The route travels to different shopping districts in Elmhurst, making stops near shops, restaurants, and entertainment. I hope you have had the opportunity to enjoy the "Umbrella Sky Elmhurst" installation in downtown Elmhurst. This colorful world-famous installation is the sixth in the U.S., and can be found at three locations: Schiller Court, in front of the Elmhurst Library and Art Museum, and at 255 N. York Stage. Community Safety

CodeRED CodeRED is an emergency alert system used to call, email, or text residents to alert them of major emergency situations. Residents can register their home, cell, and work phone numbers to be sure they always receive alerts. Sign up online at elmhurst.org/codered or download the CodeRED mobile app to be sure you never miss an emergency notification.

Call J.U.L.I.E. Before You Dig If you are planning any home improvement projects that involve digging, remember to call J.U.L.I.E. (811 from a cell phone or 800-892-0123) before beginning work. J.U.L.I.E. will notify member utility companies to send locators to mark their underground utilities with paint and/or flags. Once you know the approximate location of utility lines, you can dig safely.



Be SMART for Kids Gun violence is now the leading cause of death for children in America according to the United States Center for Disease Control (CDC). If you, your loved ones, or your child's caretaker have access to a firearm, the City of Elmhurst and the Elmhurst Police Department remind you to secure your firearms. Securing your firearms in your homes and vehicles will ensure children do not gain access to them. Hiding a gun is not securing a gun. The City and Police recommend the following when it comes to securing a firearm:

- **Unload:** Remove all ammunition from the firearm, including removing any chambered rounds.
- **Lock:** Secure guns with a firearm locking device, such as a jacket lock, or in a locked location, like a safe or lockbox. The safest is a biometric lock which you set up for only the firearm owner to access.
- **Separate:** Store ammunition in a secure location separate from the firearm.

Be SMART for kids is a campaign that focuses on education and awareness about child gun deaths and secure gun storage. Be SMART volunteers encourage parents and caretakers to "Be SMART" and take these five simple steps to help prevent shootings by children:

- Secure all guns in your homes and vehicles
- Model responsible behavior around guns
- Ask about unsecured guns in other homes
- Recognize the role of guns in suicide
- Tell your peers to Be SMART

Summer Safety Tips

Fire Safety

- Use chimneys, outdoor fireplaces, and fire pits outdoors only and at least 10 feet away from your home or anything that can burn.
- Build campfires at least 25 feet away from tents, shrubs, and anything that can burn.
- Use propane, charcoal, and wood pellet barbecue grills outdoors only. Indoor use can cause a fire or carbon monoxide poisoning. Place your grill well away from siding and deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches. Do not store or use a grill on a porch or balcony.
- If you want to see fireworks, go to a public show put on by experts. Sparklers can reach 1,200 °F and cause third-degree burns.



Water & Biking Safety

- Never swim near a boat, marina, or boat launching ramp.
- Always use U.S. Coast Guard-approved life safety jackets.
- Adults need to stay with children when they are around water.
- Keep the pool and deck clear of floats, balls, and toys after you get out of the pool.
- Always swim with a buddy.
- Always wear a bike helmet and bright clothes when cycling so people can see you. Put reflectors on your bike.
- Ride with both hands on the handlebars. Ride in single file with traffic. Stop at all stop signs and obey traffic lights.

SLOW DOWN! Safety Starts with Us Distracted driving is one of the fastest growing safety issues on the roads today. Distracted drivers aren't just a threat to themselves; they are a danger to everyone else on the road. Distractions such as cell phones and taking your eyes off the road can lead to tragedy.

Traffic report data shows that the **majority of speeding and traffic violations on neighborhood streets are committed by residents.** In 2022, the Elmhurst Police Department investigated 1307 traffic crashes. A contributing cause of over 1/3 of those crashes was related to speed.

Many of us know the frustrations of juggling a busy schedule, but speed limits are put in place to protect all road users. That includes cyclists, pedestrians, motorists, pets... all of us! When you disobey the rules of the road, you put your community at risk.

