One of my favorite presentations by an elected official was a "state of Macomb Township address" by the Friends of CMPL's very own Janet Dunn. She not only dedicates her time serving as the township

supervisor, she has been the Friends' Board Secretary for as long as I can remember. Her presentation focused around a theme of, "Did you know.....?"

While many of you are "smarter than the average bear" about the library and its services, I wonder how many of these following "gems" you were aware of and use? Many are new, so don't be too hard on yourself if you are slightly less informed than you may have thought!

Storytime-to-Go Kits – This concept was created by Lisa Mulvenna, Head of Youth/Young Adult Serices. Our professional librarians gather books, finger puppets, rhymes and more around a theme and pack them in a convenient bag for checkout. These kits encourage family members to read to and interact with their kids and grandkids, a wonderful way to have fun while helping youngsters become ready to read on their own.

Gale Courses – Want to take a class on digitial photography, learning Excel, or preparing to become a veterinary technician? What if I mentioned it was six weeks, online with a real instructor, and free of charge through the library? Sign up for as many as your brain can handle through the library's website (www.cmpl.org). It's never to early or late to learn!

In the Queue – What if you didn't have to think about the next book that comes out by your favorite author? Complete a brief form and we will sign you up automatically for a copy of the latest book by many popular authors. Even better, knowing your favorite authors helps us to anticipate demand and better judge how many copies to buy. Thanks to the additional millage funding we received from the community last summer we are now better able to keep up with demand and shorten waiting times.

Ancestry.com – We have received numerous requests for this product over the years, and while it is not affordable for us to be able to offer access to you from home, "yes" we now have it available in the library on all of our public computers. While you are researching those ancient ancestors, don't forget to preserve your own more recent history with our digitization equipment in the Donald W. Green Local History Room at the Main Library. We have a 35mm slide digitizer, high speed photo scanner and VHS to DVD converter.

Book Club Kits – "Storytime" isn't just for kids. If you've got a book club consider checking out a kit which includes multiple copies of books and discussion questions for your group. Kits are available at the Main Library in the Popular Materials Department and check out for six weeks.

Blu-Ray – Into a high definition movie experience? We've just started adding items in this format to the collection. You can even do an advanced catalog search to limit by this format and see what's available.

Human beings – While I'm sure you all know we have many wonderful people here at the library, please remember we are here to serve you. In this day of "everything online" let a human get to know you better. Sure we have a lot of electronics at our fingertips, too, but a good old "reference interview" is a joy for us to help you discover a new author, new book, great movie or online resource that helps you with whatever challenge or question you may have. We also love watching your family members grow up and help them along the way, whether it's a bedtime picture book or a research paper.

I hope that you now know at least one new thing about the library! And if some of this is not of interest to you, please refer a friend or neighbor who may benefit from you asking them, "Did you know...." about the library. We look forward to serving you and your family in the near future.




