ConnectED Challenge

By now you may have heard that CMPL has accepted a challenge from the White House to get every child in our service area a library card. Starting September 8, students in all grades within Chippewa Valley Schools will have access to free eBooks, online tutoring help, and other resources that will give them a leg up in school!

The ConnectED challenge encourages libraries to collaborate with elected officials, school leaders, and school librarians, to create or strengthen partnerships so that every child enrolled in school has a public library card. CMPL was selected as just one of 30 libraries in the nation to participate in the ConnectED challenge by the White House!

Initial library access will be virtual and students will be able to access our collection of databases, homework help, eBooks, music and more from home. To have access to the physical collection and be able to check out materials, parents will need to come to the library to upgrade the card.

From the Director ...

I still remember getting my very first library card from the Avon Township Public Library in downtown Rochester many moons ago. The clerk at the desk typed my name on heavy yellow card stock and it became my passport to the largest collection of Hardy Boy books I could ever imagine. Having the card taught me many other lessons for later in life applicable far beyond the public library. I learned to keep the card in a safe place. I learned that it was a piece of identification that I needed to have with me when I went to the library. I learned the concept of borrowing things, keeping them in good condition, and then returning them when

I was done. I learned that if I didn't keep my promise to do something (e.g., return them on time) that there may be a small penalty to pay to make amends. As time went on that card was my key to getting books for school reports and access to materials to do other homework assignments.

Today having a library card is even more critical than ever. While traditional access to books and other materials is important, a CMPL card gives access to resources unimaginable back when I was in school. Today the library offers Tutor.com, a service that provides a free, 20-minute tutoring session on a variety of subjects connecting a student to a qualified tutor between 4 p.m. and 11 p.m. whether at home, in the library or from a smart phone at a soccer game. Ebooks, online encyclopedias, test prep tools, foreign language applications and many other things NOT available through a Google search are also key resources the library pays for and provides at no charge to CMPL resident cardholders.

Unfortunately, a rough estimate shows that of the 32,000 residents under the age of 18 in the library's service area only about 20,000 have library cards (62%). While some of this may be attributed to families that prefer to have a single card that is shared by the family, it is an indicator that there is work to be done. Further, the Pew Research Center recently released a whitepaper identifying a "homework gap" of school age children who do not/cannot afford broadband in the home—almost 20%. Of that number 31.4% of homes with incomes under \$50,000 did not have broadband and even those over \$50,000 had a rate of 8.2%. Locally, our biannual community survey with over 3,600 residents responding indicated that 12% of them were using the library's computers because they could not afford broadband at home.

Last spring I received an unexpected email message from the White House Domestic Policy staff inviting the Clinton-Macomb Public Library to be one of just 30 libraries nationally to participate in the ConnectED Library Challenge with the goal of securing public library access to every student in our service area. So along with Boston, Chicago, Denver, San Francisco, Seattle and others CMPL is looking to partner with our local school districts to ensure that every child has basic library access to our electronic resources and Internet access/WiFi in the library by the end of the school year (parents who do not wish to have their child participate will be given the opportunity to opt out in advance). CMPL was the first of the 30 communities to secure the pledges needed by the library board, township superintendents and school superindents. Needless to say the level of cooperation and support between multiple municipal entities in our community is extremely high and will be a shining example of what can be done nationally in the future.

While it is fine to wait for our program to be rolled out, if you or your child do not currently have a library card, I strongly encourage you to get one today. Photo ID and current proof of address is all that is needed (please note if you live in the Mount Clemens School District your home library is Mount Clemens and you need to obtain your card there). A full library card not only will get you access to everything mentioned previously it will provide access to group study rooms and a collection of books and other items nearing 400,000 to choose from. If your card has been blocked because of past fines owed, please talk to a staff member and if at all possible we will work with you to get your account back in good standing. We look forward to serving you and your family in the near future.
