CMPL has partnered with other Suburban Library Cooperative libraries to purchase Zinio. Zinio allows you to check out magazines to read on your tablet or smartphone. We'll have over 90 magazines available!

We've added another eBook option for CMPL patrons. 3M is a great option because you can download books directly from the catalog. The eBooks you've checked out will also appear in your CMPL account.

South Branch Closing and Reopening

North Branch Conference Rooms

Conference rooms can be reserved in advance by a nonprofit group with a resident library card. If conference rooms are not reserved, they are available for study by individuals or small groups on a first-come,

first-served basis. Starting in January, priority will be given to groups wishing to use a conference room. An individual using a conference room may be asked to leave the room in order to accommodate a group. This policy is already in place at the Main Library.





From the Director...

The Library is moving forward with a full agenda for 2014. This year will be a momentous year in CMPL's history! In addition to great new books, CDs, DVDs and other items for our collections we will:

- Open the New permanent South Branch Library
- Significantly expand our digital (downloadable books/music/video) services
- Request a temporary increase in the Library millage

We are mindful that many of you love the Library as a physical space where neighbors meet, students study together and children build a passion for reading. Our new South Branch reflects our commitment to providing our trademark excellent and accessible facilities within easy reach of all customers. Our new South Branch will offer a robust collection, ample parking, meeting room space, drive-up pickup and return, computers/Wi-Fi/power outlets, and enhanced shelving for collections. Opening soon!

You can count on CMPL being "out front" in utilizing new technology as it is developed to better meet the evolving needs and expectations of our community and customers. In this issue of Library Matters you will find our increased investment in the digital environment with 3M's easy-to-use ebook platform, Zinio digital magazines and Freegal music downloads. Please visit our website soon to explore these new services at www.cmpl.org.

You may know the recession has taken a toll on Library finances. The Library Board has been anticipating this funding challenge and considering solutions for several years. Property taxes make up over 85% of the Library's budget and have dropped by 20% or \$1.1M since 2009. Another \$550K has been eliminated by the Headlee Amendment. The Board has strategically reduced expenses and leveraged our Library fund balance to avoid major cuts to services during this economic downturn. However, the funding gap must now be closed. It will be up to voters to determine if this will happen through additional funding or further reductions in services. The temporary millage request was expected long before the purchase of the new South Branch. We will be providing more details about this proposal in an upcoming edition of the newsletter so residents may make an informed decision.

Online Databases Uncovered Pronunciator

CMPL is excited to announce that Pronunciator has been selected as the new language learning database for CMPL! It is the world's largest language learning program specifically designed for K-12 and is committed to serving libraries. Pronunciator allows you

to learn any of 80 languages taught in any of 50 languages: for example, Spanish speakers can learn Japanese; Russian speakers can learn English; Mandarin speakers can learn Portu-



guese...PLUS, there is ESL (English as a Second Language) instruction for speakers of 50 non-English languages.

There is a very user-friendly interface with attention to pronunciation analysis, conversation, grammar, culture and business insights, phrasebooks, full spectrum testing and tracking of individual progress.

You can stream or download lessons for remote learning. You can download and print phrasebooks with phonetic pronunciation. You can record your voice to compare it with proper pronunciation, and if you leave the site and return, it picks up where you left off.

There is even Pronunciator for iPad which is identical to the web version with all its content and same features. The app is available for download to residents of Clinton Township & Macomb Township. Pronunciator apps have the same functionality as the web-based version of the database. Your progress is automatically synced between devices allowing you to go from laptop to mobile phone to tablet without missing a beat!

Listen, Learn, & Live Preview: Exploring Other Cultures and Faith Traditions


