In the event of a holiday-related fire, firefighters will replace one of the red bulbs with a white one. The goal is to keep the bulbs on that wreath red. Fire safety reminders for a safe holiday season include keeping live Christmas trees watered, making sure all illuminated decorations are in good condition, making sure your fireplace is in good working order, using candles with caution, not overloading extension cords or outlets with excessive holiday lights, and making sure smoke detectors work.

Mayor's Message

I am saddened to share news of the passing of longtime City Clerk, Patty Spencer. Clerk Spencer lost her courageous battle with cancer on September 20, 2019. Patty served her community proudly for many years and will be greatly missed.



Patty moved to Elmhurst in 1984 with her husband Byron. Before she became a public servant, Patty worked at AT&T for twenty years, specializing in network administration. She always credited her time at AT&T for helping to develop her leadership and organizational skills and most importantly, teaching her to be a team player. Patty was offered and took an early retirement in 1988. Soon after she began a new phase of life; becoming involved in the Elmhurst community and volunteerism.

Patty was also involved as volunteer and Board Member for various organizations including but not limited to Kiwanis Club, Elmhurst Art Museum Board, Elmhurst College & Community, the Elmhurst Hospital Guild, and the Elmhurst Garden Club and was a staunch supporter of community events. Patty advocated for Cancer Awareness in the community through the Relay for Life and Edward-Elmhurst's Cancer outreach programs.

Patty Spencer was first elected as Elmhurst's City Clerk in 2005 and was most recently serving her 4th term in office. As City Clerk, Patty had many responsibilities including being the official Keeper of the City Seal, the Keeper of the City's Records, and Secretariat to the City Council. Though she did not vote on items before the Council, Clerk Spencer believed in the mantra, "Clerks Make It Work," and took her role as a direct link between residents and government very seriously. Clerk Spencer also served as the Local Election Official and the Open Meetings Act Officer for the City, ensuring that all required staff, Elected Officials, and volunteer Commissioners complete the State mandated training.

Patty was a brave person, who said what she meant and meant what she said. When I was first sworn into office, I had the privilege of sitting down with Patty, and I openly asked her how she thought I was doing. Her frank response was, "It's not how I would do it, but you are trying and I know you will get there." Patty kept me on my toes and her work ethic and dedication to serving Elmhurst encouraged me, and those around her, to want to work hard for the residents of Elmhurst.

It was a privilege to have worked alongside Patty, a truly dedicated servant to the citizens of Elmhurst. She touched the lives of many, making friends wherever she went. She will forever hold a place in Elmhurst's history and we are thankful for her dedication and service to the City of Elmhurst.

As the holiday season is upon us, let's reflect and be thankful for memories shared with those who have passed and remember to cherish the moments with those who are with us. Snow Removal Procedures Following a snowfall, main roads are cleared first, followed by neighborhood streets and other less-traveled roadways. Snow is typically removed from the center to the curb in a series of four passes. Residents are reminded to please wait until city crews have completed their work before clearing your driveway approach because it is not possible to complete plowing without pushing some snow onto driveway approaches. During plowing operations, windrows of snow may be created in the center of the street and then removed during the night time hours when there are fewer vehicles to impede the process. Please avoid shoveling or blowing snow into the street when you are clearing your property. Residents can also help by clearing snow from fire hydrants to help firefighters locate them quickly in an emergency. Please remember, too, that parking is not permitted on city streets for eight hours following a snowfall of two inches or more.

Winter Weather Safety Checks As we continue to move into the winter season, bitter cold temperatures will become more prevalent. The Elmhurst Fire Department urges all citizens to take steps to prepare themselves for extreme cold temperatures. When outside, dress appropriately and maintain personal awareness. Prepare an emergency supply for your home and a winter kit for your vehicle(s). Residents are encouraged to check on elderly neighbors and family members to ensure they are safe and as comfortable as possible. If anyone needs urgent medical treatment, contact 911 immediately.

City of Elmhurst Warming Center Warming centers are heated public facilities where any resident can go during periods of extreme cold temperatures to stay warm and safe. The Elmhurst Public Library has been designated as an area warming center for those who need temporary relief from the cold.

