UM ARMY BRINGS HELP AND HOPE TO DESOTO HOMES

From June 16–20, DeSoto was honored to welcome the UM ARMY Mission Camp, a dedicated group of volunteers committed to serving local residents through critical home repair projects. Their efforts brought not only improvements, but also a deep sense of care and community support.



Over the course of the week:

- 13 DeSoto homes were visited
- A total of 68 individual projects were completed, including:
 - Installing handrails
 - Fixing doors and floors
 - Sheetrock installation
 - Interior and exterior painting
 - Roof repairs
 - Fence repairs
 - Yard work, cleaning, and trash removal
 - Installing screens
 - And much more

The team also tackled approximately 50 targeted projects across 13 DeSoto homes, many of which were identified by our Code department and City Staff. This incredible work was made possible by 105 Mission Camp participants — including 65 youth and 40 adults — organized into 12 work teams and one tactical support team. Each team consisted of 7–8 members, and together, they contributed an estimated 675 collective man-hours of service to the DeSoto community. Their presence and the improvements made have already had a real and lasting impact on the residents they served. We are deeply grateful to UM ARMY, their organizers, and every volunteer who lent their time, energy, and heart to this effort!

CITY OF DESOTO MOSQUITO ABATEMENT PROGRAM

Mosquito season is officially here. The City of DeSoto Environmental Health Department partners with Dallas County Health and Human Services (HHS) to control the mosquito population in our community.

So how is this done? First, mosquitoes are vectors—organisms that carry disease-causing agents from infected hosts to others. Because of this, the City contracts with Dallas County HHS to manage mosquito abatement activities.



Mosquito season typically runs from early April through late October. Although mosquitoes can appear year-round under the right conditions, they are most active during this period. Six mosquito traps are strategically placed throughout DeSoto. Mosquitoes collected from these traps are tested weekly by Dallas County HHS for West Nile Virus. Generally, traps are checked on Mondays, tested on Tuesdays, and results are reported to the City by Wednesday.

If any trap tests positive for West Nile Virus, the Environmental Health Department is notified immediately. The City's Communication Manager then alerts residents through all communication channels and provides a map of the area scheduled for ground spraying.

Dallas County HHS dispatches trucks to spray within a 0.5-mile radius of the positive trap site. Spraying takes place for two consecutive nights between 9 PM and 4 AM.

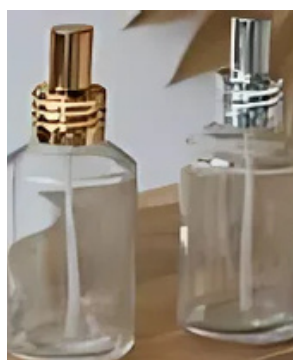

BULK/BRUSH PICKUP DELAYS

Bulk and brush pickup services in the City of DeSoto are currently experiencing delays due to the ongoing and excessive rainfall affecting the North Central Texas region. These weather conditions have caused significant backlogs at the regional landfill, which has directly impacted our ability to complete scheduled collections on time.



We understand the inconvenience this may cause and sincerely appreciate your patience as we work closely with Republic Services to resume regular operations as soon as possible. Crews are continuing to collect reported pickups, but please be aware that delays may continue in the coming days.

If your bulk or brush items have not yet been collected, we ask that you leave them curbside and avoid submitting duplicate requests, as all scheduled addresses remain in the queue and will be serviced as conditions improve. ANIMAL CONTROL PSA: INCREASED COYOTE ACTIVITY

DeSoto Animal Control, in the interest of public safety, is notifying residents of increased coyote activity in the neighborhoods: South of Wintergreen Rd, North of Pleasant Run Rd, West of I-35, East of Hampton Rd, & Regents Park Neighborhood.

Important Safety Guidelines:

- Do not approach a coyote if you see one.
- When walking your dog, keep pets on a leash no longer than 6ft
- Ensure all pets are attended to or secured in a coyote-proof enclosure.
- Do not leave pet food or garbage outdoors
- Maintain your landscaping to reduce hiding spots and attractants.

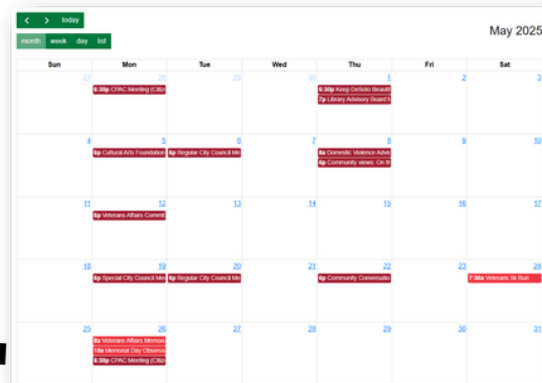
