

# Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped at CMPL

CMPL is pleased to announce that the Main Library is the new home of the Macomb County Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped. The library will be housed in the space formerly occupied by the Library Gift Store. The Main Library already offered large type materials, low-vision aids and a computer equipped with JAWS software, but now we have materials to offer through the mail for those with visual impairments.

The Macomb Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped at CMPL will officially open in 2012 and will be dedicated on Monday, February 6. The room where the materials will be housed will also be dedicated in honor of a former CMPL Trustee. Peg Lamont was the founding director of the Macomb Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped as well as a founding member of the Board of Trustees at CMPL. # From the Director...

"Access" stands at the top of the list of the American Library Association's statement of core values for librarianship. Specifically it reads, "All information resources that are provided directly or indirectly by the

library, regardless of technology, format, or methods of delivery, should be readily, equally, and equitably accessible to all library users." This includes people with disabilities, which is a group that a member of society can become a part of at any time as a result of injury or disease.

Last spring we were approached by Macomb County with an interesting proposition. As the county is continuing to find ways to downsize and CMPL is always seeking ways to better serve the community and innovative ways to maximize efficiency, we were asked to consider taking over the services for the Macomb Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped (MLBPH). After an extensive analysis and review by the CMPL Board, it became clear that this would be a perfect match and a win-win situation! Below are several of the benefits of CMPL providing this valuable service:

- Secures the future of the MLBPH for the next 10 years because of the contract negotiated between Macomb County and CMPL.
- Increases MLBPH service hours by 80% to the same as CMPL's including evenings and weekends.
- Raises awareness of the service by leveraging CMPL's strong marketing capabilities and close partnerships with the other public libraries in Macomb County.
- Demonstrates CMPL's commitment to equal access to library resources for every member of the community through actions and not just words.
- Offers a modern, fully ADA-compliant facility with convenient customer drop-off at the front door.

 Offers convenient, one-stop "shopping" for families who have a member with a disability.

- Increases the awareness of and skill level in serving customers with disabilities across the entire CMPL staff and volunteer team.
- Allows current library customers to continue to be served by CMPL should they ever need the services due to a disability caused by injury or disease.
- Builds on Clinton and Macomb Township's forward-thinking model of shared, consolidated municipal public library service. Covers some of CMPL's managerial and administrative overhead costs especially during a financially difficult time.

CMPL's Board made sure that the agreement was cost neutral since CMPL is funded by the taxpayers of Clinton Township and Macomb Township and not Macomb County. The new MLBPH@CMPL will open on January 17 and will be officially dedicated on February 6 at 10 a.m. Current MLBPH customers will be pleased to know that Anne Mandel has been hired by CMPL and promoted to serve as the new sub-regional librarian.

Unfortunately choices had to be made when finding a space to relocate the MLBPH @ CMPL. In the end the decision was made to repurpose the Library Store. Although the store never lost money, it did not bring in as much profit as originally hoped. Many of the store's services will continue to be offered. Faxing is now available all hours the library is open at the Adult Nonfiction Desk. Used books will be sold in the Used Book Nook located off of the café. CD, DVD and videogame repair is available at the Information Desk. Last, many of our wonderful store volunteers, many who have served since the opening of the store, have agreed to help out with the Used Book Nook and with the new MLBPH. We are tremendously appreciative of the time and talent they have given and will continue to give to the community through their service for the library.

We are looking forward to welcoming MLBPH's customers to CMPL as well as current customers of the library interested in learning more about these very special library services.

#### **Online Resources Uncovered**

#### **NoveList Select**

CMPL has added a catalog enrichment component that delivers high quality content from its already existing database and reader's advisory resource, NoveList.

NoveList Select is an enhanced database that is embedded directly into CMPL's online catalog providing reading recommendations where they are most

easy to find—right next to the title of a book. Locate a title in the catalog, click on the 'reviews and more' tab—you will then see a



list of links to reading recommendations; author read-alikes; title recommendations; series information; summaries and book reviews. In many cases, it will provide award information, book discussion guides and featured articles.

NoveList Select integrates Novelist content right to our catalog: each recommendation is a live link to the library catalog allowing users to discover new books that meet their needs and that are sitting on their library's shelves. The rationale for each recommendation is displayed providing information that allows users to understand why a particular title is being suggested. NoveList Select will help avoid the dead-end searches that occur when all copies of a book are checked out because it can provide readers with additional options for what to read next. NoveList Select will take you beyond the one book you were looking for, back into the virtual stacks where you can discover the full depth and breadth of CMPL's collection.




#### **Life Size Board Games**