Safety starts with us, so let's all do our part to improve safety in our community.



Neighborhood Roll Call The Elmhurst Police Department hosts the Neighborhood Roll Call program throughout the summer months in which Elmhurst Police Officers visit neighborhoods around the City and talk with residents. This is an opportunity for citizens to get to know the officers in their community, as well as become up to date on City events and to ask questions. Save Our Pets Program Keep your pets safe in the event of an emergency! The Elmhurst Fire Department is encouraging all pet owners to participate in the City's "Save Our Pets" program. The purpose of the program is to allow first responders to quickly identify a home with pets, so that in case of an emergency, they know how many and what type of pets live in the home. Pets are family; let us know who from your pet family we need to rescue in case of an emergency. For more information, visit elmhurst.org/saveourpets.

Have you used Elmhurst Connect? Elmhurst Connect is an online and mobile issue reporting and service request system for the City of Elmhurst. Community members are able to identify issues and report those service requests directly to the City of Elmhurst. Reminder! If you see a street repair that needs to be addressed, please use the Elmhurst Connect system. This allows our streets division to document and quickly respond to the issue. City Street Sweeping The City's street sweeping contractor performs seven Citywide sweeps per year between March and October, approximately once per month. They also perform two fall leaf sweeps which typically occur in October/November/December, depending on weather and the rate at which leaves are falling from the trees. Business districts are swept weekly and City owned parking lots monthly.

Recycling Events The City of Elmhurst hosts a quarterly recycling event for disposing electronics and textiles at the Elmhurst Public Works Facility (985 S. Riverside Dr.). The next drive will take place on July 29th from 8:00 a.m. to noon, and residents are encouraged to drop off any unwanted items that would otherwise end up in a landfill. First Responders Memorial Plaza As Americans, we all have our distinct memories of when we learned of the tragedy of September 11, 2001. Perhaps you watched it live. Maybe you heard about it at work or school. You could have seen it through the media. Regardless, when you learned of it, your life stopped for a moment, the way lives do when you know something just happened that will change the course of human history. A few days after the twin towers fell, Elmhurst firefighters were in New York assisting with making life a bit better in that city...doing their part as first responders. It is a time that none of us should ever forget.

At this time, Elmhurst firefighters, the City of Elmhurst, the businesses of Elmhurst, and the citizens of Elmhurst are moving forward with a new piece of public sculpture created to memorialize the fateful day of 9/11 in our community. With a piece of rail given to the City from the twin towers, local sculptor, Jason Peot, will create a vibrant, moving, multi-faceted, 9/11 memorial to be placed near Fire Station #2 on York Street in Elmhurst.



To complete this project, Elmhurst firefighters will need to raise approximately \$150,000, of which some \$30,000 is already secured. Over the next several months, firefighters will be seeking support for this effort. Contributions of any amount will be sought during this time. Commemorative bricks for the plaza and fire department memorabilia will be available to purchase online to support fundraising efforts at elmhurst.org/firstrespondersmemorial. All events ticket sales hosted by the Fire Department will also go towards the building and maintenance of this plaza. It is hoped that this new sculpture can be created and installed by September 11, 2024. Thank you in advance for your generous consideration.

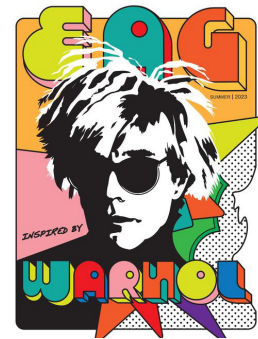

Support Local Farmers Markets Eat fresh! Treat yourself to nutritious foods that benefit your health while also supporting local farmers. The Elmhurst Farmers Market is Elmhurst's great local market and a family-friendly must-do event, popular with locals and visitors alike. Enjoy the market every Wednesday from 7:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. from June to October in the York and Vallette Business District. Follow the Elmhurst Farmers Market on Facebook for regular updates on each week's event!



