## Safety Starts with Us

This spring, the City of Elmhurst will be launching a new marketing campaign themed, "A Safer Community: Speed Awareness & Traffic Safety."

The goal of this campaign is to improve traffic safety in our community through public education and data analysis.

Educational and promotional materials will include the message, "Safety Starts with Us," followed by an actionable way in which neighbors can look out for each other's safety and well-being. Marketing materials will consist of neighborhood yard signs, bumper stickers, posters, and magnets.

The timely launch of the campaign aligns with National Distracted Driving Awareness Month in April. Distracted driving is one of the fastest growing safety issues on the roads today. Distracted drivers aren't just a threat to themselves; they are a danger to everyone else on the road. Distractions such as cell phones and taking your eyes off the road can lead to tragedy.

Traffic report data shows that the majority of speeding and traffic violations on residential streets are committed by residents. We all know the frustrations of juggling a busy schedule, but speed limits are put in place to protect all road users. That includes cyclists, pedestrians, motorists, pets... all of us! When you disobey the rules of the road, you put your community at risk. Safety starts with us, so let's all do our part to improve the safety in our community.

With this campaign, we aim to improve the environment and quality of life in Elmhurst through public safety education, encouragement, and enforcement.

## City of Elmhurst Senior Safety Symposium

The City of Elmhurst and the City's Senior Citizens Commission present an event catered to safety and City services we offer related to our senior citizen residents. This new event will be held on April 26th at 10:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. at

## Use Rain as a Resource with Rain Barrels!

Rain barrels are a great way to capture water and put it to good use. Rain barrels are large containers that capture stormwater from your roof that would otherwise be lost as runoff. Modern rain barrels are sealed, safe around children, and insect resistant – they can even be painted or decorated to your liking. You can divert water from your downspout to fill your rain barrel and a hose spigot on the front makes the water easy to access and use.



Around 40% of the total household water used during the summer months is for watering lawns and gardens. Rainwater doesn't contain chlorine, lime, or calcium which makes it ideal for watering your flowers and vegetable garden or washing your car or windows. You may even notice a decrease in your water bill!

The Conservation Foundation sells rain barrels year-round through a partnership with Upcycle Products, Inc. The 55-gallon rain barrels are made of recycled food-grade plastic, come in a variety of colors, and can be purchased online for \$64.50 (plus tax). Home delivery is available for an additional \$32.50.

There will be a local pickup the first Saturday of each month from April - September from 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. at the Water Reclamation Facility (625 S. Rte. 83 Elmhurst). Barrels can also be purchased in person at The Conservation Foundation's headquarters at McDonald Farm (10S404 Knoch Knolls Rd., Naperville). ## Mayor's Message



Recently I was honored to give an update on the State of Our City, where I shared some of our City's accomplishments and reviewed plans for the near future. Below are a few topics that were covered; I encourage you to watch the video for the full overview on the City's YouTube page, ElmhurstTV.

**City Finances:** The City maintains a AAA rating and our general fund balance remains within the recommended reserve level as a "rainy day" fund. Non-property tax revenues were up significantly which allowed the City to pass a flat property tax levy in 2022, which will be reflected in tax bills received in 2023. This means that you will likely see a decrease in property tax payable to the City of Elmhurst. The City impacts 6% of the property tax bill, but property tax only accounts for 18% of the City's revenues. Last year, I reported that in 2021 we saw sales and income tax revenue well above 2019, the year before the pandemic began. Non property tax revenues continue to increase (about 8% in 2022) and sales tax makes up about 26% of revenue.

**Community Development & Planning:** The increase in development in our town is undeniable. It must be controlled and done right, which takes a great amount of planning and review. City Council has advocated and refined development in the last several years, and we believe that will continue in the future. In 2022, there was a 12% increase in permits issued from the previous year with a total construction value of approximately \$180 million. Major projects approved or started in 2022 include the Ryan Company's 200-unit luxury apartment complex on First and Haven and the Eldridge townhome expansion of 50 townhomes on Butterfield Rd. Our "Business Park" area saw an expansion from Krueger Steel with 24,352 sq feet of additional warehouse and office space. Elmhurst currently has a retail vacancy rate of less than 2%, decreasing for the fourth year in a row. Many new shops and restaurants in the area are highlighted on page 8 of this newsletter.

