



**CITY COUNCIL MEETING
JUNE 9, 2020
MINUTES**

Mayor Jarrod Ogden brought to order at 6:30 p.m. the first regular meeting of the Craig City Council for the month of June 2020. Councilman Bohrer moved with a second by Councilman James to approve the minutes from the May 26, 2020 meeting. Ayes: 7. Nays: 0. Motion carried.
