RE: Award Recommendation City of Craig, CO; Sludge Handling Improvements (Phase 1)

Dear Peter and City Council,

The City received four bids, on July 11, 2020, for Phase 1 of the sludge handling improvements project. SGM and the City performed through evaluations of the two lowest cost bids, from RCD and Duran & Pearce. Review of contractor provided information and interviews with both bidders were conducted. To aid in award recommendation, a bid comparison matrix was generated and is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

For reference, the bid tabulation with total prices ranging from \$566K to \$1.27M is attached hereto as Exhibit B.

The two lowest bids were reviewed for completeness. Both bidders submitted all required information. Additional qualifications, including relevant projects, proposed schedules, subcontractor list, and references were requested from the two lowest bidders. The submitted qualification packets are attached as Exhibit C.

City staff worked with SGM to review the qualification submittals. Both bidders submitted information demonstrating compliance with the minimum project experience requirements.

The project references provided by the low bidder, RCD construction, were contacted. The low bidder provided two project references. SGM was able to contact one of the two, who offered positive endorsements for the low bidder. Additionally, SGM contacted the Town Manager of a community where RCD performed a large project, and again received a positive referral for the bidder. The City Staff has worked extensively with the second lowest bidder, Duran and Pearce, and provided positive referrals for them.

SGM has also reviewed the two lowest bidders proposed subcontractor lists. SGM takes no exception to the firms listed on either submittal.

SGM and City Staff, directly interviewed the lowest two bidders via conference calls. From these conversations and provided qualifications SGM and City Staff developed a bid comparison matrix for City Council to assess the bids. The comparison matrix attached as Exhibit A,

includes not only pricing, but documents other project considerations that should weigh into contractor selection.

SGM finds that either contractor is qualified. Review of information and interview with Duran clearly demonstrates a high understanding of the project with ample similar experience. Review of information and interview with RCD indicates a good understanding of the project, a degree of relevant experience and that by all accounts they can probably do the job. The City's choice is between lower cost bid from a contractor based in Hayden, CO and a qualified in-town contractor. Both have merits. SGM will support award to either contractor and will work closely with the successful bidder to help foster a successful project. SGM respects the power of City Council to review the attached documents and make a final decision about bid award.

Steamboat Lake Lagoons

At Steamboat Lake and Stagecoach lake we were able to take on a great project. At each lake there are ponds for wastewater where we were assigned to clean and replace the liner at the bottom of each pond (a total of 5 ponds were completed). This took quite a bit of multitasking and it was imperative that we kept on schedule due to having so many jobs to do. We had to coordinate with surveyors, dredgers, liner crew and many other groups of people to ensure that each pond was completed on time and in a safe manner. Our method was to start with one and follow a very detailed schedule so that once we moved on to the next pond others were able to do their part on the first pond. We continued this process till the end and were successful at coordination between all sub-contractors and parks staff.

Some of the duties completed for the Steamboat Lake/Stagecoach Lake Lagoon Liner Project are as follows:

Clarifications

- 1. Sign-in sheet from mandatory Pre-bid meeting conducted at the WWTF site attached.
- 2. Substantial completion of project is set for October 15, 2020.
- 3. The September 1st constraint for beginning of work in section 1b, has been removed.
- 4. The contractor is responsible for sludge removal while the pipeline is inoperable. The contractor can haul the sludge, dewater on site, or install a temporary pipeline, see clarification note 14 below.
- 5. The existing 4" sludge line can be removed or abandoned in place as installation of new 6" line necessitates.
- 6. The Moffat County Landfill will accept, at no cost to the contractor, removed portions of the existing 4" PVC sludge Line with no dirt or debris in the pipe, residue is acceptable.
- New pipe can be open cut or bored at the contractor's preference, in locations that allow boring; not all segments are suitable for boring.
- 8. The City will flush the existing sludge line for contractor.
- 9. The work segment on the ox-bow, between the river and the railroad, shall be bedded using excavated onsite materials, appropriately screened if necessary, to exclude materials larger than 2". The remainder of the project shall be bedded as specified. The City acknowledges that areas of the project may have suitable native materials. City will consider approval of native materials in lieu of import on a case-by-case basis. Any use native material outside of ox-bow segment must be approved by City.
- 10. The City has specified that the contractor will be able to stage equipment and materials on the Waste Water Treatment Facility property, any construction easement, and county ground where the alignment passes. All disturbed areas will have to be repaired by the contractor.
- 11. Excess fill must be removed from the site at the contractor's expense.
- 12. Topsoil can only be stripped to facilitate the excavation of open cut for pipe placement. Topsoil to be returned to match existing profile depths.
