

CITY COUNCIL MEETING NOVEMBER 14, 2023

Mayor Derek Duran brought to order at 6:30 p.m. the first regular meeting of the Craig City Council for the month of November 2023. In addition to Mayor Duran, those present were Councilmembers Chris Nichols, Vicki Huyser, Jesse James Jackson, Randy Looper, and Tom Kleinschnitz. City Manager Executive Assistant, Melanie Kilpatrick, and Shane Sigle with Riverwise Engineering, presented to council via Zoom the EDA Award # 05-79-06111 Yampa River Corridor Project construction bid per the recommendation of Riverwise Engineering for Schedules A, B, C, and D in the amount of \$3,275,504.80, contingent upon EDA's approval. After further discussion, Councilman Looper moved with a second by Councilman Nichols to approve all 4 schedules of the Riverwise Engineering bids with schedule A to Diggin It River Works in the amount of \$1,998,700.00 contingent upon EDA approval, and awarding schedule B, C & D to Anson Excavating in the amount \$476,848.00.
