Re: Alice Pleasant Park Improvements

Craig's core downtown area is actively being reenergized through completed infrastructure improvements that have been strategically implemented over the past 4 years. Alice Pleasant Park is a key component to the downtown area--- it is the heart of downtown Craig and a vital connectivity point. While community activity and park reservations have significantly increased at the Alice Pleasant Park location, the existing park infrastructure and amenities fail to serve the current needs and interests of our community and downtown. The City has prioritized Alice Pleasant Park downtown improvements due to alignment with multiple infrastructure objectives/strategies/goals aimed to better reinforce and enhance the economic vitality of downtown Craig.

In 2022, the City of Craig retained Ayres & Associates to assist in redesigning the area to be a more purposeful amenity for the community and downtown events. The consultants received feedback from the community, downtown business owners and staff and infused that into the design process. The result of the design process encompasses community needs and offers an improved park area that maximizes programmable space for the community and downtown events.

The anticipated 2024 budget amount for the project was \$360,000 in grant funding and \$240,000 from the City of Craig for a total project budget of \$600,000. This Fall, City staff submitted a \$300,000 funding request for the Alice Pleasant Park Improvements Project to the Gates Family Foundation. Additionally, the Kiwanis Club of Craig was encouraged by the potential park renovations and has committed a letter of intent to the proposed project in the

amount of \$10,000. The funding decision from the Gates Family Foundation was received in late December, officially awarding \$20,000 towards the project and of which a check has already been received.

In an effort to advance the Alice Pleasant Park Improvements project, an updated estimated costs and funding mechanism snapshot has been provided. The grant funding sought and awarded will not cover the entirety of the anticipated project cost, prompting the revised funding breakdown. I propose that the North Park playground and purchase of a Park's maintenance vehicle utility box be postponed until 2025. Monies would be reallocated towards the larger capital project of Alice Pleasant Park which is sure to make a significant impact within the community.

Upon your review of this updated project information, the remaining balance of \$66,650 is needed to complete the project in full. Therefore, I ask City Council for consideration and approval to proceed with completing the Alice Pleasant Park Improvements Project in full for 2024.

\$20,000 – Postpone utility box on park maintenance vehicle until 2025. Reallocate funding to Alice Pleasant Park Improvements.

\$20,000 - Gates Family Foundation - Grant Award

\$10,000 - Letter of Commitment from Kiwanis Club of Craig

\$100,000 - Conservation Trust Fund (POTENTIAL)

Total =\$521,250

Anticipated Expenses:

\$582,000 -Estimated Engineered Opinion of Probable Costs (EOPC) for project.

\$5,900 -Construction Administration (Ayres)

Total Cost - \$587,900

Remaining Difference to Offset-\$66,650




SITE NOTES

- 1. ALL DIMENSIONS SHALL BE FIELD VERIFIED BY CONTRACTOR PRIOR TO CONSTRUCTION. ANY DEVIATION FROM THESE PLANS MUST BE APPROVED BY LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT PRIOR TO CONSTRUCTION.
- 2. PRIOR TO EXCAVATION, UNDERGROUND UTILITIES MUST BE FIELD VERIFIED.
- 3. SEE CIVIL FOR ADDITIONAL CONTROL POINTS, MONUMENTS, BENCHMARKS, AND HORIZONTAL CONTROL.
- 4. ALL CONTROL JOINTS SHALL BE SAWCUT AND SPACED AS INDICATED ON THE PLANS AND DETAILS, EXPANSION JOINTS SHALL BE PLACED AS INDICATED ON THE DRAWINGS AND DETAILS OR EVERY 60' ALONG CONCRETE PAVING. CONTRACTOR SHALL LAYOUT ALL CONTROL JOINTS AND EXPANSION JOINTS IN THE FIELD FOR APPROVAL BY THE LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT.
- 5. INSTALL 1/2" EXPANSION JOINT MATERIAL AT ALL VERTICAL INTERSECTIONS BETWEEN NEW AND EXISTING CONCRETE AND BETWEEN NEW CONCRETE AND BUILDINGS, WALLS OR CURBS, UTILITY AND OTHER FIXED STRUCTURES.
- 6. LAYOUT WALKS AND SCORE JOINTS PER PLANS, DETAILS & SPECIFICATIONS. DO NOT DEVIATE FROM PLANS UNLESS SPECIFIC APPROVAL IS OBTAINED FROM THE LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT.
- 7. ALL SITE IMPROVEMENTS MUST BE FIELD SURVEYED AND STAKED BY CONTRACTOR. LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT SHALL APPROVE STAKED LOCATION OF IMPROVEMENTS PRIOR TO INSTALLATION.
- 8. LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT SHALL APPROVE FINAL STAKING BY CONTRACTOR OF ALL CONCRETE PAVING, AND CURBS PRIOR TO CONSTRUCTION AND ALL FORM WORK PRIOR TO POURING.
- 9. ADDITIONAL LAYOUT INFORMATION WILL BE PROVIDED TO THE CONTRACTOR PRIOR TO CONSTRUCTION, AS NECESSARY. LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT WILL PROVIDE DIGITAL FILES OF THE SITE PLAN IN AUTOCAD. ALLOW 72 HOURS AFTER REQUEST FOR DELIVERY OF FILES.