**Public Safety:** Our vital city services including Public Works, Police and Fire were also highlighted in my State of the City comments. One area to point out is our priority this year in traffic safety studies and education. Last year, I identified as a council priority the start of neighborhood traffic studies. The first study is being conducted in the college view area, and aimed to evaluate the uncontrolled intersections and those with traffic controls and stop/yield signs for consistency and better traffic flow. The goal will be to study areas of the city annually and implement consistent changes based on the findings. Along with this process, the City will also launch a public safety educational campaign themed, "Safety Starts with Us". Information about this program can be found on the first page of this newsletter.

The work that we do is truly a team effort that takes time, collaboration, and detailed planning. Thank you to everyone who contributes their time and talents to the City of Elmhurst, this includes city council members, city commissioners, and city staff along with our community partners. I wish you all a Happy Spring and look forward to seeing many of you at upcoming local events.

## CodeRED

CodeRED is an emergency alert system to call, email, or text residents to alert them of major emergency situations. ## Prescription Drug Takeback Event

The Elmhurst Police Department will hold a prescription drug "Takeback" on Saturday, April 22nd from 10:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. in the Police Station parking lot (125 E. First St.). This opportunity allows residents to take advantage of "drive through drop-off." A small tent will be set up in the west lot and staffed by police personnel for easy drop off of prescription drugs without leaving your vehicle. ## Severe Weather Warnings

Spring weather can bring severe storms to the area. When severe weather, such as a tornado threatens the community, outdoor warning sirens will be activated. If severe weather is approaching Elmhurst and the warning sirens are heard, seek shelter immediately and monitor a television or radio for further instructions. The City activates a monthly scheduled test of the City's emergency outdoor warning siren system at 10:00 a.m. on the first Tuesday of every month. If you hear the alarm at this time, please be reminded that it is only a test. Sign up at [www.weather.com](http://www.weather.com) to receive notifications of severe weather conditions.

## Fire Safety in Your Home

### Working Smoke Alarms Are a Must

Smoke alarms are a key part of a home fire escape plan.

- Install smoke alarms on every level of your home, inside bedrooms and outside sleeping areas on the ceiling or high on the wall
- Use special alarms with strobe lights and bed shakers for people who are hard of hearing or deaf
- Test smoke alarms monthly
- Replace batteries in your smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors annually
- Replace smoke alarms that are 10 or more years old with a sealed lithium battery

### Make an Escape Plan and Practice It

Once a smoke alarm sounds a fire can spread quickly, leaving only a minute or two to escape. That's why it's important to have a home escape plan and practice a home fire drill.

- Start by drawing a map of your home and plan two ways to escape from each room
- Make sure all doors and windows leading outside open easily
- Identify secondary routes: a window onto an adjacent roof or a collapsible ladder from a second-floor window
- If you live in a multi-story building, plan to use the stairs – never the elevator
- Designate an outside meeting place a safe distance from the house
- Practice getting out with eyes closed, crawling low to the floor and keeping your mouth covered
- Practice how to "stop, drop and roll" if your clothes catch on fire
- Practice testing door handles to see if they are hot before opening them and closing doors behind you
- Teach children never to hide and how to escape on their own in case you can't help them

### When and How to Use a Fire Extinguisher

Always put your safety first; if you are not confident in your ability to use a fire extinguisher, get out and call 9-1-1. Quickly evaluate the situation and ensure:

- Everyone has left the home and the fire department has been called
- The fire is small, not spreading, and there is not much smoke
- Your back is to an exit you can use quickly
- When using a fire extinguisher, remember the acronym PASS: Pull the pin, Aim low at the base of the fire, Squeeze the handle slowly and Sweep the nozzle side to side

The Elmhurst Fire Department is ready to help our residents and business owners in any way to prevent a fire. Contact the Fire Department Administration at 630-530-3090 with any questions or to schedule an appointment.