Use Rain Barrels Rain barrels are large containers that capture stormwater from your roof that would otherwise be lost as runoff. Modern rain barrels are sealed, safe around children, and insect resistant – they can even be painted or decorated to your liking. You can divert water from your downspout to fill your rain barrel and a hose spigot on the front makes the water easy to access and use. Around 40% of the total household water used during the summer months is for watering lawns and gardens. Rainwater doesn't contain chlorine, lime, or calcium, which makes it ideal for watering your flowers and vegetable garden or washing your car or windows. You may even notice a decrease in your water bill!



The Conservation Foundation sells rain barrels year round through a partnership with Upcycle Products, Inc. The 55-gallon rain barrels are made of recycled food grade plastic, come in a variety of colors, and can be purchased online for \$64.50 (plus tax). Home delivery is available for an additional \$32.50. There will be a local pickup the first Saturday of each month from April - September from 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. at the Water Reclamation Facility (625 S. Rte. 83, Elmhurst). Barrels can also be purchased in person at the Conservation Foundation's headquarters at McDonald Farm (10S404 Knoch Knolls Rd., Naperville). Visit elmhurst.org/rainbarrel to purchase your rain barrel for pickup or delivery.

Get Outside Breathe in the fresh air and enjoy all that our City has to offer. Go for a bike ride on the Prairie Path, listen to live music, visit our parks, and enjoy outdoor dining with your family and friends. Whatever you do, put down your electronics for a while each day and engage with your natural surroundings.

Use a Reusable Water Bottle Staying hydrated is important on hot summer days. Make sure you are using a reusable water bottle rather than a disposable one!

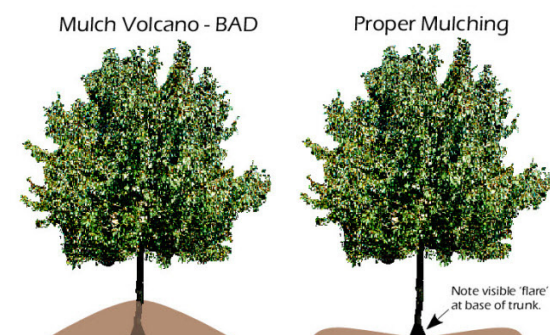
Mulch: Tree's Best Friend or Worst Enemy Mulch is one of the easiest and most protective applications that you can apply. The choice of mulch and overall application can be important to the overall health of the tree. Mulch can be a layer of any substance. Organic or inorganic, it should be applied to the base of the tree forming a flat donut with the trunk in the center. An easy guide to follow is the "3x3x3 rule" or 3 inches of mulch, 3 inches from the trunk, in a 3 foot wide circle.

Volcano Mulching: When Mulch Becomes the Enemy!

As beneficial as mulch is, too much in the wrong distribution can be extremely harmful! Mulch incorrectly applied can actually contribute to the decline of trees. The most common example of this is volcano mulching. volcano mulching is when mulch is piled or mounded right up to the tree trunk, often with a depression at the top to collect water. Volcano mulching can cause:

- Disease and decay due to moisture retention on the trunk
- Insect damage
- Rodent damage
- Girdling roots
- Create conditions that may be too damp or too dry for the root system as water will not be able to penetrate the thick layer of mulch
- Unable to develop proper root flare to help stabilize tree.

You should always be able to see the trunk and the root flare of the tree.

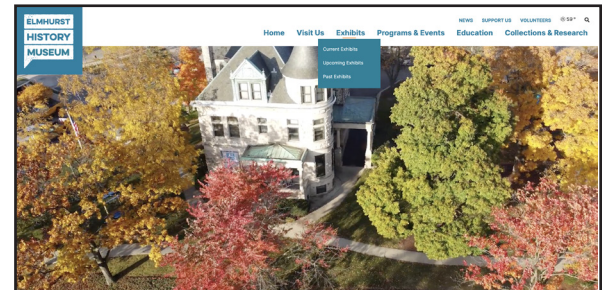
