Mayor's Message

This past November, I had an opportunity to host a Community Conversation presented by the City's Senior Citizens Commission. The event was held at the Elmhurst Park District Centennial Park facility, a wonderful new space for our community. We are thankful that this new facility will allow the senior population to return to activities enjoyed before the pandemic. During the Community Conversation, I enjoyed learning



more about the many services provided for our seniors. In addition to my comments, our new police and fire chiefs presented programs and services offered to seniors by their departments. Services for seniors were also featured by the Elmhurst Park District, the Elmhurst Library, City Hall staff and Metropolitan Family Services. In this column, I will address some of the many services offered to seniors, but I also want to invite and encourage you to view the Community Conversation event on cable or online at **ElmhurstTV.com**.

Since the onset of the pandemic, many of us have delt with pain, challenges, isolation, and struggle. We understand that this has been particularly challenging for our senior population. On Nov. 15, DuPage County launched 211 – a free, confidential information and referral service that will provide a central access point to local health and human services 24-hours a day, 365 days a year to talk to a trained support specialist who will listen and connect you to the appropriate resource tailored for each caller's specific needs, We want you to know that we are here to help, you can call us 24/7 at 630-530-3050.

The City provides support through its own programs and through the Senior Citizen's Commission. Following is a small list of services provided in Elmhurst specifically for seniors: home delivered meals, counseling services, tax programs, social services programs, transportation services, support groups, virtual exercise, recreation, and library classes, along with Elmhurst TV programming specifically for seniors.

Our police and fire departments offer a long list of programs that help support the safety and security of our senior population. Please visit **Elmhurst.org** for more information on the following public safety services/programs:

The Elmhurst Police Department Offers: SALT (Seniors & Law Enforcement Together) Program, Citizen's Police Academy, Neighborhood Roll Call, Prescription Drug Collection Box Programs, Neighborhood Patrol Request, Scam Alerts, and Home Crime Prevention Safety Inspection.

The Elmhurst Fire Department Offers: Installation of Knox Boxes (which provide rapid emergency access to residential properties without damage to doors), smoke detector installation, home fire safety inspections, trip and fall prevention programs, CodeRED Alert, and Smart 911.

Additionally, during the pandemic, the City launched "Elmhurst Connect," a new service that allows you to easily report non-emergency service requests to the City. You can find this on **Elmhurst.org/ElmhurstConnect** or by downloading the "Elmhurst Connect" app on your phone.

I would like to thank our senior community for their resilience through the challenges of the pandemic. I would be remiss if I did not pause to remember that the pandemic took the lives of many of our cherished community members. Our prayers go out to the family and friends of those who were lost. Remember, the City of Elmhurst is here to help.

Finally, my personal best wishes to you for a happy, safe and healthy holiday season.

Winter Driving Tips

Elmhurst Police see an increase in traffic crashes when driving conditions are less than optimal. Many crashes can be prevented if motorists follow these tips:

- Slow down! It's much harder to control or stop your vehicle on a slick or snow covered surface.
- When driving, increase your following distances enough so there will be plenty of time to stop for vehicles ahead of you.
- Prevent theft by never leaving your car unattended with its key or fob inside when warming up.

Shopper Safety Tips

- Only bring necessary cash, cards, and identification and do not leave your purse or bags unattended.
- When placing shopping bags in your vehicle, put them in the trunk where they are out of sight. Be sure to remember



to lock your vehicle when entering stores.

- Be cautious of strangers approaching you for any reason.
- Con artists will try to distract you with the intention of taking money/belongings.
- If shopping online, be careful of online scams. There will be plenty of fake bargains so if it sounds too good to be true it probably is! Only make purchases from reputable websites and do research on websites you are unsure about.
- Have a safe shopping trip by being alert and following these tips!

Going Away This Winter? Avoid Frozen Pipes

These few simple steps could keep you from encountering frozen pipes

- Schedule an appointment to have your water shut off to the house by calling the Water Billing Department at 630-530-3110/3111.
- You can also shut the water off inside the house by closing the main water valve located before the water meter that is normally located in the basement or in a utility closet.

Here are some other ways to avoid frozen water pipes this coming winter.

