TO HEAR, CONSIDER AND ACT UPON THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AS RECOMMENDED BY THE BOARD OF FINANCE: "RESOLVED, THAT THE 20 YEAR BOND RESOLUTION ENTITLED, 'A RESOLUTION APPROPRIATING \$3,214,000 FOR THE COSTS OF CERTAIN NON-RECURRING CAPITAL PROJECTS AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION,' BE, AND HEREBY IS, APPROVED."

March Spolyar, District 4 moved this Item as distributed with the Call, duly seconded.

Pamela Iacono, District 8 and Jill Vergara, District 7 presented a joint request that the Internal Auditor consider reviewing emergency bid protocols and perform audits of the instances that required the use of emergency bid forms, like the purchase of the trash compactors; and make appropriate recommendations, if any, to ensure that emergency bid waiver requests are being followed as outlined in policy.

We also recommend that the review of the Purchasing Policy be placed on a future Board of Finance agenda as the current policy is now 9 years old, and the policy itself calls for Board of Finance review every 2 to 3 years.

Many issues were raised regarding proper protocols being followed; this is a fair and appropriate request to address concerns that are shared by all members of the Body.

VOTE: The 20-year bond resolution in the amount of \$3,214,000 was approved by unanimous voice vote.

ITEM NO. 11 ON CALL:

TO HEAR, CONSIDER AND ACT UPON THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AS RECOMMENDED BY THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN: "RESOLVED, THAT THE TOWN OF FAIRFIELD AUTHORIZES THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE TOWN OF FAIRFIELD TO APPLY TO THE CONNECTICUT COMMISSIONER OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES AND TO ACCEPT OR REJECT A GRANT FOR THE OSBORN HILL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PARTIAL ROOF REPLACEMENT PROJECT AT OSBORN HILL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL; AND FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE OSBORN HILL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL BUILDING COMMITTEE IS HEREBY ESTABLISHED AS THE BUILDING COMMITTEE WITH REGARD TO THE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PARTIAL ROOF REPLACEMENT PROJECT AT OSBORN HILL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL; AND FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE TOWN OF FAIRFIELD HEREBY AUTHORIZES AT LEAST THE PREPARATION OF SCHEMATIC DRAWINGS AND OUTLINE SPECIFICATIONS FOR THE OSBORN HILL

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PARTIAL ROOF REPLACEMENT PROJECT AT OSBORN HILL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL."

Sharon Pistilli, District 3 moved this Item as distributed with the Call, duly seconded.

Angelus Papageorge, Exec. Dir. of BOE Operations explained the resolutions are necessary to apply for grants and reimbursement from the State of Connecticut. Veronica Monahan, District 1 asked for clarification that it is a partial replacement to which Mr. Papageorge replied affirmatively.

VOTE: The resolution regarding the Osborn Hill partial roof replacement was approved by unanimous voice vote.

ITEM NO. 12 ON CALL:

TO HEAR, CONSIDER AND ACT UPON THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AS RECOMMENDED BY THE BOARD OF FINANCE: "RESOLVED, THAT THE BOND RESOLUTION ENTITLED, 'RESOLUTION APPROPRIATING \$1,409,046 FOR THE COSTS OF REPLACING A PORTION OF THE ROOF AT OSBORN HILL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION,' BE, AND HEREBY IS, APPROVED."

Jill Vergara, District 7moved this Item as distributed with the Call, duly seconded.

Mr. Papageorge explained they work with local building contractors to assist in developing the project cost estimates which also lends itself to keeping the bidders "legitimate". In response to Elizabeth Altobelli, District 10 he further explained that this appropriation includes, engineering, construction administration and warranties costs.

Marisa Ringel, District 10 stated she thinks the \$1.4 million for the project is excessive.

VOTE: The bond appropriation in the amount of \$1,409,046 for partial roof replacement at Osborn Hill School was approved by unanimous voice vote.

