

Explore Elmhurst Summer Trolley Rolls Through Town!



The Explore Elmhurst Trolley is back for the summer! Hop on board for some fun Fridays and Saturdays, June 2 - September 16 from 12 noon to 12 midnight. No tickets are needed to ride the FREE Explore Elmhurst Express connecting downtown Elmhurst with the Spring Road Business District and the York and Vallette Business District. Special Explore Elmhurst signs will mark each stop.

TROLLEY ROUTE

- Stop 1: York and Park Approximate boarding time is on the hour and 30 minutes after the hour
- Stop 2: York and Schiller Approximate boarding time is 5 and 35 minutes after the hour
- Stop 3: Second and Addison Approximate boarding time is 10 and 40 minutes after the hour
- Stop 4: Cottage Hill and Virginia Approximate boarding time is 15 and 45 minutes after the hour
- Stop 5: Spring and the Illinois Prairie Path Approximate boarding time is 20 and 50 minutes after the hour
- Stop 6: York and Vallette Approximate boarding time is 25 and 55 minutes after the hour



New this year - track the trolley! Don't waste your time thinking about when the trolley will arrive at each stop. The trolley will be equipped with GPS and can be tracked using ExploreElmhurst.com.

City Adding Advanced Life Support Vehicle

This past spring, the Elmhurst City Council approved the addition of a Rapid Response Advanced Life Support (ALS) Unit to the Elmhurst Fire Department resources. The Public Affairs & Safety Committee reviewed the medical and fire calls and their response times to determine how to best improve upon the city's already outstanding service. The committee made the recommendation to the City Council to add the Rapid Response Advanced Life Support Unit.

The Rapid Response ALS Unit will be contracted with Superior Ambulance as part of the City's ambulance service contract. The Rapid Response ALS Unit will consist of an SUV equipped with necessary ALS equipment and medicines and will be staffed by one Metro paramedic. The City anticipates the SUV being in operation by the beginning of the summer.

Fireworks Safety

Many fireworks related injuries over the 4th of July could be avoided by taking basic safety precautions. Only those fireworks that are legally sold in Illinois are legal to possess and use in Elmhurst. Children should never be allowed to use fireworks of any type without a responsible adult providing supervision. Even sparklers burn at temperatures in excess of 1,000 degrees and can cause severe burns. Keep in mind that when police respond to reports of fireworks in neighborhoods, the fireworks are confiscated and the offender(s) may be arrested.

Stormwater Infrastructure Improvement Update



The City of Elmhurst continues to undertake multiple stormwater infrastructure improvement projects in 2017 aimed at reducing overland flooding in several areas of the City.

In the first half of 2017, the City is expected to complete the Harrison Street, Crescent Avenue/Cambridge Avenue, Madison Early Childhood Center, and Washington Street Stormwater Improvement Projects. The start dates for these 4 projects range from late 2016 to early 2017. Collectively, the projects provide approximately 25 acre-feet of stormwater detention and help reduce or eliminate overland flooding for 112 homes.

Additionally, the City started construction on the Pine Street/ Avon Road Stormwater Improvement Project in May of 2017. This infrastructure project will provide a 100-year level of flood protection for approximately 28 homes along Pine Street, Avon Road and First Street. The proposed improvements consist of the construction of a relief storm sewer extending from the intersection of First Street and Pine Street to the recently purchased City property adjacent to Golden Meadows Park where a 12.2 acre-feet of gravity-drained stormwater detention basin will be constructed. Improvements to the existing drainage issues on East Court will also be included with this project.

In total, the City is anticipated to invest approximately \$24.5 million in construction costs from 2015-2018 to complete 9 stormwater projects and will provide nearly 98 acre-feet of stormwater detention to the City's infrastructure. These improvements will provide 100-year overland flood protection for over 230 homes throughout the City.

Residential Backyard Flooding

Residents are reminded that seasonal backyard flooding issues, both large and small, can occur due to saturated ground and extended periods of rain. Backyard flooding can be normal, especially in the spring. Residents are encouraged to wait 48-72 hours after a rain event ends to call the City as this will allow water time to soak into the ground naturally. If after 48-72 hours water is still standing residents can contact the City for an evaluation and information on the City's cost share programs related to residential stormwater management. If at any time flooding threatens a structure (house or garage) residents can call the City.