- Keep garage doors closed, especially if there are water supply lines in the garage.
- Open kitchen and bathroom cabinet doors to allow warmer air to circulate around the plumbing, especially if your sinks are on an exterior wall.
- Let the cold water drip from a faucet served by exposed pipes. Running water through the pipe—even at a trickle—helps prevent pipes from freezing.

Holiday Fire Safety Tips

 Half of the home decoration fires in December are started by candles. Keep candles at least 12 in. away from anything that burns.



- A dry Christmas tree burns fast. Keep your tree watered.
- More than 1 in every 5 Christmas tree fires were caused by a heat source too close to the tree. Make sure your leave tree is at least 3 ft. away from any heat sources like space heaters, radiators, fireplaces, candles or heat vents.

Winter Fire Safety Tips

- Install and test carbon monoxide alarms at least once a month.
- Have a qualified professional clean and inspect your chimney and furnace every year.
- Store cooled ashes in a tightly covered metal container, and keep it outside at least 10 feet from your home and nearby buildings.
- Plug only 1 heat-producing appliance (such as a space heater) into an electrical outlet at a time.

Keep Hydrants Clear

Help us help you! Please help us keep hydrants clear of snow and please don't blow or shovel snow into the streets!



Prevent Package Theft

During the holidays there are more opportunities for packages to be stolen. Follow the Elmhurst Police Department's tips to prevent package theft:

- When making a purchase online, choose a specific delivery time if the retailer provides the option. If purchasing from a large retailer, consider having it delivered for pick-up at one of their local stores.
- If the package is being delivered to your home, take advantage of delivery alerts so you can be notified when the package arrives. Ask a trusted neighbor to take your package inside if you are unavailable to accept the delivery yourself.
- When possible, request the delivery company to hold your package at their closest pick-up facility until you can pick it up. You can also ask the shipper to require a signature confirmation of delivery to prevent packages being left when no one is home to sign. It can be helpful to provide delivery instructions so packages can be left out of sight from the front yard/road.
- Take advantage of delivery options and be vigilant in your neighborhood and report any suspicious activity to the Elmhurst Police Department.



City of Elmhurst Mitten Tree Collection Help kids, teens and adults stay warm this winter by donating gloves, mittens, scarves and socks to our Mitten Tree. Fasten your donations on the Christmas tree in the center foyer of City Hall (209 N. York St.). Clothes pins are in the basket at the Fire Department Administration counter. Mittens, socks, scarves and gloves will be distributed by the Yorkfield Food Pantry in Elmhurst. The Mitten Tree will accept donations until December 31st.

Keep the Wreath Red This holiday fire safety program

is designed to increase fire safety awareness. A holiday wreath will hang on the outside of both fire stations. In the event of a holiday-related fire, firefighters will replace one of the red bulbs with a white one. The goal is to keep the bulbs on that wreath red by minimizing household fires. Fire safety reminders for a safe holiday season include keeping live Christmas trees watered, making sure all illuminated decorations, and your fireplace are in good condition, using candles with



caution, not overloading extension cords or outlets with excessive holiday lights, and making sure smoke detectors work.

Stay Hydrated During
Winter Months During the
warm summer months, it is easy
to remember to drink plenty
of water and fluids, but do you
think about your water intake
during the winter? Staying

adequately hydrated during



the winter is just as important as it is in the summer, when higher temperatures and outdoor activities promote the need for nourishment. Environmental humidity, as well as central heating units in homes and buildings, create a drier condition. The human kidneys also excrete more fluid in cold environments. Even if you are not sweating, dehydration conditions can occur and even go unnoticed. Even minor dehydration, to the point a person feels thirsty, has been linked to difficulty concentrating, poor memory, and bad moods, as well as health concerns regarding inflammation, artery stiffness, blood pressure regulation, and other factors that can raise the risk of heart attack and stroke.