**Spring Clean-Up** The City's annual Spring Clean-Up will be held on the following **Saturdays**: April 22nd for those with a Wednesday garbage pick-up, April 29th for those with a Thursday pick-up, and May 6th for those with a Friday pick-up. For a complete list of acceptable and unacceptable items, visit the City's website at [elmhurst.org](http://elmhurst.org). Items other than large appliances, furniture, and bulk pieces must be placed in bags, cans or boxes weighing no more than 50 lbs. each.

**Citizens Police Academy, Spring 2023** The Citizens Police Academy is a 12-week program designed to give Elmhurst citizens a working knowledge of their police department and of general law enforcement practices. The program provides participants with a better understanding of some of the challenges faced by police officers in the field. Each weekly block of instruction is held from 6:30 p.m.-9:30 p.m. on consecutive Wednesday evenings. The next session begins on Wednesday, March 8th and continues through May 24, 2023. The program is free of charge and is limited to 25 students per session. Participants must be over the age of 21 and live or work in the City of Elmhurst. **Keep Inlets Clean** To lessen street flooding, the City is asking the public to help clean the inlets and storm drains in front of their residences or businesses. Use a rake or a shovel to clear leaves, limbs, and debris from the storm drain. Do not put your feet or hands into the storm drain because of potential hazards that have collected in the drain. Do not try to remove the grate, only the debris on top of the grate. The best time to inspect the storm drain in front of your house or business is prior to a rain event and right after a rain, snow, or ice storm. If a clogged storm drain cannot be cleared, notify the City at 630-530-3000.

**Arbor Day is Friday, April 28, 2023!** On this day, we celebrate the importance of trees. Elmhurst is known for its tree-lined streets, and we appreciate all that our Forestry Division does to keep those trees healthy and vibrant! Elmhurst has 30 different varieties of trees throughout the City. The Department plants around 650 trees each year and has an ongoing tree-trimming schedule with a goal to touch every public tree in Elmhurst at least once every eight years. When it comes to the health of trees, dangers can include incorrect mulching, dealing with Emerald Ash Borer, and Dutch Elm Disease. Forestry can be a dangerous job and safety is a primary concern when it comes to staff. Residents are urged to call professionals rather than try to trim trees themselves. **Vehicle Sticker Reminder** City vehicle stickers must be purchased and displayed by May 1st on all vehicles registered or garaged within City limits. Stickers are sold at a discount from March 1st through April 30th. Applications will be mailed to residents. Stickers can be purchased in person, online or by mail. Money collected through the sale of vehicle stickers is used for roadway maintenance and construction.



### Reminder of the City of Elmhurst Garbage Container Regulations:

- Containers should be placed at the edge of the sidewalk or in the parkway adjoining such premises (not in the street)
- Containers should not be put out for pickup sooner than 24 hours prior to scheduled pick up
- Containers should not be left out for more than 12 hours after scheduled pick up
- Bulk items require stickers to be picked up. If you are unaware of how to obtain these stickers please reach out to the City at 630-530-3020
- Containers should be covered so that contents are not blown or scattered or accessible to rodents and animals
- Replacement containers can be requested through the City's Elmhurst Connect Mobile App or at [elmhurst.org/elmhurstconnect](http://elmhurst.org/elmhurstconnect)

## Protect Your Water

Don't pour hazardous waste down the drain, such as motor oil, pesticides, paint, mothballs, household cleaners, pharmaceuticals, and many other items containing toxins. These contaminants can travel through the sewer system and could damage the treatment process at water reclamation facilities as well as being contained in the discharge water to the waterways of the state and country.