ITEM NO. 13 ON CALL:

TO HEAR, CONSIDER AND ACT UPON THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AS RECOMMENDED BY THE BOARD OF FINANCE: "RESOLVED, THAT THE BOND RESOLUTION ENTITLED, 'A RESOLUTION APPROPRIATING \$1,500,000 FOR THE COSTS OF INSTALLING AN AIR CONDITIONING SYSTEM IN THE CAFETERIA AT FAIRFIELD WARDE HIGH SCHOOL AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION,' BE, AND HEREBY IS, APPROVED."

Josh Garskof, District 5 moved this Item as distributed with the Call, duly seconded.

Alex Durrell, District 3 stated that FWHS desperately needs air conditioning and urged approval.

VOTE: The bond resolution in the amount of \$1,500,000 was approved by unanimous voice vote.

ITEM NO. 14 ON CALL: TO HEAR A REPORT FROM THE EDUCATION & RECREATION COMMITTEE

Mark McDermott, Education & Recreation Committee Chair reported the dredging at South Benson Marina is complete and is approximately \$10,000 under budget. Smith Richardson Golf Course opens on April 4th; the clubhouse has been torn down and is on track to open on 9/11. The BOE budget has been approved by

the Board of Education with a 3.9% increase. He reminded the Body to tour the Walter Fitzgerald campus if they had not already.

Crissy Kelly, District 9 reported that the information from Milone & McBroom is available on the BOE website. There is a lot of valuable information including a good synopsis of their report online.

ITEM NO. 15 ON CALL:

TO CONSIDER AND ACT UPON THE FOLLOWING AMENDMENTS TO THE TAX RELIEF FOR THE ELDERLY & DISABLED HOMEOWNERS ORDINANCE, SECTION 95-8 TO SECTION 95-15 OF CHAPTER 95, ARTICLE III, OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF FAIRFIELD, SPONSORED BY THE SENIOR & DISABLED TAX RELIEF COMMITTEE:

§ 95-8 CONDITIONS FOR ELIGIBILITY.

- <u>C.</u> THE APPLICANT SHALL BE ENTITLED TO TAX RELIEF IF ALL THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS ARE MET:
- SUCH PERSONS SHALL HAVE INDIVIDUALLY, UNMARRIED, OR JOINTLY, IF MARRIED, QUALIFYING INCOME IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED LIMITS DESCRIBED BELOW FOR EACH PROGRAM FOR THE TAX YEAR ENDING IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE APPLICATION FOR TAX RELIEF BENEFITS. "QUALIFYING INCOME" IS DEFINED AS ADJUSTED GROSS INCOME, AS DEFINED IN THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986, AS MAY BE AMENDED FROM TIME TO TIME, PLUS THE NONTAXABLE PORTION OF ANY SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFITS, RAILROAD RETIREMENT BENEFITS. ANY TAX SHELTER LOSSES, INCOME FROM OTHER TAX-EXEMPT RETIREMENTS AND ANNUITY SOURCES AND INCOME FROM TAX-EXEMPT BONDS AND ANY OTHER INCOME NOT INCLUDABLE IN ADJUSTED GROSS INCOME. UNREIMBURSED GROSS MEDICAL AND DENTAL EXPENSES SHALL BE DEDUCTED FROM INCOME IN CALCULATING THE APPLICANT'S QUALIFYING INCOME, AS LONG AS SUCH UNREIMBURSED GROSS MEDICAL AND DENTAL EXPENSES ARE INCLUDED ON THE APPLICANT'S FEDERAL INCOME TAX RETURN OF THE CALENDAR YEAR IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE YEAR OF APPLICATION AS AN ITEMIZED DEDUCTION AND QUALIFY AS A MEDICAL DEDUCTION UNDER SECTION 213(A) OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986, AS MAY BE AMENDED.

§ 95-15 TAX RELIEF PROGRAMS.