We're Ready for You, Winter! Did you know that the City has a salt storage building that holds approximately 5,000 tons of salt? The building is a high arch gambrel structure that is 70 feet wide by 104 feet long. The door is 20 feet wide by 30 feet high. This type of



structure allows trucks to dump inside, eliminating outdoor salt piles, preventing run off and decreasing pollution. The structure also allows public works to store enough salt to maintain safe and serviceable roadways during the winter. The adequate space allows for enough storage to avoid being susceptible to high prices during salt shortages and delivery delays during extreme winter events.



Holiday Tree Disposal Christmas trees will be picked up without a refuse sticker if placed at the curb on your regular refuse collection day during the first and second week in January. After that, a sticker is required. All ornaments, lights, and nails

must be removed. Trees may not be placed in plastic bags. Wrapping paper, packing peanuts, garlands, and wreaths may be included with regular refuse. Boxes may be recycled if they measure no more than three feet by three feet, have been flattened, and bagged or bundled.

Holiday Light Disposal The City of Elmhurst is partnering with SCARCE (School & Community Assistance for Recycling and Composting Education) for the annual holiday lights recycling program. Look for the bin with the "Holiday Lights" sticker in the City Hall lobby, 209 N. York Street, open Monday - Friday, 8:30 am - 5 pm.



Acceptable items include mini-lights, traditional lights, extension cords, rope lights, and LED lights in both working and non-working condition. Lawn ornaments or other holiday decorations will not be accepted. Lights will be collected until January 31. Additional information about recycling is available from SCARCE at scarceecoed.org or from Elgin Recycling at elginrecycling.com.

Bicycle & Pedestrian Plan Survey

The City is requesting public input for a new bicycle & pedestrian plan. The goal will be to provide a comfortable and safe experience for riders of all ages and skill levels, focusing on improving transportation for pedestrians and bicyclists. This plan will strive to make

all modes of transportation safe, welcoming and convenient for all, including children, the elderly, and those with disabilities. By creating this plan, Elmhurst can build on its existing assets and create a healthier, more sustainable and active community. By providing more alternatives to driving, especially for single automobile trips less than a few miles, the City can help reduce traffic congestion. An increased number of people walking and biking through downtown creates economic development opportunities for the local businesses. Streets that are designed safely for pedestrians and bicyclists decrease serious crashes and increase safety for all users of the roadway, including cars. Additionally, the ability for kids to safely walk and bike to school increases health by providing an opportunity for physical activity as a part of their daily routines. The time for this plan is perfect because the state has approved 50 million dollars in funding allocated specifically for pedestrian and bicycle improvements which is anticipated to be released on October 2020. By creating and adopting this Plan, the City will be more likely to capture some of this anticipated grant funding.

This quick and easy process is completely safe, all data you provide the Census Bureau is only used to produce statistics and cannot be released in any way that would identify you or your household. As the first modern Census, in 2020 respondents will have an opportunity to complete the Census online. You may also respond by phone. Some households may also receive paper responses to complete and return by mail. When completing the Census remember to include all members of your household including infants, non-related roommates, and those who are not US citizens. Census results allow for fair and accurate representation at the local, state, and federal level of government, provide funding for local projects such as street repairs, and supports community initiatives from public safety preparedness to quality of life and economic development growth.

Earn extra income while helping your community: The Census Bureau is now hiring thousands of temporary employees across the country including Census takers, recruiting assistants, office staff, and supervisory staff. Census jobs pay well, you can make your own hours, and work from home; a great job for college students (must be at least 18), retirees, or full time workers looking for a side gig. 3rd Time Winners! The City is proud to have received the Dupage Mayors and Managers Innovation Award for a third time! The award, which is voted on by municipal leaders throughout the county, is given to municipalities who have introduced an innovative service to their community.

In 2019, the City of Elmhurst won the award for ZoneScan and WaterSmart, an innovative new service that is used to detect leaks and track water usage throughout the City.

Elmhurst also received this award in 2014 for the Police Department's Neighborhood Roll Call program, which is held in the Summer months. Each week, police officers hold their roll call in different neighborhoods in Elmhurst, offering residents a chance to ask questions and learn more from the officers that patrol their streets.

Elmhurst received the award again in 2017 for the Fire Department's ALS Rapid Response, Rescue 1 fleet addition. The vehicle is a Ford Explorer that paramedics use around the clock to enhance ALS service to the residents of Elmhurst. All of the equipment including a cardiac monitor/defibrillator, ALS medications, and a Zoll AutoPulse, fits perfectly in the back of the vehicle. Additionally, the vehicle is more maneuverable through city traffic.

