RE: Award Bid for Alice Pleasant Park Improvements

Alice Pleasant Park is a major component of the downtown area in Craig. It provides necessary green space for the downtown corridor and serves as a vital connectivity point. With community events and park reservations increasing, the existing infrastructure and site amenities no longer serve community needs. The City has prioritized Alice Park Improvements in an effort to align with numerous enhancements of the downtown area in promotion, economic vitality and attracting people to the downtown corridor.

Competive bids for the Alice Pleasant Park Improvements were opened on Monday, April 15. Throughout the bidding process, two contractors were actively engaged. The City received one bid submittal for the project. Duran & Pearce Contractors presented a bid in the amount of \$759,450.22.

The approved budget amount for the project is \$600,000. With the original PLANNED APPROACH, identified on page two, the City would not need to postpone capital projects that were approved in the 2024 budget. However, since the project is over the budgeted amount, the City will now need to rely on those capital projects to fill the necessary funding gaps as presented in the SECONDARY OPTION on page two in order to move the project forward.

I would recommend City Council award the bid for Alice Pleasant Park Improvements to Duran & Pearce Contractors, NOT TO EXCEED AMOUNT of \$759,450.22. By awarding the bid "NOT TO EXCEED," the City can select a contractor and move forward with the project, as time is of the essence. There are many moving parts to this project and some lead times are extensive furthering the need to initiate the project. In addition, further delay will exacerbate planned Downtown Business Association events and other community programs that have already had to make modifications in planning due to the park improvements. In the interim, City staff, Ayres & Associates and selected contractor, will be actively working together seeking cost saving measures within the project budget while ensuring the quality of the overall project is not jeopardized.

This is a project that will make a significant impact within our community. It will highlight existing improvements that have already taken place in the downtown corridor and activate more community connection and further expand community events.

3. ALL PLANT AND LANDSCAPE MATERIAL IS SUBJECT TO APPROVAL BY OWNER AND/OR LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT.

4. CONTRACTOR IS RESPONSIBLE FOR REPLACEMENT OF ANY SITE IMPROVEMENTS DISTURBED OR

DAMAGED DUE TO THEIR OPERATIONS.

5. ALL NEW LANDSCAPE AREAS ARE TO BE WATERED WITH AN AUTOMATIC WATER CONSERVING

IRRIGATION SYSTEM MEETING THE STANDARDS OF THE OWNER. SODDED AREAS TO BE IRRIGATED WITH POP-UP SPRAY WITH HEAD-TO-HEAD COVERAGE. TREE AND SHRUB PLANTING AREAS TO BE IRRIGATED WITH DRIP EMITTERS. SEE SPECIFICATIONS.

6. CONTRACTOR TO SUBMIT IRRIGATION LAYOUT PLAN INCLUDING VALVE AND TRENCHING LOCATIONS FOR OWNER REVIEW AND APPROVAL. TRENCHING TO BE FIELD-MARKED FOR OWNER APPROVAL PRIOR TO CONSTRUCTION. SEE SPECIFICATIONS.

7. NEW TURF SHALL BE A 4-TYPE BLEND BLUEGRASS SOD, PER SPECIFICATIONS. FINAL SOD SHALL BE AT GRADE. PRIOR TO SODDING, GRADE SHALL BE 1-1/2" LOWER THAN ADJACENT PAVING GRADE.

8. ALL FINISHED GRADES SHALL BE APPROVED BY OWNER AND/OR LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT PRIOR TO INSTALLATION OF SOD OR ANY OTHER PLANT MATERIAL.

9. ALL PLANTING BEDS SHALL RECEIVE WEED BARRIER FABRIC AND 1-1/2" MINUS GRAVEL ROCK MULCH TO A DEPTH OF 3". SEE SPECIFICATIONS FOR MATERIALS. SAMPLE OF MULCH TO BE APPROVED BY LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT PRIOR TO INSTALLATION.

10. ANY PLANT SUBSTITUTIONS ARE TO BE APPROVED BY LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT PRIOR TO INSTALLATION.