Community Safety

Severe Weather Preparedness

Tornadoes and severe weather peak during the spring and summer months, posing a serious risk to personal safety and property. The best way to protect yourself and your loved ones is to be informed and prepared. Preparedness tips include:

- Develop an emergency communication plan by designating an out-of-state relative or friend to serve as the family contact.
- If you are outdoors, listen for the City's radio-controlled severe
 weather warning sirens. They are sounded if the National
 Weather Service issues a tornado warning for DuPage County
 and if the storm poses a threat to Elmhurst, or if an actual tornado
 or funnel cloud is sighted in or traveling towards Elmhurst. The
 sirens are intended to save lives by warning people who are
 outdoors to seek shelter immediately.

Crime Watch and Prevention

The spring and summer months historically see a significant increase in reported crime, particularly in the burglary and theft categories. In an effort to prevent these crimes, the Elmhurst Police Department would like to remind you of the following:

- Always lock your vehicle and leave the windows up.
 Never leave valuables in plain sight, specifically in parking lots of health clubs, parks, and "drop off" locations such as schools and daycares where offenders frequently target.
- Note any vehicles or people that may seem suspicious (i.e. vehicles parked and occupied for an unusual amount of time, vehicles occupied by more than one person or people looking into vehicles) and report it to the police by calling 9-1-1. If possible, note the license plate number of the vehicle you are reporting.

Driver Safety

The City would like to remind drivers that when it is necessary to use your windshield wipers, your headlights must be illuminated, regardless of the time of day. This gives other drivers the opportunity to see your vehicle in cloudy, rainy, or foggy weather, and reduces the chance for an accident.

Parking Garages

The City of Elmhurst wants to remind residents and the public that the parking garages in town are for patrons to park their motor vehicles are not meant for pedestrians to loiter. Signs are posted at the entrances of the parking garages advising the public that the parking garage is for patron parking only. Also posted are prohibited activity signs regarding no skateboarding, no bicycling, no rollerblading and no scooters.

Neighborhood Roll Call Program



The Elmhurst Police
Department's Neighborhood
Roll Call program (winner
of the 2014 DuPage Mayors
and Managers Conference
Best Innovation award) will be
returning to a neighborhood
near you this summer. This
program offers residents the
opportunity to meet their local

officers in an informal, non-enforcement setting. Occurring on neighborhood corners, officers run through their roll call briefings as they change shifts. Residents are invited to listen in and get up to speed on recent issues, as well as ask any questions they might have. The program was very well received by Elmhurst residents, building greater partnerships between the police and community. Last year, 37 neighborhood roll calls were held and attended by over 700 residents. Furthermore, the initiative has reached approximately 2,200 residents since its start in 2014. Pool Safety: Drowning Prevention Tips

The typical drowning victim is age 4 and younger and doesn't make any noise when slipping into the pool to go after a toy or other object. To keep your child safe near water, remember the ABC & D's of drowning prevention: Adult Supervision, Barriers, Classes, and Devices.



Adult Supervision

- Always designate an adult to watch children around the pool or spa.
- Always know where your children are when you are inside your house.

Barriers

- Install a 48 ft, tall, non-climbable fence around the pool with a self-closing gate.
- Install alarms on back doors and windows so you know when they have been opened.

Classes

- Take a CPR and rescue techniques class.
- Have your child take swimming classes, but know that does not make him or her drown-proof.

Devices

- · Keep a phone by the pool and child's bathtub at all times.
- Keep other rescue tools, like a shepherd's hook and lifesaving ring, by the pool at all times.
- Have non-swimmers wear personal flotation devices (life jackets, not arm floaties) near all bodies of water.

Other Drowning Prevention Safety Tips

- · Close back doors if your pool doesn't have a fence.
- · Drain kiddie pools after every use.
- Always look immediately in the pool when your child is missing.
- · Never leave your child alone in the bathtub.
- Always remove toys from the pool after playing in the pool and store them securely away.