Winter Weather As we continue to move into the winter season, bitter cold



temperatures will become more prevalent. The Elmhurst Fire Department urges all citizens to take steps to prepare themselves for extreme cold temperatures. When outside, dress appropriately and maintain personal awareness. Prepare an emergency supply kit for your home and a winter kit for your vehicle(s). Residents are encouraged to check on elderly neighbors and family members to ensure they are safe and as comfortable as possible. If anyone needs urgent medical treatment, contact g11 immediately. Visit elmhurst. org for a list of recommended items to have and visit weather.gov/safety/winter for current information on winter weather advisories.

Snow Removal Procedures Following a snowfall, main roads are cleared first, followed by neighborhood streets and other less-traveled roadways. Snow is typically removed from the center to the curb in a series of four passes. Residents are reminded to please wait until City crews have completed their work before clearing your driveway approach because it is not possible to complete plowing without pushing some snow onto driveway approaches.

During plowing operations, windrows of snow may be created in the center of the street and then removed during the nighttime hours when there are fewer



vehicles to impede the process. Please avoid shoveling or blowing snow into the street when you are clearing your property. Residents can also help by clearing snow from fire hydrants to help firefighters locate them quickly in an emergency. It is important for residents to clear their sidewalks so children can walk safely to school and people have a safe walkway. Please remember that parking is not permitted on City streets for eight hours following a snowfall of two inches or more.

Seniors and Law Enforcement Together (SALT)

SALT is a cooperative effort between the Elmhurst Police

Department and the senior citizens who reside or work in the community. SALT's mission is to reduce crimes against seniors

Utility Billing Residents and businesses served by City of Elmhurst water, sewer, and refuse can receive their bills via regular mail only (default method), e-mail only, or by both e-mail and regular mail. If you would like to start receiving your bill via e-mail, simply go to the City of Elmhurst website, **elmhurst.org** and click on the payments tab at the bottom right of the page. Following the directions, users can view billing history for their account and sign up for e-billing.

Residents and businesses can also sign up for E-Z Payment, whereby utility bill payments are paid electronically from the customer's bank account on the due date. New Exhibit Considers the Journeys of Area Immigrants

The U.S. is home to over 40 million immigrants, more than any other country in the world. Although Chicago has always been a hub for immigrant workers, suburbs like Elmhurst have become home to a larger and more diverse foreign-born population since World War II. The result is a visible diversity in the DuPage County area, which is evident not only in religious sites, schools, businesses, and restaurants but also in the growth of activist groups and civic participation.

The Elmhurst History Museum presents a new exhibit to explore the unique journeys of area immigrants and their descendants who have carved out a sense of cultural identity and belonging in this region. "In Pursuit of Happiness: Immigrants in Our Communities" opened in October and will run through May 14, 2023 at the museum which is located at 120 E. Park Ave. in Elmhurst. The exhibit explores the personal stories and pursuits of immigrant residents and their families through first-person interviews, photographs, treasured objects and more to reveal the challenges, pride, perseverance, and humor in establishing a new life.

"In Pursuit of Happiness: Immigrants in Our Communities" is co-curated by exhibit consultant and Elmhurst resident Sandy Denninger who researched and wrote the exhibit content. To

develop the exhibit, Denninger interviewed 17 area residents (several from Elmhurst), and she was often impressed and surprised by the powerful, candid stories she heard from interview subjects. "This experience was an eye-opener for me as both a fellow American and historian," said Denninger. "I was moved by the honesty, strength and humor I encountered throughout this process. My hope is that visitors who see the exhibit will feel the same empathy I experienced and take away a better understanding of what it means to be an immigrant in our country."



The exhibit considers the often-challenging path to U.S. citizenship that includes essential documentation, language barriers, prejudice, and more. Visitors can take an actual citizenship test and view video interviews to hear about the immigrants' diverse experiences in their own words. Many of the participants shared personal belongings, traditions, and foods from their countries of origin that have been passed down through generations that help their families to retain a sense of cultural identity.

The Elmhurst History Museum has planned many special programs related to the exhibit in the coming months to connect to "In Pursuit of Happiness: Immigrants in our Communities", which can be found in the calendar section of this newsletter. In addition, a performance by the Chicago Immigrant Orchestra at Elmhurst University, Spring Break programming, and a special exhibit-ending celebration on Museum Day in May are in the works, so watch for more details soon on our website at **elmhursthistory.org**.
