

COUNCIL MEETING JULY 25, 2023 MINUTES

Mayor Derek Duran brought to order at 6:30 p.m. the second regular meeting of the Craig City Council for the month of July 2023. In addition to Mayor Duran, those present were Councilmembers Chris Nichols, Vicki Huyser, Jesse James Jackson, Randy Looper, Paul James and Tom Kleinschnitz. Staff present were City Manager Peter Brixius, City Attorney Heather Cannon, Finance Director Katy Burns, Road & Bridge/Solid Waste Director Shane Baker, Police Chief Michael Cochran, Water and Wastewater Director Carl Ray, Building Official Marlin Eckhoff and City Clerk Liz White.