Economic Development Update

Economic Development is happening throughout Elmhurst, from the recent opening of Flavah Restaurant (570 S. York) to the construction of Edward-Elmhurst's newest Physician Center (751 N. York), from new ownership renovating Doc's (490 S. Spring) to the relocation of Railway Supply Group's corporate headquarters (577 W. Lamont). Investment is taking place in all corners of the community and the City Centre is no exception to the economic growth and reinvestment Elmhurst is experiencing. In addition to several multi-million dollar



projects, many new businesses are making downtown Elmhurst their home, such as: The Gaming Goat (152 N. York) a retail trading card and board game shop, Red Arrow Tap Room (111 E. First) which features pour-your-own technology for wide variety of independent craft brews and house-made BBQ, and Fresh Pals (106 W. Third), an animal self-serve doggie wash, grooming salon & retail shop.

Population density in a commercial sector is necessary to support businesses. In 2016, Elmhurst added 192 luxury apartments three blocks from the train as part of the mixed use development Elmhurst 255. In late 2018, an additional 165 luxury apartments will come online across the street from the Metra Station, as part of a new mixed use development by the *Opus Group*. With approximately 350 new apartment dwellings coming online in the next year, Elmhurst's downtown population is primed to grow by over 550 new residents in the next several years. As the population grows, balancing the wants of Baby Boomers and Millennials adds to both the complexities and opportunities of strategic planning and economic development.

The fitness category has been, and will continue to be, one of the growth categories benefiting commercial real estate. A Wellness Destination, Elmhurst features a wide range of both big box and boutique fitness facilities. The Addison Deck (135 N. Addison) has welcomed the highly successful Orange Theory Fitness, NEXT Yoga and The Fruitful Yield. Additionally, Fitness Formula Club (FFC) is on schedule to break ground this summer. This 50,000 square foot luxury fitness club is set to draw approximately 1,200 unique visitors daily.

From 2015-2018, the City has invested over \$24 million to complete 9 stormwater projects. The result is that over 230 homes have enhanced flood protection.

The 12-week program includes weekly presentations on topics ranging from Search & Seizure Laws, Evidence and Crime Scene Processing, Crisis Negotiation and the Emergency Response Team, Internet Crime, DUI and Traffic Stops, the K-9 Unit, and more. Electric Aggregation Program - The City has been providing an Electric Aggregation Program (EAP) since Elmhurst residents approved a referendum in 2012. With its most recent 3-year contract coming to a close, the City is again seeking bids for the program. The Electric Aggregation Program is an "**opt-out**" offering available to all residential and small commercial business customers. Residents may leave the program at any time with no early termination fee.

With the current Constellation Energy contract expiring in August 2017, the City Council received competitive proposals in May. Based on the proposed rates as compared to ComEd rates, the City will decide whether or not to renew the program or terminate it. Check the web site, elmhurst.org for updates.

Vehicle Sticker Reminder - May 1 was the deadline to display a new vehicle sticker and affix it to the inside lower right corner of the windshield on any vehicle registered or principally housed in Elmhurst. Failure to comply may result in a \$25 fine in May and \$50 thereafter.

NO SOLICITORS

Solicitors information - A permit to solicit door-to-door is required for any and all persons and organizations that are seeking to obtain orders, prospective customers, subscriptions, gifts or contributions. If a "No Solicitor Invited" notice is displayed, the solicitor

must immediately leave the premises. Residents can request a "No Solicitors Invited" decal from the City Clerk. Residents are encouraged to ask solicitors for their City issued badges with their names and information.

If you have any concerns regarding any person soliciting in your neighborhood, please call 9-1-1. Let them know your location and that there is a solicitor in the vicinity who is in violation of the City's Municipal Code. By reporting the violation immediately, an officer can respond when the solicitor is in the area.

Curfew Hours - Parents and teens are reminded that young people under the age of 18 must abide by City curfew regulations all year. The Elmhurst curfew is enforced from 11pm until 6am Sunday through Thursday, and from midnight to 6am on Friday and Saturday. Anyone under the age of 18 in a public area after curfew must be accompanied by a parent, legal guardian, or another responsible companion at least 21 years of age who has been approved by the teen's parent or legal guardian - the only exception being if they are engaged by a business or occupation approved by the state by a person under the age of 18.

