Mark McDermott, District 7 moved this item as distributed with the Call, duly seconded.

Paul Fattibene, District 10 stated that he would be unable to support the passage of this or any other CBA because of the State's uncertain fiscal health which, in turn has caused the State to cut funding to the Town. He further stated that the passage of any contract which gave raises would be a hardship on the citizenry of the Town.

Bill Gerber, District 2 asked Mr. Fattibene if the Town would save if the Body did not approve this contract and then it was brought to arbitration. He stated that sometimes voting down an expenditure even during a fiscal crisis leads to greater costs.

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Mr. Fattibene replied that the Town's residents are facing stagnant salaries, and higher taxes because of the tax burdens placed on the Town by the State, and so, he believed that the Towns' fiscal health would be a factor to be considered if any contract did go to arbitration.

A number of committee members attended the public information meeting on the toxic fill that was deposited at the town dump by Julian enterprises. The State Department Environmental Protection Agency is still investigating and taking soil samples. The committee discussed the possibility of filing a criminal complaint, citing CGA 53a-119, "defrauding a public community" which is a felony under State Law. This criminal investigation would run parallel to any civil proceeding. However, the consensus of the committee was that there was not enough information to support that at this time.