Dryer Vent Safety When was the last time you had your dryer vent cleaned? Lint and debris can build up in your clothes dryer duct causing your dryer to work overtime, creating potentially hazardous conditions including dangerous levels of carbon monoxide in your home or even a fire. Be sure to have your dryer installed and



serviced by a professional and do not use the dryer without a lint filter. Clean the lint filter before or after each load of laundry and remove lint that has collected around the drum. Make sure the air exhaust vent pipe is not restricted and the outdoor vent flap will open when the dryer is operating. Once a year, or more often if you notice that it is taking longer than normal for your clothes to dry, clean lint out of the vent pipe or have a dryer lint removal service do it for you. Keep dryers in good working order!

Fireplace Safety As you relax in front of your fireplace the last thing you are likely to be thinking about is the condition of your chimney or if the liner is intact. However the Elmhurst Fire Department encourages you have it cleaned and inspected before you light those winter fires. Dirty chimneys can cause chimney fires, which damage structures and destroy homes and property. Indications of a



chimney fire have been described as creating loud cracking and popping noise with a lot of dense smoke, and an intense odor.

Fireplaces, and vents should be inspected at least once a year for soundness, freedom from deposits, and correct clearances. Cleaning, maintenance, and repairs should be done if necessary. Even if you don't use your chimney much, animals may build nests in the flue or there may be other types of deterioration that could make the chimney unsafe to use.

Shopper Safety Tips With the holidays coming up it is important to keep personal safety in mind when shopping. The Elmhurst Police Department would like to advise residents this season to be smart when shopping at stores with the following safety tips:



- Shop during the day if possible, but if you go at night bring a friend. Only bring necessary cash, cards, and identification and do not leave your purse or bags unattended.
- When placing shopping bags in your vehicle, put them in the trunk where they are out of sight. Be sure to remember to lock your vehicle when entering stores.
- Be cautious of strangers approaching you for any reason. Con artists will try to distract you with the intention of taking money/ belongings.
- If shopping online, be careful of online scams, there will be plenty
 of fake bargains so if it sounds too good to be true it probably is!
 Only make purchases from reputable websites and do research
 on websites you are unsure about.
- ${}\cdot{}$ $\;$ Have a safe shopping trip by being alert and following these tips!

Beware of Phone Scams The Elmhurst Police Department would like to remind residents to beware of telephone scams. A commonly reported phone scams involves a young adult calling for Grandma or Grandpa and asking for help because they've been arrested out of the country and need bond money to be wired. These are clever scams because when they hear a voice saying, "Grandma, it's me... I need help," the grandparent usually responds with the name of their grandchild, saying, "Johnny, is that you?" The offender is then armed with the name of his/her "character," and, if Grandpa or Grandma starts to have doubts, can use their false identity to convince them, saying, "Grandma, it's Johnny, remember? Help me, I need money right away."

Victims of phone scams also commonly report that they received calls from the IRS saying "you owe money and will be arrested if you don't wire money or provide a credit card or banking information immediately". THE IRS WILL NOT CONTACT YOU BY TELEPHONE OR EMAIL! If the IRS needs to reach you, they will do so through the U.S. Mail, and you will never have to provide immediate funds without time for explanation. If you receive calls of this nature, please hang up!

Prevent Package Theft During the holidays there are more opportunities for packages to be stolen. Follow the Elmhurst Police Department's tips to prevent package theft:

- When making a purchase online, choose a specific delivery time if the retailer provides the option. If
 purchasing from a large retailer, consider having it be delivered for pick-up at one of their local stores. Ask
 your work if you can get packages delivered there.
- If the package is being delivered to your home take advantage of delivery alerts so you can be notified
 when the package arrives. Ask a trusted neighbor to take your package inside if you are unavailable to
 accept the delivery yourself.
- When possible, request the delivery company to hold your package at their closest pick-up facility until you can pick it up. You can also ask the shipper to require a signature confirmation of delivery to prevent packages being left when no one is home to sign. It can be helpful to provide delivery instructions so packages can be left out of sight from the front yard/road.
- Take advantage of delivery options and be vigilant in your neighborhood and report any suspicious activity to the police department.