Address Numbers - Address numbers must be installed on the front of all buildings. Municipal code states that the address numbers shall be a minimum of 4 inches tall and ½ inch thick, of a contrasting color, facing the street and readily visible for emergency vehicles.



Inoperable Vehicles - Elmhurst Municipal Code prohibits parking or storing inoperable or junk cars in public view in residential areas. This regulation pertains to vehicles with flat tires, broken windshields or other conditions that render them inoperable.

Garage Sales - Municipal regulations allow up to two garage sales in a calendar year. Remember to place signs advertising such events on private property, either your own or that of others (with their permission). Signs may not be placed on telephone poles or parkway trees.



Maintaining Your Home's Exterior

City code requires all surfaces of your home, (including but not limited to) doors, door and window frames, porches, trim, decks and fences be maintained in good condition. Exterior wood should be protected from the elements by paint or other protective covering or treatment. Peeling or chipping paint on any

exterior wood surfaces must be removed and the surface repainted. All exterior metal surfaces must be maintained and kept free of rust or corrosion.

Garbage and Recycle Containers - On scheduled pickup days, all garbage and recycle containers are to be placed on the City's parkways. Containers placed in the street risk not being picked up. Containers must be at least three feet apart and three feet from any permanent objects such as fire hydrants and streetlights.

Gutter Downspouts

Residents are reminded that gutter downspouts must be directed to the front or the rear of their property. Sump pump discharge that is above ground must be directed to an area on your property that can absorb this water before it reaches any adjacent properties or city sidewalks. All property owners must do their very best to manage water that is generated from their property.



Community Development Reminder - Community Development would like to remind residents that most permit applications require a plat of survey for the address where work is to be done. The City of Elmhurst does not have this information on file. Property owners are responsible for providing a plat of survey at the time of permit application.

Call J.U.L.I.E. Before You Dig - If you are planning any home improvement projects that involve digging, remember to call J.U.L.I.E. (811 from a cell phone or 800-892-0123) before beginning work. J.U.L.I.E. will notify member utility companies to send locators to mark their underground utilities with paint and/or flags. Once you know the approximate location of utility lines, you can dig safely.

Latex Paint Recycling - The DuPage County Public Works Department is accepting latex paint for recycling from June 1 through July 29. Residents can drop off their usable, unwanted latex plait free of charge. The recycled paint will be filtered and re-blended into a variety of colors, types and finishes and will be available for free to residents during the same hours of collection. Paint is offered free of charge to any resident, business, non-profit, etc. in 5-gallon containers.

'Disco Demolition' Exhibit Blasts into Town: June 9 - October 8, 2017

Where were you on July 12, 1979? For Chicagoans who were coming of age in that era, chances are more than a few Elmhurst residents were at Comiskey Park—ostensibly to see a baseball game but more than likely to be an unwitting participant in one of Chicago's most infamous baseball history moments: Disco Demolition Night.

The event started out as a hook to fill empty stadium seats during a dismal White Sox season and promote WLUP's newly-hired shock jock, Steve Dahl. Dahl was fostering an antidisco campaign on Chicago air waves after being fired from WDAI when the station switched to a disco format. Fueled by a 98 cent ticket price for fans who brought disco records to blow up between games of the doubleheader, the event quickly careened out of control after 50,000+ attendees packed the park and its environs.

The rest, as they say, is history. In the wake of the explosion, fans took over the field causing the White Sox to forfeit the second game to the Detroit Tigers. After the smoke cleared, it is said that disco met its demise. The verdict is still out on how and why this event impacted Chicago's baseball and music history, but one thing's for sure: it's 2017, and people are still talking about it.

Elmhurst has welcomed the growing preference for walkability, entertainment options, and destination driven venues; as a result more than half of the vacant first floor retail space downtown that existed in March of 2016 has been leased or converted to new businesses. In addition, over 12,000 square feet of first floor retail space, which came online in that time, was reabsorbed during the course of the year.
