Dear Ms. Kupchick:

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has information that indicates the Town of Fairfield owns the property known as "The Reclamation Yard", located on Richard White Way, Fairfield, Connecticut (the Site). EPA has received information which indicates that debris on the Site contains PCBs up to 230 ppm which exceeds the allowable PCB levels under the federal PCB Regulations. Therefore, PCBs have been improperly disposed of at the Site and cleanup of these PCB-contaminated materials is required under the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA), 15 U.S.C. §2605(e), and the PCB Regulations at 40 CFR Part 761.

Any cleanup and disposal work involving federally regulated PCB-contaminated materials must be conducted in accordance with 40 CFR § 761.61. Within 10 days of receipt of this letter, provide information as to what actions you have taken or will take, to address the PCB contamination at the Site. This information should be provided to:
