

New Developments in Elmhurst

A significant number of development projects are currently underway throughout Elmhurst, with over \$80 million in construction in the downtown area. MLE Inc, is building a new facility at 540 W. Lamont, Elmhurst BMW is constructing a new facility at 500 W. Lake, and iMotorsports (334 W. Grand) is completing a substantial addition. Elmhurst's Downtown City Centre is also bustling with activity. The Opus Group's construction of a mixed use development featuring first floor retail and 165 luxury apartments is underway at 100 N. Addison; with construction projected through the first quarter of 2019. To the north of the Opus project, Fitness Formula Club (FFC) is constructing their highly anticipated facility. The 50,000 sq. ft. luxury club complete with rooftop pool, is scheduled for completion in late 2018.

The York Building (134 N. York) will begin tenant build out this Spring. The York will have first floor retail and two levels of offices,

as well as a third floor event space. Construction on a new Schiller Clinic by Edward Elmhurst Healthcare is also set to begin this Spring. The new clinic will sit on the site which currently serves as their parking lot. Business will continue in their current site (172 Schiller) until the new building is ready later this year, at which time the older building site will be converted to parking for the facility. Demolitions of the former Clark Gas Station at Second & Addison and the former auto repair shop at 105 Cottage Hill are scheduled to take place in early Spring as well.

City Working Towards Establishing New Downtown TIF

The City is in the process of proposing a new Downtown Tax Increment Finance (TIF) area. The downtown area has experienced successful growth, but there is still much work to be done to keep the central business district desirable and vibrant. Although successful in growing the downtown periphery and generating new revenue, the City's core has not seen the

same revitalization, with out-of-date, smaller spaces, inefficiently designed and deteriorating buildings that are unattractive for developers. The proposed Downtown TIF will provide for necessary funding of improvements and redevelopment in the future to this area. The primary focus of the TIF will be to continue the implementation of the adopted 2016 Downtown Plan and provide opportunity for redevelopment of underutilized properties in the downtown area. The Joint Review Board met and voted 5-1 to approve the Downtown TIF. The next steps involve additional notices to the community, a public hearing on March 5th, and a final vote by Elmhurst City Council.



City Council Approves 2018 Budget

The City of Elmhurst continues using revenues responsibly and provides essential services to the community. City Council approved the 2018 City of Elmhurst budget with operational plans for the new fiscal year. The City continues to maintain the AAA Bond Rating from Standard & Poor's Rating Service; this is the highest rating that can be assigned. The total proposed budget was almost \$164 million, of that about 20% is capital and will fund projects related to storm water upgrades and road work. The property tax has remained the same for general city operations and the City's fund balance for the general fund is within the range policy of 25-33% of operating expenditures. New Refuse Contract

The new 5 year refuse contract with Republic Services dba Allied Waste of Melrose Park will beginning on April 1, 2018 and continuing until March 30, 2023. Because the contractor is remaining the same, there will **not** be a mass change out of waste and recycling toters and your pick up day will remain the same as it is



currently. Some of the new features of the contract include:

- 35 gallon toter option for refuse (watch for future mailings about the program)
- Food scrap composting as part of the yard waste collection (watch for future mailings about the program)

The City will be working with the contractor to offer an electronics and other recycling program for residents.

Mayor's Message



The City of Elmhurst, along with its citizens and businesses, enjoyed another terrific year in 2017. This past January, I was honored to give an update of the state of our City at the annual Chamber Membership Breakfast sponsored by Community Bank of Elmhurst, where I shared some of our City's accomplishments and reviewed what's ahead. The City has and continues to be in planning mode. If something is happening in Elmhurst it has taken month to years of planning. This is one of the reasons Elmhurst continues to be successful. Our persistence in economic development has kept us competitive. Our goal is to bring services into the area that residents want, while increasing our tax base without burdening the residents. One way to keep the City vibrant is by creating foot traffic. York Theater is a great example of a business that has consistently brought unique visitors to Elmhurst. This past year our downtown area experienced an increase in density with the opening of Elmhurst 255, a 192-unit luxury apartment complex. Currently under construction on Addison Street is Fitness Formula Club, a high-end fitness center, which is projected to bring 800-1,000 unique visits per day to the downtown area. The Opus development, a 165-unit luxury apartment complex due to come online in early 2019, will also increase foot traffic in the downtown area. This increase in density assists in keeping our downtown vibrant and desirable for visitors, prospective businesses and residents.

With the changing of the season to Spring, one thing Elmhurst residents can be sure of is rain. We understand the stormwater issues that residents have faced and are working hard to relieve these issues. We have completed 9 of 11 stormwater management projects, which have accounted for over 80 acrefeet of stormwater storage. We have made progress towards resolving these issues, but there is more to be done. We will continue to focus on this on behalf of Elmhurst.

On April 18th, I am honored to be presenting the annual Exemplary Youth Service Awards. It is a special time of the year when we recognize children in our community who have gone above and beyond with service for others. Elmhurst organizations are gearing up for some additional great events this Spring. This season, don't miss some of the City's signature events including the Elmhurst St. Patrick's Day Parade on March 10th, Art in Wilder Park on May 5th and 6th, and the 100th Anniversary of the Elmhurst Memorial Day Parade.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all who serve this City. Elmhurst has over 290 full time employees, over 200 part time employees, 17 boards and commissions with over 100 members, 17 elected officials, and over 40 library and museum volunteers. Outdoor Warning Sirens

Spring weather can bring severe storms to the area. When severe weather, such as a tornado threatens the community, Outdoor Warning Sirens will be activated. If severe weather is approaching Elmhurst, and the warning sirens are heard, seek shelter immediately and monitor a television or radio for further instructions. The City activates a



monthly scheduled test of the City's emergency warning siren system at 10 a.m. on the first Tuesday of every month. If you hear the alarm at this time, please be reminded that it is only a test. Coyote Sightings

Coyote sightings, particularly in the springtime, have become predictable in DuPage County as human encroachment shrinks natural habitats. Do not be unduly alarmed if you should see a coyote



but do exercise caution—especially with regard to young children and pets. Please be aware that removing food sources can be a factor in keeping coyotes away—if possible, keep garbage cans inside and do not leave small pets unattended outside. You should not assume that a coyote is aggressive simply by its presence; however, if you do see a coyote behaving aggressively, please call 9-1-1 to have an officer respond. Stormwater Mitigation Project Updates

In 2018, the City of Elmhurst will continue to undertake several additional stormwater infrastructure improvement projects aimed to reduce overland flooding. Nine projects were completed between 2015-2017 throughout the City. The focus of the remaining projects in 2018 will be the southwest side of the City; the largest area affected by overland flooding over the last decade.

The projects scheduled to begin construction in 2018 include:

Southwest Elmhurst Stormwater Mitigation Project (SESMP)-Phase I

The proposed improvements consist of the construction of relief storm sewers along Jackson Street, Prospect Avenue, Parkside Avenue, Bryan Street, and Harrison Street, to a proposed 21 acre-foot detention basin to be constructed on the City owned property located south of Messiah Lutheran along Butterfield Road. The detention basin will be over 30-feet deep and will utilize a new pump station to slowly drain the stormwater after the end of the storm event. This project will provide flood reduction benefits of roughly 6-inches for approximately 121 homes in the southwest side of Elmhurst and will protect 75 of those homes from 100-year structural overland flooding.

Southwest Elmhurst Stormwater Mitigation Project (SESMP)– Phase II

This project will consist of the installation of a new detention basin on the property the City recently purchased at 250 W. Jackson Street. This land was purchased from the adjacent Christ United Church. The new detention basin will have a total storage capacity of approximately 11 ac-ft. During 100-year rain events this project and the Phase I project combined will remove 90 homes from structural inundation and will provide up to 1.2 ft of flood reduction benefits for the southwest side of Elmhurst.

In total the City will invest over \$25.0 million in construction costs from 2015-2018 to complete 11 stormwater projects that will provide approximately 114 acre-feet of new stormwater detention volume to the City's infrastructure. These improvements will provide 100-year overland flood protection for over 300 homes throughout the City.

Vehicle Sticker Reminder

City vehicle stickers must be purchased and displayed by May 1st on all vehicles registered or garaged within city limits. Stickers are sold at a discount from March 1 through April 30. Applications will be mailed to residents, and are available to download at **www.elmhurst.org**. Stickers can be purchased in person, online or by mail. Money collected through the sale of vehicle stickers goes into the City's General Fund and is used for roadway maintenance and construction.



Benefits of a Knox HomeBox

The Elmhurst Fire Department has begun a residential Knox HomeBox program available to residents with special needs. A Knox HomeBox is a rapid-entry system designed to provide secure emergency access to a home or property to those living alone or with a history or medical or mobility issues.



When a fire breaks out or there is a medical emergency, a Knox HomeBox allows the Fire Department to gain immediate access to the home without forced entry damage or delay. The boxes are a metal box with a door hanger attached and are meant to be placed over the top of the resident's front entry door. Inside the box, a key to the residence is securely placed for access by the Elmhurst Fire Department only. For information on obtaining a Knox HomeBox, please call 630.530.3090.