- B. TAX DEFERRAL. ANY TAXPAYER AGE 75 OR OLDER AT THE END OF THE PRECEDING CALENDAR YEAR AND MEETING THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS OF § 95-8 AND HAVING QUALIFYING INCOME NOT EXCEEDING \$80,000 MAY ELECT TO APPLY FOR A DEFERRAL OF UP TO 50% OF THE GROSS TAX LEVIED ON APPLICABLE PROPERTY EACH YEAR IN WHICH THE TAXPAYER, OR HIS SURVIVING SPOUSE, CONTINUES TO MEET SUCH ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS, SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING:
- (1) THE RECIPIENT SHALL ENTER INTO A WRITTEN AGREEMENT WITH THE TOWN PROVIDING FOR REIMBURSEMENT, WHICH SHALL BE RECORDED IN THE LAND RECORDS OF THE TOWN AND SHALL CONSTITUTE A LIEN ON THE PROPERTY PAYABLE UPON DEATH OR CONVEYANCE.
- (2) ALL DEFERRAL BENEFITS PLUS INTEREST SHALL BE REIMBURSED TO THE TOWN: A) ONE YEAR AFTER THE RECIPIENT'S DEATH, UNLESS THE RECIPIENT'S SURVIVING SPOUSE APPLIES FOR

- BENEFITS UNDER THIS PROGRAM AND ALSO QUALIFIES UNDER § 95-8; B) UPON CONVEYANCE OF THE REAL PROPERTY SUBJECT TO TAXATION; OR C) ONE YEAR AFTER THE PROPERTY IS NO LONGER THE RECIPIENT'S PRIMARY RESIDENCE.
- (3) ALL BENEFITS SHALL BE SUBJECT TO AN INTEREST CHARGE AT THE GREATER OF THE ANNUAL PERCENTAGE RATE OF 3% OR THE RATE ON TEN-YEAR UNITED STATES TREASURY NOTES. THE RATE FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE SET BY THE CHIEF FISCAL OFFICER OF THE TOWN OF FAIRFIELD ON JANUARY 31 IN EACH CALENDAR YEAR OR, IF SUCH DAY IS A DAY ON WHICH THE FISCAL OFFICE OF THE TOWN OF FAIRFIELD IS NOT OPEN, ON THE NEXT PRIOR DAY ON WHICH IT IS OPEN.
- SUCH RATE SHALL BE EFFECTIVE FOR THE FOLLOWING YEAR. SUCH INTEREST SHALL BE SIMPLE INTEREST, NOT COMPOUNDED, AND SHALL ACCRUE FROM THE DATE OF DEFERRAL UNTIL THE DATE OF REPAYMENT.
- (4) TOTAL DEFERMENTS. INCLUDING ACCRUED INTEREST, FOR ALL YEARS SHALL NOT EXCEED 70% OF THE MOST RECENT ASSESSED VALUE OF THE REAL PROPERTY.
- (5) THE QUALIFYING INCOME THRESHOLD OF \$80,000 FOR THE TAX DEFERRAL PROGRAM INDICATED IN § 95-15B ABOVE SHALL BE ADJUSTED IN THE SAME MANNER AS DESCRIBED IN § 95-15C(2) WITH RESPECT TO THE TAX CREDIT PROGRAM.
- (6) IF A DECREASE IN THE MILL RATE LOWERS THE NORMAL TAX BILL BELOW THE ORIGINAL DEFERRAL BASE, THE APPLICANT WILL PAY THE NORMAL TAX. WHEN THE NORMAL TAX BILL EXCEEDS THE ORIGINAL DEFERRAL BASE, THE APPLICANT WILL PAY THE ORIGINAL DEFERRAL BASE.
- (7) TAXPAYERS BETWEEN THE AGE 65 AND 75 WHO HAD PARTICIPATED IN THE TAX DEFERRAL OPTION AS OF THE 2012 GRAND LIST MAY REAPPLY FOR THEIR ORIGINAL DEFERRAL BASE (DEFERRING TAX ABOVE THAT BASE), PROVIDED THEIR QUALIFYING INCOME FOR THE PRECEDING YEAR DID NOT EXCEED \$80,000.
- Jill Vergara, District 7 moved to waive the reading of the Item.

