library Store at the Main Library at this point.

• Can I pay my fines with a debit or credit card? Yes. This is being implemented online this spring and will be added at the self-checkout stations by fall.

• Do you circulate video games? Yes.

Do you have Bresser's? Yes. It is available at each branch's reference desk and the Adult Nonfiction Desk at the Main Library.
Do you offer computer classes? Yes. We have started personalized tutoring sessions with volunteers at the South Branch. Call 586-226-5073 for further information.

Sometimes we still have to say "no" or "maybe" and for a good reason:

• Can you tell me what is checked out on my family member's library card? Maybe. To comply with Michigan law you must have permission as an authorized user.

• Are you closing this library because of the county's budget cuts? No. The Clinton-Macomb Public Library is not part of the county government. We are a district library formed between Clinton Township and Macomb Township. Through thoughtful planning both municipalities chose to combine resources to benefit all residents with more efficient, consolidated services. The Library Board promised the voters two branches and a main library and is committed to offering three locations.

Thankfully, even after a month of tallying "no" responses we did not end up with a long list. Our goal is to be able to say "yes" whenever possible. Speaking of saying "yes," have you been to your local library recently? Do you have a library card? If not, stop by and visit us soon!

## Thank You to Donald Green

It is with a heavy heart and warm wishes that we bid farewell to current Library Board Trustee, and former Board President, Donald W. Green. Don has been on the Library Board of Trustees since 1996. "At my age," the 82-year-old Green commented, "it's a good time to retire so that younger people with new ideas can join

the Board. The library is in great shape, with an excellent director, a dedicated, well-trained staff and a Board of Trustees that functions well as a team. I plan to devote more time to my lifelong interests of researching and writing about state and local history."



Twelve years ago he hit the ground running in his belief that a first-class library system

could be established in Clinton and Macomb Townships. It was at Don's urging that the library moved out of a classroom and rented a storefront on Garfield. With this increased visibility, the Library Board was able to pass a millage to ensure the Library had the funds to expand.

As Board President he convinced the Board to build two branches and a Main Library. He was also instrumental in getting property donated for the Main Library. Don has been an essential voice in contacting donors, creating policies and being an advocate on behalf of the library. When the Library Board needed additional trustees Don recruited new trustees that had experience in the banking, legal, investment, educational and library fields. His connections to the local politicos, service clubs, educational and accounting community and other library trustees in the state and county benefited the Library immensely.

Aside from libraries, Don's other passion is local history. In 2005, the Main Library dedicated the Local History Room to Don for his efforts on behalf of the library.

In 2003, as the Main Library was being built, Don told associates that he wanted people to enter the Main Library and say "Wow." Looking back at Don's accomplishments over the past 12 years, we can only marvel and say "Wow." We would like to thank Don Green for all the time, effort and love he has dedicated to the Clinton-Macomb Public Library. We wish him well and he will be missed.

## Homework Help in Time for Exams

Students-don't forget about Homework Help! Just in time for final exams, CMPL offers Live Homework Help to students in grades 4-12. The service, accessible through the library's web site, is available to stu-

dents in Clinton and Macomb Townships who have a valid library card.



Students chat one-on-one with a tutor who explains a

concept, principle or problem to the student. Students will not be given a direct answer to the homework, but they will be given tools and resources online to help them find solutions on their own. Students can log on from 3 p.m. to 10 p.m., seven days a week. Simple instructions direct students to connect with a grade appropriate subject specialist who will assist them. Each session lasts up to 20 minutes and the student can print the chat session afterwards.

Live Homework Help is a special resource to which CMPL subscribes. CMPL is one of only 13 Michigan libraries to subscribe to this innovative tutoring service. Monthly, over 400 tutors and librarians work to help over 40,000 students from across the country.

Dan Burns is a column writer for a local newspaper who goes to a family reunion on the Jersey shore where he meets a woman that catches his eye. He then tries desperately not to fall in love with her while not breaking rules he has set up for himself and his daughters in this romantic comedy. *Rated PG-13, 98 minutes.* 




## **Be a Reading Bug this Summer!**