Elmhurst College Recycling Extravaganza - April 28

On Saturday, April 28, the Alexander Street parking lot at Elmhurst College will turn into a Recycling Extravaganza, a place to bring a variety of items that will be recycled, reused and kept out of landfills. Acceptable items include electronics of all kinds, building supplies, clothing, bicycles, carpeting, home goods and much more.



Several nonprofit social service and green-focused organizations also will be at the Extravaganza, a partnership between Elmhurst College and the City of Elmhurst. The Recycling Extravaganza is open to the public.

The Recycling Extravaganza will be held from 9:00 a.m. to noon on Saturday, April 28, in Elmhurst College's Alexander Street parking lot. To facilitate traffic flow, vehicles must enter at Prospect Avenue and Walter Street. For more information, visit **elmhurst.edu/sustainability** or email sustainable@elmhurst.edu.

As a result of the annual Elmhurst Recycling Extravaganzas, hundreds of tons of electronics, as well as tens of thousands of pounds of carpeting, scrap metal and books, hundreds of bicycles and truckloads of clothing and other unwanted items have been diverted from landfills. In addition, the donations will benefit many nonprofit service organizations and ultimately will help scores of individuals and families.

Placement of Refuse Containers

On scheduled pickup days, all garbage and recycle containers are to be placed on the city parkway. Containers placed on the street are at risk of not being picked up. As a reminder, please place containers 3 ft. away from any permanent objects such as fire hydrants and streetlights.

Keep Inlets Clean

To reduce street flooding, the City is asking the public to help clean the inlets and storm drains in front of their residences or businesses. Use a rake or a shovel to clear leaves, limbs, and debris from the storm drain. Do not put your feet or hands into the storm drain because of potential hazards that have collected in the drain. Do not try to remove the grate, only the debris on top of the grate.

The best time to inspect the storm drain in front of your house or business is prior to a rain event and right after a rain, snow, or ice storm. If a clogged storm drain cannot be cleared, notify the City that help is needed. Call 630-530-3020 and report the specific location.

Please do not rake or blow the leaves from your yard into the street. Bag them at the curb and prepare them for curbside pickup by your garbage hauler. For leaves that have fallen into the street, please keep them out of the curb line, where they will block the path of rainwater.

Stormwater Management on Residential Property

Residents are reminded that gutter downspouts must be directed to the front or the rear of their property. Sump pump discharge that is above ground must be directed to an area on your property that can absorb this water before it reaches any adjacent properties or a city sidewalk. It is important for property owners to do their best to manage the stormwater that is generated from their property.

City Code Updates - Exterior Surfaces

Spring is here! Check the outside of your home for possible damages caused by the harsh winter elements. City code requires all exterior surfaces of your home including but not limited to, doors, door and window frames, porches, trim, decks and fences be maintained in good condition. Exterior wood shall be protected from the elements by paint or other protective covering or treatment. Peeling or chipping paint on any exterior wood surfaces must be removed and the surface repainted. All exterior metal surfaces must be maintained and kept free of rust or corrosion.

Annual Fire Hydrant Flushing

City of Elmhurst Water Distribution crews will begin the annual fire hydrant flushing program on Monday April 2nd. Crews will flush and inspect nearly 2,400 City owned fire hydrants during the course of program. The flushing program is divided into 6 sections, south to north. The hydrant flushing process takes four weeks and will be completed by the end of April. Normal flushing will occur between the hours of 6 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday during this project.



City receives recognition for Green Fleet

This past fall, the City of Elmhurst was honored by the Chicago Area Clean Cities Executive Board with the CACC Green Fleet Leadership Award, for having the greatest increase in petroleum reduction through the use of biodiesel over the previous 12 month period.

In addition to all City diesel powered equipment and vehicles using biodiesel, the City has made strides in incorporating other alternate fuel technologies. The City currently operates 9 hybrid cars and small trucks, along with 2 electric Ford Focus vehicles.

Additionally, through a grant from Chicago Area Clean Cities, the City has purchased 3 hybrid Hi Ranger tree trimming trucks. The booms on these trucks operate off the battery power while the truck is parked, eliminating the need to have the engine running while tree trimming work is being performed.

New to the fleet operations this year is a propane filling station at the Public Works Facility which will initially serve 14 public works vehicles which were recently converted to run on propane with an IEPA grant. The vehicles converted include 2 water main break repair trucks, 1 van, 7 pickup trucks, 2 medium duty trucks and 2 dump trucks.

Citywide Water Meter Changeout

This City is in the process of conducting a citywide water meter change out, requiring all residential and commercial water meters to be replaced.

The project is expected to take place through September 2018. All residents will receive a series of postcards with instructions to schedule an appointment for your water meter replacement. The City asks that residents be responsive and schedule your appointment once you receive this notification. For more information on the City