If you see it, report it. If you see someone discharging something questionable or dangerous into a storm water system, report it to the police and alert your water department. There are several ways to be a part of this effort. The Illinois EPA website [www.illinois.gov/epa](http://www.illinois.gov/epa) has information to help this effort. It's everyone's responsibility to help protect our water commodity. Let's do our part.

## 2023 Capital Improvement Projects

### 2023 Watermain Improvement Project

The 2023 Watermain Improvement Project includes the replacement and installation of new watermain along West Lake Street frontage road, Larch Avenue, and Armitage Avenue. The planned watermain replacement will benefit the area in several ways. First, the improvements will upsize the existing watermain from an 8" to a 10". This upsizing will replace the existing watermain that is almost 100 years old. The oldest section of this existing watermain along Armitage has been experiencing a high number of breaks in recent years. Second, the project will fill in a 600-foot gap in the City's watermain system. This will ensure the ability to provide water to several properties along Lake Street that either don't have domestic water at all or are currently on a ground water well. Third, the improvements will increase both fire flow and pressure reliability to the area. The project is anticipated to begin after May 1st and is estimated to conclude by October 31st.



### North York Street Resurfacing

The City of Elmhurst has received Federal grant dollars for roadway resurfacing improvements along North York Street from Crestview Avenue to Grand Avenue. The project will primarily be a resurfacing of the existing roadway pavement, but this project will also allow the City to provide additional improvements to the North York Street corridor. Included in the scope of the project are ADA sidewalk upgrades, a designated mid-block pedestrian crossing installation with flashing beacons, spot curb and gutter repairs, new raised medians with landscaping, widening on Belden Avenue to accommodate a new designated westbound right-turn lane, bi-directional turn lane improvements, and sidewalk repairs. Work is expected to commence in the summer and be completed by the fall.



### 2023 Contract Paving Program

The Contract Paving Program is an annual roadway improvement program. This project will provide for the grinding and bituminous overlay of various asphalt and concrete streets with either segmental or full curb and gutter replacement. Maintenance of municipal parking lots and alleys, as needed, can also be included in this program. Other work to these select locations may include: utility structure adjustments, sanitary manhole rehabilitations, related storm sewer work, paving of driveway approaches, sidewalk ramp improvements for ADA compliance, restoration of parkways, and traffic control. Work is expected to begin in May and continue through September. Residents who live on affected streets will be given notice prior to work commencing.



## In Pursuit of Happiness Exhibit Continues through May 14th

The Elmhurst History Museum's latest exhibit, *In Pursuit of Happiness: Immigrants in Our Communities*, continues a successful run this spring exploring the personal stories and experiences of area immigrants – including a number of Elmhurst residents – through first-person accounts and treasured objects. The exhibit was guest curated by Elmhurst local Sandy Denninger, who spent many hours researching and interviewing participants to obtain firsthand accounts of their experiences. The result is a poignant, timely story of what it means to be an immigrant and an American.

**Earth Day is April 22nd!** Earth Day will be celebrated around the world on Saturday, April 22, 2023. The theme for Earth Day 2023 is "INVEST IN OUR PLANET." Here are some simple things that you can do to make a difference:

**Federal Funding for Small Businesses** On December 6, 2022, the U.S. Department of the Treasury announced that Illinois will receive up to \$354.6 million to administer four programs as part of the State Small Business Credit Initiative (SSBCI). The programs include:

- Advantage Illinois, an existing program which provides favorable funding terms through a loan participation model;
- A new Advantage Illinois loan guarantee model, which will support businesses that have had difficulty receiving loans;
- A new venture capital direct equity program that will support emerging technologies and industries; and,
- A climate bank finance program to issue loans to small businesses in the clean energy space.

SSBCI was reauthorized as part of the American Rescue Plan Act and provides \$10 billion to states for assistance to small businesses. Illinois is one of seven states approved to receive funding. Some grant programs are active and others will launch soon. Interested businesses should visit <https://dceo.illinois.gov>.