"Qualifying income" is defined as adjusted gross income, as defined in the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as may be amended from time to time, plus the nontaxable portion of any social security benefits, railroad retirement benefits, any tax shelter losses, income from other tax-exempt retirements and annuity sources and income from tax exempt bonds and any other income not includable in adjusted gross income. Unreimbursed gross medical and dental expenses shall be deducted from income in calculating the applicant's Qualifying Income, as long as such unreimbursed gross medical and dental expenses are included on the applicant's federal income tax return of the calendar year immediately preceding the year of application as an itemized deduction and qualify as a medical deduction under Section 213(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as may be amended.
- § 95-15 Tax relief programs.
- B. Tax deferral. Any taxpayer age 75 or older at the end of the preceding calendar year and meeting the eligibility requirements of § 95-8 and having qualifying income not exceeding \$80,000 may elect to apply for a deferral of up to 50% of the gross tax levied on applicable property each year in which the taxpayer, or his surviving spouse, continues to meet such eligibility requirements, subject to the following:
- (1) The recipient shall enter into a written agreement with the Town providing for reimbursement, which shall be recorded in the land records of the Town and shall constitute a lien on the property payable upon death or conveyance.

- (2) All deferral benefits plus interest shall be reimbursed to the Town: a) one year after the recipient's death, unless the recipient's surviving spouse applies for benefits under this program and also qualifies under § 95-8; b) upon conveyance of the real property subject to taxation; or c) one year after the property is no longer the recipient's primary residence.
- (3) All benefits shall be subject to an interest charge at the greater of the annual percentage rate of 3% or the rate on ten-year United States Treasury Notes. The rate for the purposes of this subsection shall be set by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the Town of Fairfield on January 31 in each calendar year or, if such day is a day on which the fiscal office of the Town of Fairfield is not open, on the next prior day on which it is open. Such rate shall be effective for the following year. Such interest shall be simple interest, not compounded, and shall accrue from the date of deferral until the date of repayment.
- (4) Total deferments, including accrued interest, for all years shall not exceed 70% of the most recent assessed value of the real property.
- (5) The qualifying income threshold of \$80,000 for the tax deferral program indicated in § 95-15B above shall be adjusted in the same manner as described in § 95-15C(2) with respect to the tax credit program.
- (6) If a decrease in the mill rate lowers the normal tax bill below the original deferral base, the applicant will pay the normal tax. When the normal tax bill exceeds the original deferral base, the applicant will pay the original deferral base.
- (7) Taxpayers between the age 65 and 75 who had participated in the tax deferral option as of the 2012 Grand List may reapply for their original deferral base (deferring tax above that base), provided their qualifying income for the preceding year did not exceed \$80,000.

"Qualifying income" is defined as adjusted gross income, as defined in the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as may be amended from time to time, plus the nontaxable portion of any social security benefits, railroad retirement benefits, any tax shelter losses, income from other tax-exempt retirements and annuity sources and income from tax exempt bonds and any other income not includable in adjusted gross income. Unreimbursed gross medical and dental expenses shall be deducted from income in calculating the applicant's Qualifying Income, as long as such unreimbursed gross medical and dental expenses are included on the applicant's federal income tax return of the calendar year immediately preceding the year of application as an itemized deduction and qualify as a medical deduction under Section 213(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as may be amended. § 95-15 Tax relief programs. B. Tax deferral. Any taxpayer age 75 or older at the end of the preceding calendar year and meeting the eligibility requirements of § 95-8 and having qualifying income not exceeding \$80,000 may elect to apply for a deferral of up to 50% of the gross tax levied on applicable property each year in which the taxpayer, or his surviving spouse, continues to meet such eligibility requirements, subject to the following: (1) The recipient shall enter into a written agreement with the Town providing for reimbursement, which shall be recorded in the land records of the Town and shall constitute a lien on the property payable upon death or conveyance. (2) All deferral benefits plus interest shall be reimbursed to the Town: a) one year after the recipient's death, unless the recipient's surviving spouse applies for benefits under this program and also qualifies under § 95-8; b) upon conveyance of the real property subject to taxation; or c) one year after the property is no longer the recipient's primary residence. (3) All benefits shall be subject to an interest charge at the greater of the annual

