DESOTO HONORS FALLEN PEACE OFFICERS

The DeSoto Police Department held its annual Peace Officer Memorial Ceremony at 9:00 am, Wednesday, May 17 in front of DeSoto Police Headquarters, 714 E Belt Line Road.

Approximately 70 people attended the morning ceremony including DeSoto Mayor Rachel Proctor and several City Councilmembers, DeSoto City Manager Brandon Wright and senior City officials, DeSoto Police Chief Joe Costa, Assistant Chief Ryan Jesionek, and a large contingent of DeSoto's Police force and Citizens Police Academy Alumni, DeSoto Fire Chief Bryan Southard and his command staff, and members of first responder agencies from other Texas cities including Police Chief Nick Bristow of Glenn Heights, Former DeSoto & Rowlett Police Chief Mike Broadnax who is now with Midlothian Police, and Bag Piper and Trumpeter Doug Compton of the Irving Fire Department.



Mayor Rachel Proctor greeted the attendees and issued a proclamation for National Police Week and the Police Memorial Ceremony. Before she shared the proclamation, Mayor Proctor stated, "As your Mayor, I'm very proud to be able to stand with our community to honor and remember brave men and women who have made the ultimate sacrifice in the line of duty. This week we're coming together to show our support for our law enforcement and the families of those who have fallen and to thank them for all their sacrifices and for all the things they do to serve our community with honor and distinction."

DESOTO HONORS FALLEN PEACE OFFICERS, CONTINUED...

DeSoto Assistant Police Chief Ryan Jesionek conducted Wednesday morning's ceremony on behalf of Chief Joe Costa and explained to the gathering the solemn nature of the occasion. He noted that Texas led the nation in peace officer deaths in 2022 with 35, and pointed out that the greatest number of deaths were from COVID-19.

Assistant Chief Jesionek explained to those in attendance the poignant symbolism of the unoccupied table set for a peace officer who has made the ultimate sacrifice. He noted that the table was a symbol of the officers and what they left behind. It was set for one but the number was many. The chair was empty because the fallen could no longer join us. The white tablecloth symbolized the purity of the officers intentions to serve their communities. The candle symbolizes their spirit to serve. The glass is inverted; they cannot drink nor toast with us this day. A slice of lemon on the plate reminds us of their bitter fate.

Nobody likes being caught in construction-related traffic delays or detours and that includes our project managers. During this program Elizabeth Quilici not only thanked DeSoto motorists for their patience but made it known that she also "feels their pain."

Said Quilici, "I just want to thank everybody and thank the residents mostly for being accommodating during construction. I know I've been driving through it and sometimes I forget a road is under construction and I know it's a pain to drive through, so I just wanted to thank you for your patience as we work to improve our roadways."





FIRE DEPARTMENT UPDATES

Fire Run Report: May 7 – May 13

The Fire Department responded to 227 emergency calls for service, involving 153 medical calls and 74 fire/rescue calls. Included were 8 major vehicle accidents, 3 structure fires, and 1 trash fire. Additionally, 63 of the 153 medical calls required additional assistance/manpower from a fire engine.

POLICE DEPARTMENT UPDATES

Police Call Volume Report: May 7 - May 13

The DeSoto Police Department reported 2,156 calls with the most being neighborhood patrol calls at 635 calls followed by directed patrol at 331. DeSoto reported 255 traffic stops and 238 business contacts calls. Police responded to 64 animal-related calls, 53 welfare check or concern calls, and 11 accident-related calls.





PUBLIC ART MOVING FORWARD, MOSTLY

The City Council directed that the subject for the FY 2022 call for art should reflect DeSoto's unique experience with the social justice or Black Lives Matter movement. A call for proposals from artists to design and produce an original public art installation as a Reflection Walk to be located along the Roy Orr Trail was issued under the guidance of the City's Arts Commission. Two pieces of sculpture rose to the top of the selection process. The highest rated proposal includes an archway that will cost more than the \$30,000 budget, and the Arts Commission is exploring funding options including grants.

Under the leadership of the Arts Commission, both pieces were selected to proceed to design utilizing resources from both the FY 2022 and FY 2023 programs. The obelisk project, designed by artist Akirash, that is slotted for Ernie Roberts Park has completed design and been given a notice to proceed to fabrication. The base is being installed and the work is scheduled for installation this August. The design includes one change reflecting feedback received during the public engagement process. The original design for this piece is three sided and featured the words "Harmony, Respect and Tolerance." The word "Tolerance" was replaced with "Acceptance" based on community feedback.

PUBLIC ART MOVING FORWARD, CONTINUED...



Opportunities for future fabrication of the second art piece, designed by artist Maxwell Emcays, continue to be explored by the Arts Commission. This gateway arch is programmed to be installed at the entrance to the Roy Orr Trail next to the Outdoor Amphitheater at Town Center. Below is a picture of the proposed design at the proposed location. Mr. Emcays has developed a more detailed design allowing him to provide more accurate feedback regarding the cost of materials and fabrication for the piece. Based on detailed design, the total estimated budget for the piece will be approximately \$100,000.

Staff presented the updated budget estimates regarding the expected cost of the work proposed by Mr. Emcays to the Arts Commission at their regular meeting on May 1. Staff will be following the Commission's direction to work with the artist to seek supplemental resources through applying for grants.

DOCUMENT SHREDDING

Documents can be brought to the DeSoto Service Center located at 809 W. Spinner Road for shredding. There will be a mobile document shredding unit on-site to shred your personal household documents at no cost. **PROOF OF DESOTO RESIDENCY IS REQUIRED FOR PARTICIPATION.** (Commercial documents will not be accepted.) You must follow the guidelines below.

GUIDELINES:

- Place all documents in file size boxes.
- Do not bring documents loose in bags; they must be placed in boxes ready for shredding.
- Do not tape the lid on top of the boxes.
- You will be able to watch your documents being shredded.
- No more than 5 boxes per resident.
- Boxes will be turned over to the Goodwill truck for recycling.

IF RAINING, THE COLLECTION SITE WILL BE CLOSED FOR SAFETY REASONS. Once the event is over, any documents left at the location unattended will be considered illegally dumped.
