We are at a point in America where we don't just disagree with others elsewhere on the political spectrum, but also don't trust their honesty, motives and morality. For many of us, we have given up the notion of having current event conversations with those on the other side.

The reasons for our current polarization are many, and most have been in the making for decades. There have been a multitude of changes in America that have occurred during our lifetimes. This one-day course examines the last 50 years of economic, social and political history to see the key people, organized groups and pivotal societal and environmental trends that have contributed to the current state of our polarization. At the end of the session, there will be a class exchange of ideas on how America might become more resilient and stable against the populist tide we witness today.

## **VELIKOVSKY AND “WORLDS IN COLLISION”**

In 1952 a blockbuster best-selling book – “Worlds in Collision” – by Immanuel Velikovsky, was published. Velikovsky, a psychiatrist and an expert on ancient history, had come up with extremely radical theories about the history of the earth and our solar system, all universally rejected by scientists everywhere. Everyone said that Velikovsky was so terribly wrong that he needed to be actively censored to keep his crazy ideas from polluting real science.

Many of his crazy scientific predictions were found to be true, as we went to the moon and sent out space probes to the planets. Establishment scientists were astonished. Velikovsky predicted Earth’s Van Allen radiation belts 2 years before they were observed. He correctly predicted what the back side of the moon would look like, an extremely hot temperature for the surface of Venus, radio waves coming from Jupiter, and countless other examples, many of which needed space probe missions before they could be confirmed. This class will show how many of his radical ideas are now accepted by the establishment. The main villain who tried to suppress Velikovsky and constantly vilified him was the famous astronomer and media star Carl Sagan.

**Dave Shafer** has designed high-tech optical systems for the last 57 years in the fields of laser nuclear fusion, top secret military projects, cinematography camera lenses, space chips. His 200 US and foreign patents range from an unusual stereo viewer for Salvador Dali, and a telescope that went to Saturn, and a way to detect hidden paparazzi cameras.

The Institute for the Study of Global Antisemitism and Policy (ISGAP) – an international consortium of scholars devoted to the study of antisemitism and the improvement of education on this difficult topic – celebrated its 20-year anniversary this year, and held its annual two-week seminars for scholars in Oxford, UK this summer, as usual. And yet this year is not like other years given the alarming growth of antisemitism around the world and even in our own country. Patricia Behre, Ph.D., will bring us an update on the state of academic engagement with this topic – the perils and plans to combat antisemitism – drawing from her participation as a scholar-in-residence, hearing from an international team of scholars, at the ISGAP Oxford seminar in August 2024.

**Patricia Behre, P.D.** is Associate Professor and Chair of History at Fairfield University. This update follows from her course at Bigelow: “Antisemitism: Medieval Hatred, Modern Realty,” which she taught most recently in Spring 2024. There will be time for audience questions and discussion.

## LOVE LETTERS FROM A PATRIOT

War letters are history—real time, first person history, written as it happened by those most intimately involved. John D. Upton's first letter to his wife Katie was written on Friday July 31, 1942, from Fort Belvoir, Virginia. It is the first of more than 200 letters that Lieutenant Upton wrote to his wife and family until his discharge on December 12, 1945, as a captain. He was assigned to the 19<sup>th</sup> Combat Engineer Regiment and was Company Commander of "B" Company. The 19<sup>th</sup> Combat Engineers served in the all-important North African Campaign, the Invasion of Sicily and the Italian Campaign.

By 1946, John and Katie had two daughters, Mary and Elinor. They eventually moved to Greens Farms, CT. where John (aka Jack) spent the rest of his life. It was only by chance that these letters and photographs were discovered when cleaning out his home after he died in 2005 at age of 95. Clearly they needed to be preserved. Elinor felt compelled to share her father's experiences in a beautiful and unique book, *Love Letters from a Patriot*.

**Elinor Upton Biggs** inherits her love of writing from her great, great, great, grandfather, P.T. Barnum and her father, an advertising executive. She was an English Major and a graduate of the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill. Her career has included senior marketing positions in telecommunications, financial and fashion industries. In addition to her business career she has been involved with a variety of nonprofits including the Arts, as a longstanding member of the Board of Directors of the Barnum Museum and as a volunteer for Make-A-Wish Connecticut. In addition to *Love Letters from a Patriot – a memoir*, Elinor is the author of three poetry books and several children's books. She lives in Southport, CT with her husband.

## **DARK MONEY**

This two-hour course will discuss the book *Dark Money* by Jane Mayer, written in 2016. The book describes in vivid detail how a small group of ultrawealthy individuals have organized to help to fund the radical right. Those discussed include the Koch brothers, Mellon-Scaife, Coors, Olin and DeVos. Their views are that social programs and federal regulations weaken America, and that the country should allow for free-market capitalism to reign. Through their foundations and other monied creations they have impacted tax policy, climate change beliefs, supreme court appointments and academic teachings. Their quest to alter the American political system began in the 1970's and is in much evidence today. The course will shed light on the major players, their central ideas, the institutions they've established in furtherance of their goals and how they have shaped America's political landscape.

Camille Pissarro was a French Jewish painter and is widely considered the Father of the Impressionist movement. He was a mentor to many of the world's great painters including Cézanne, Degas, Renoir, Seurat, Gauguin, Monet and Van Gogh, despite some of them having anti-Semitic beliefs. We'll explore these relationships and how they impacted this great art movement.

**Scott Verchin** is an independent business consultant, which includes the visual arts and museum sectors. Throughout his career, he has served such notable roles as Publisher of MUSEUMS and ARCHAEOLOGY magazines. Scott has also been a contributor to Art Market Magazine covering US exhibitions. As a lifelong patron of the arts, Scott has frequented art museums and galleries on five different continents. Mr. Verchin hosted his first exhibition, BLACK & WHITE PAINTINGS, on Long Island in 1989.