11. SOIL AMENDMENTS AND TOPSOIL SHALL BE USED IN TURF AREAS AND PLANTING BEDS. SOIL FOR LANDSCAPING SHALL BE AMENDED WITH 4 CU. YDS OF ORGANIC MATERIAL PER 1000 SQ. FT.

12. IF THERE IS A DISCREPANCY BETWEEN PLANT QUANTITIES ON PLANT LABELS AND PLANT SYMBOLS, PLAN TAKES PRECEDENCE. THE SUMMARY OF ALL OTHER QUANTITIES REPRESENTS AN APPROXIMATE QUANTITY ONLY AND MAY REQUIRE SOME ADJUSTMENT IN MATERIAL QUANTITY AT TIME OF CONSTRUCTION. CONTRACTOR SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR HIS/HER OWN CONSTRUCTION QUANTITY ESTIMATES.

13. CONTRACTOR SHALL COORDINATE IRRIGATION AND PLANTING WORK SUCH THAT INSTALLED IRRIGATION EQUIPMENT SHALL NOT CAUSE ADJUSTMENT OF PLANTING LOCATIONS CONTRARY TO THE PLANS. IF IRRIGATION EQUIPMENT IS INSTALLED IN LOCATIONS OBSTRUCTING THE INTENDED LOCATIONS OF PLANTINGS, THE IRRIGATION EQUIPMENT SHALL BE RELOCATED.

14. NEW TREES SHALL BE PLANTED A MINIMUM OF 8' MIN. FROM WALKS, PATHS AND EDGES, AND 8' MINIMUM BETWEEN TREES, UNLESS OTHERWISE DIRECTED BY LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT. NO TREES SHALL BE PLANTED ABOVE IRRIGATION LINES OR UNDERGROUND UTILITIES.

15. ALL TREES SHALL BE LOCATED A MINIMUM OF 10' OFF ANY UTILITY.

16. ALL EXISTING LANDSCAPE, IRRIGATION EQUIPMENT, CONCRETE OR FENCING, ON OR OFF SITE DISTURBED BY CONSTRUCTION OPERATIONS SHALL BE REPAIRED AND RESTORED BY THE CONTRACTOR TO OWNER STANDARDS OR ORIGINAL CONDITION.


17. LOCATIONS FOR PLANTS SHALL BE VERIFIED AND STAKED ACCORDING TO PLANS. OWNER AND LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT SHALL BE NOTIFIED PRIOR TO PLANTING TO OBSERVE LOCATIONS.

18. CONTRACTOR SHALL HAND DIG ALL PLANTING PITS ADJACENT TO UTILITIES. IF UTILITIES ARE DAMAGED REPAIRS SHALL BE MADE AT THE CONTRACTOR'S EXPENSE.

19. IF CONDITIONS DO NOT ALLOW STRICT CONFORMANCE TO THE NOTES, DETAILS AND SPECIFICATIONS, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL REQUEST APPROVAL FROM THE LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT BEFORE PERFORMING WORK IN AN ALTERNATIVE MANNER.

20. CONTRACTOR SHALL USE CARE WHEN PLANTING BENEATH EXISTING TREES AND HAND DIG BETWEEN ROOTS. DO NOT DAMAGE ROOTS LARGER THAN 2" DIAMETER, USING PROPER HAND PRUNING TECHNIQUES WHEN REQUIRED. AMEND SOIL AT NEW PLANTING WHERE POSSIBLE; DO NOT RAISE GRADE BELOW TREE DRIPLINE.

21. CONTRACTOR SHALL HOLD PRE-CONSTRUCTION MEETING WITH ALL SUB-CONSULTANTS AND OWNER AT THE PROJECT LOCATION TO DISCUSS TREE PRESERVATION PLANS. CONTRACTOR SHALL TAKE EVERY MEASURE TO PROTECT THE EXISTING TREES ON SITE. NOTIFY OWNER IMMEDIATELY IF CONDITIONS ARISE THAT PREVENT ADHERENCE TO PLANS AND TREE PROTECTION REQUIREMENTS.






