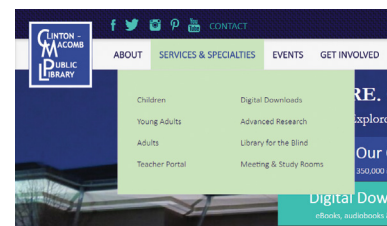

Secrets of the New CMPL.org

Have you discovered the search slider on the new website yet? If not, here are some quick tips. The search slider defaults to searching the CMPL catalog. Over 400,000 items will be searched when you use this search box. Are you looking for an electronic item? Simply click Digital Downloads and the slider will open up links to OverDrive, Zinio, Freegal and hoopla. Are you doing research? If you know the name of the database you want to search, simply click Research on the slider and it will open up to a search box for all MeL databases and a drop-down menu with a full list of all the databases we own.



Looking for information for a specific demographic? Navigate to Services & Specialties in the top menu and find library information based on category. Need a list of databases by subject? Click on Advanced Research for a list of databases by subject category. Happy browsing!

FROM the DIRECTOR...

Perhaps one of the most famous modern movie lines is, “If you build it, he will come” from *Field of Dreams*. This line can clearly be applied to the Clinton-Macomb Public Library! Our three buildings handily log over 50,000 visits every month. Our new South Branch Library often records more computer sessions than the Main Library, 4,000-5,000 a month. The reasons people come to the library is as infinite as the wide variety of people from our service area of over 170,000 people. In fact, when I need a brief break from working at my computer, one of my favorite things to do is watch out the window of my office to see the never ending stream of members of the community in every combination walking towards the front entrance of the Main Library.

Yet with all of this traffic coming to the library, there are many people who cannot get here or do not think about coming to the library. For these residents we are making increasing strides to take the library out into the community. A new function in our checkout system now allows us to take the library on the road. We have even tried a “pop-up” library in partnership with the Macomb Township Parks & Recreation Department. We can issue cards, fix account problems and check out items anywhere we can get an Internet connection.



Another program that has been underway is better partnering with our local schools. CMPL is a large library district covering 62 square miles. We encompass all of Chippewa Valley and Clintondale as well as parts of Fraser, L'Anse Creuse, New Haven, and Utica in addition to private schools and home schoolers. In all there are nearly 50 buildings to cover. As one of the 30 initial public libraries in the country selected by the White House to participate in the ConnectED Library Challenge, we have added 10,000 students for electronic access since last September, with 1,000 of those students upgrading to a full access library card. But getting a student access is just the start. Educating people on the importance of being critical consumers of information is key for success in the digital age. The Library Board has been very supportive of ensuring that our policies are education friendly, so not only do students have access to a full range of resources, but every teacher in the classroom has the same access.



We are also working to better serve people who are confronted with physical challenges of getting to the library whether through a lack of transportation or other disability. The library has now started to reach out to senior centers located in our service area, starting mini-library collections of popular titles. And last but not least, it's always important to keep in mind that CMPL has the proud distinction of hosting the Macomb Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped. This service, funded by the Library of Congress, the State of Michigan and Macomb County, is available to people no longer able to read standard print due to a disability. Options include digital audiobooks and large print by mail. Please call (586) 286-1580 for further information.

If you are one of the few people left in the community who has just driven by the library but never thought to see what's available, I hope you will make a point of dropping by this summer! You will find lots of books, as is to be expected, but much, much more. We have over 400,000 items to choose from but also a variety of other services you may not expect. Some people find the library to be a pleasant escape from home or the office. We look forward to serving you and your family in the library or out in the community soon!
