WHEREAS, on August 1, 2023, the Town of Fairfield received the State of Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection Draft Agreement/Grant/Contract approving the Urban Act Grant program application in the amount of \$2,500,000 for the Rooster River Flood Mitigation Project; and

WHEREAS, the acceptance of a \$2,500,000 Urban Act Grant to receive, fund and expend project costs associated with the Rooster River Flood Mitigation Project of which one hundred percent of said project costs are paid (reimbursed) by the State grant and appropriated \$2,500,000 for said project costs;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that First Selectman William A. Gerber be, and hereby is, authorized to accept and sign any agreements between the Town of Fairfield and the State of Connecticut related to and any additional Urban Act Grant funding associated with the Rooster River Flood Mitigation Project." 11.
