



TRASH INFORMATION

The City of DeSoto implemented important changes to our [Bulk and Brush Trash Collection](#) Program in June 2024. Since that time, we have undertaken a multi-channel communication campaign to inform residents of these new requirements. Despite these efforts, we understand some residents are still unaware or unclear about the program. To help further spread awareness within your communities, the City has produced yard signs that highlight the key requirements for bulk and brush collection.



These signs are designed to be placed at the entryway of your subdivision or neighborhood to serve as a visual reminder for residents.

- Each HOA or Neighborhood Association may request one sign per entryway.
- In order to receive a sign, a designated person must take possession of it and assume responsibility for both placement and upkeep.
- The sign must remain visible, upright, and well-maintained in accordance with City standards and Code Enforcement guidelines.

We kindly ask for your assistance in ensuring that this vital information continues to reach your residents. Your support plays a critical role in helping us maintain a clean, informed, and cooperative community.

Placing basketball goals in these areas can obstruct pedestrian traffic and create safety hazards. Basketball goals should be used and stored in driveways or backyards. No structures or objects may be placed within public streets, rights-of-way, or easements without city approval. 
Police Call Volume Report: May 18 - 24


MAYOR'S SUMMER READING CLUB KICKS OFF ON 6/2