Mittens, socks, scarves and gloves will be distributed by Yorkfield Food Pantry in Elmhurst. The Mitten tree will accept donations until December 31st.

Winter Driving Tips Elmhurst Police see an increase in traffic crashes when driving conditions are less than optimal. Many crashes can be prevented if motorists follow these tips:

- Drive slowly. It's much harder to control or stop your vehicle on a slick or snow covered surface.
- When driving on the road, increase your following distances enough so there will be plenty of time to stop for vehicles ahead of you.
- As always, buckle up and do not engage in risky behaviors such as texting or driving impaired.

Frozen Pipe Prevention Frozen water pipes are a common problem in cold climates, affecting a quarter-million families each winter. In addition to taking the usual preventive precautions, here are a few steps you can take to keep your pipes from turning frigid nights into inconvenient, and expensive ordeals.

The three central causes of frozen pipes are quick drops in temperature, poor insulation, and thermostats set too low. You can prepare your home by doing the following:

Insulate pipes in your home's crawl spaces and attic, even if you live in a climate where freezing is uncommon. Exposed pipes are most susceptible to freezing. Remember, the more insulation you use, the better protected your pipes will be.

Seal leaks that allow cold air inside near where pipes are located. Look for air leaks around electrical wiring, dryer vents, and pipes, and use caulk or insulation to keep the cold out. With severe cold, even a tiny opening can let in enough cold air to cause a pipe to freeze.

Before winter hits, disconnect garden hoses and, if possible, use an indoor valve to shut off and drain water from pipes leading to outside faucets. This reduces the chance of freezing in the short span of pipe just inside the house.

A trickle of hot and cold water might be all it takes to keep your pipes from freezing. Let warm water drip overnight, preferably from a faucet on an outside wall.

Keep your thermostat set at the same temperature during both day and night. You might be in the habit of turning down the heat when you're asleep, but further drops in the temperature - more common overnight - could catch you off guard and freeze your pipes.

Open cabinet doors to allow heat to get to un-insulated pipes under sinks and appliances near exterior walls.

Run of the Month The Elmhurst Fire Department received the Elmhurst Edwards Healthcare "Run of the Year" for 2019. This is the third year in a row that firefighters and paramedics have been awarded this honor. This year's incident was for treatment provided to a patient who was in cardiac arrest. The patient had lost consciousness and drove his vehicle up onto a front lawn where he was unresponsive. Upon arrival of our first responders the patient was removed from the vehicle, treated for his symptoms, and a clear report was given to Elmhurst Hospital so cardiac catheterization lab could be put on standby. The patient received additional treatment and was discharged a week later.

All Aboard for New 'On the Right Track' Exhibit On October 25, 1848, the first Galena & Chicago Union train rolled west from Chicago and chugged its way to the end of the line in what is now Oak Park. This historic moment ushered in a new era in transportation, especially for small towns developing west of the city like Cottage Hill (Elmhurst's original name). The expansion of the railroads put many towns on the map, forever shaping regional settlement in Chicago, its suburbs, and throughout the Midwest.



The Elmhurst History Museum explores 170 years of railroading history in the new exhibit, "On the Right Track: By Rail to Chicago & Beyond." Stormwater Update In

2019, the City of Elmhurst completed two large-scale infrastructure projects aimed at reducing overland flooding



in southwest Elmhurst. These projects were the Southwest Elmhurst Stormwater Mitigation Project (SESMP) - Phase I and Phase II. They will collectively provide flood reduction benefits for the neighborhood bounded by Spring Road, Jackson Street, Bryan Street, and Butterfield Road. Included are 2 new detention basins, with a total capacity of 31.2 ac-ft (equal to over 23 football field covered in 1 foot of water), that will store overland flood waters during extreme rain events. Collectively, these two significant projects will assist 121 homeowners in the southwest side of Elmhurst. In total, the City has completed 11 projects since 2015 throughout Elmhurst, creating more than 112 ac-ft of new storage with construction costs over \$25M, to help over 350 homes.

The City has also purchased homes in the Saylor/Swain/Vallette neighborhood in an effort to continue mitigation throughout Elmhurst. The City is currently investigating all possible engineering options to assist residents in this neighborhood who experience structural flooding. Engineering will be on-going through the winter of 2019-2020.