percentage rate of 3% or the rate on ten-year United States Treasury Notes. The rate for the purposes of this subsection shall be set by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the Town of Fairfield on January 31 in each calendar year or, if such day is a day on which the fiscal office of the Town of Fairfield is not open, on the next prior day on which it is open. Such rate shall be effective for the following year. Such interest shall be simple interest, not compounded, and shall accrue from the date of deferral until the date of repayment. (4) Total deferments, including accrued interest, for all years shall not exceed 70% of the most recent assessed value of the real property. RTM WARNING FEBRUARY 24, 2020 (5) The qualifying income threshold of \$80,000 for the tax deferral program indicated in § 95-15B above shall be adjusted in the same manner as described in § 95-15C(2) with respect to the tax credit program. (6) If a decrease in the mill rate lowers the normal tax bill below the original deferral base, the applicant will pay the normal tax. When the normal tax bill exceeds the original deferral base, the applicant will pay the original deferral base. (7) Taxpayers between the age 65 and 75 who had participated in the tax deferral option as of the 2012 Grand List may reapply for their original deferral base (deferring tax above that base), provided their qualifying income for the preceding year did not exceed \$80,000.

§ 95-8 Conditions for eligibility.

C. The applicant shall be entitled to tax relief if all the following conditions are met:

(5) Such persons shall have individually, if unmarried, or jointly, if married, qualifying income in an amount not to exceed limits described below for each program for the tax year ending immediately preceding the application for tax relief benefits. "Qualifying income" is defined as adjusted gross income, as defined in the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as may be amended from time to time, plus the nontaxable portion of any social security benefits, railroad retirement benefits, any tax shelter losses, income from other tax-exempt retirements and annuity sources and income from tax- exempt bonds and any other income not includable in adjusted gross income. Unreimbursed gross medical and dental expenses shall be deducted from income in calculating the applicant's Qualifying Income, as long as such unreimbursed gross medical and dental expenses are included on the applicant's federal income tax return of the calendar year immediately preceding the year of application as an itemized deduction and qualify as a medical deduction under Section 213(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as may be amended.

§ 95-15 Tax relief programs.

B. Tax deferral. Any taxpayer age 75 or older at the end of the preceding calendar year and meeting the eligibility requirements of § 95-8 and having

qualifying income not exceeding \$80,000 may elect to apply for a deferral of up to 50% of the gross tax levied on applicable property each year in which the taxpayer, or his surviving spouse, continues to meet such eligibility requirements, subject to the following:

- (1) The recipient shall enter into a written agreement with the Town providing for reimbursement, which shall be recorded in the land records of the Town and shall constitute a lien on the property payable upon death or conveyance.
- (2) All deferral benefits plus interest shall be reimbursed to the Town: a) one year after the recipient's death, unless the recipient's surviving spouse applies for benefits under this program and also qualifies under § 95-8; b) upon conveyance of the real property subject to taxation; or c) one year after the property is no longer the recipient's primary residence.
- (3) All benefits shall be subject to an interest charge at the greater of the annual percentage rate of 3% or the rate on ten-year United States Treasury Notes. The rate for the purposes of this subsection shall be set by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the Town of Fairfield on January 31 in each calendar year or, if such day is a day on which the fiscal office of the Town of Fairfield is not open, on the next prior day on which it is open. Such rate shall be effective for the following year. Such interest shall be simple interest, not compounded, and shall accrue from the date of deferral until the date of repayment. (4) Total deferments, including accrued interest, for all years shall not exceed 70% of the most recent assessed value of the real property.
- (5) The qualifying income threshold of \$80,000 for the tax deferral program indicated in § 95-15B above shall be adjusted in the same manner as described in § 95-15C(2) with respect to the tax credit program.
- (6) If a decrease in the mill rate lowers the normal tax bill below the original deferral base, the applicant will pay the normal tax. When the normal tax bill exceeds the original deferral base, the applicant will pay the original deferral base.
- (7) Taxpayers between the age 65 and 75 who had participated in the tax deferral option as of the 2012 Grand List may reapply for their original deferral base (deferring tax above that base), provided their qualifying income for the preceding year did not exceed \$80,000.

Representative Havey moved to accept the item as presented, seconded by Representative Nickel. The motion passed unanimously.
