

our Village Hall. My thanks to the Leiths for representing West Dundee and for being our first official emissaries in what I hope is a long and productive relationship with our friends across the Atlantic.

This Fall will also see the re-launch of what I hope will become an annual Halloween event, to be held in Grafelman Park on October 26th from noon to 3 pm. Coordinated by residents Jill Harris and Mike Dewey, and with the support of many other West Dundee residents and Village staff, the Halloween Party will feature wagon rides, games, and other child friendly, Halloween-themed events. It promises to be great fun!

All of this will be taking place while the leaves turn on thousands of trees in our beautiful river town, all in all, a nice setting for a lot of memorable times with family and friends.

An additional service request option was also rolled out this summer on the Village's website. The online Service Request System offers residents a one-stop option for submitting requests for non-emergency services, such as the repair of a damaged sidewalk or the replacement of a streetlight bulb.

This service can be found online at <u>service.wdundee.org</u>. This page will default to a mobile page view on mobile devices for ease of use.

The Village also continues to distribute news and information directly to subscribers' email inboxes in a quick and efficient via the Village Newslist. Residents and business owners who have not already done so are strongly encouraged to submit their email address on the Newslist Sign Up form at wdundee.org.

FIRE PIT RULES AND REGULATIONS

Although recreational fires are legal and do not require a permit, there are a few basic rules that need to be followed to ensure the health and safety of your family and neighbors.

Before breaking out the marshmallows and campfire songs, please review these rules to enjoy it all in a fire-safe and respectful manner.

 A portable fireplace shall be used only in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications and guidelines, including the use of both protective screens and covers to limit the size of the fire source.

Recreational fires shall be located in the rear yard only and not within twenty feet of any structures, including houses, sheds, decks, and fences or other combustible material.

Any condition that could cause a fire to spread to within twenty feet of a structure or combustible material needs to be eliminated before lighting the fire.

The fire cannot be more than three feet in diameter and must be two feet or less in height.

II. All recreational fires must be constantly attended by a responsible person over the age of fourteen until the fire is extinguished.

A fire extinguisher or a garden hose must be available for immediate use. Make sure that the fire is completely extinguished when you are finished enjoying it.

III. Burn only good, dry wood. Do not cause, suffer, allow, or permit open burning of rubbish, refuse of any kind, grass, leaves, garbage, metal salvage, or any other material in open fires.

Any recreational fire that will be offensive or objectionable due to smoke or odor emissions is prohibited.

What may be enjoyable for you may not be enjoyable for your neighbors. Be a good neighbor and don't use a recreational fire on breezy days that will spread the smoke through the neighborhood.

FALL LEAF COLLECTION

The Village's annual Leaf Collection Program will begin October 14 and continue until November 30.

Please rake leaves into the street approximately one foot from the curb. Be sure the pile consists of leaves only, and is free of sticks, rocks, and other debris that will damage leaf collection equipment.

Public Works crews try to clear each street at least once per week. After the leaves are collected from your street, please wait a few days before placing more leaves on the street. Remember, it is a violation of the Village Ordinance to burn leaves.

Do not allow children to play in or around leaf piles in the street. Don't park vehicles over leaf piles, as this obstructs the collection process, and the heat from exhaust pipes can start the leaves on fire.

Leaves can also be bagged for disposal as yard waste. Please remember that curbside **yard waste collection also ends on November 30**. Place bagged leaves on the curb in a craft bag or open garbage can no earlier than Thursday. Do not mix leaves with regular household trash. **After November 30**, **yard waste should be stored for disposal in the spring**.

TRICK OR TREATING HOURS & SAFETY

Trick or Treat hours will be on **Thursday**, **October 31st from 3-7 pm** in the Village of West Dundee and most of our neighboring communities.

For a safe and fun Halloween, please observe the following basic safety precautions provided by your Fire & Police Departments.

- Make sure that costumes are of non-flammable material. Instruct children to "Stop, Drop and Roll" in the event of a clothing fire. Instead of candle-lit pumpkins, substitute the candle with a flashlight or battery operated light. Do not place dry cornstalks or other decorations near fireplaces or any other heat source.
- Walk, never run, across the street. Do not walk in the streets use sidewalks and crosswalks.
- Avoid costumes with masks, as masks restrict vision. Consider face paint instead. Make sure that
 costumes are brightly colored and do not impair mobility. Decorate your child's costume with
 reflective tape to increase motorist visibility.
- Parents Always accompany your children. Advise them never to enter a stranger's home. Instruct your children not to eat any of their treats until after they get home and you have checked for any possible contaminants.
