## To the Citizens of Gila County from Gila County Sheriff Adam Shepherd:

**Welcome to the 2018 Annual Report for the Gila County Sheriff's Office.** We are excited to inform the citizens and visitors to Gila County that in addition to the numerous services that we continue to provide, we added 2 new services in 2018 making it even easier for members of the public to obtain information and interact with the office.

First, the Sheriff's Office contracted with Logic Tree IT Solutions to develop a branded smartphone app. The app provides a variety of information, one of the most popular being the mugshot section. Photographs accompany criminal charge(s) for recent arrestees. Additionally, the app allows users to make direct contact with dispatch, report suspicious activity directly to north and south commands, report suspicious drug activity to the task force, and be linked to other county law enforcement agency's Facebook pages. Other areas of the app are being developed and we see this becoming the premier method in maintaining contact with the citizens that we serve.

Second, the Sheriff Office entered into additional agreements with our existing inmate calling provider (GTL Inc.) to provide a modern visitation system. It is no longer necessary for friends and family of arrestees to travel to our detention centers for visitation; they can simply sign up for an online service and schedule their visit remotely using a computer, tablet or smartphone and internet connection. Although there is a small fee for the service, it eliminates the inconvenience of having to travel to our jails. In-person visitation (using the same system) is still available at the Globe and Payson locations.

In addition to visiting our offices in Globe and Payson in person, citizens can also connect to our Facebook page by searching for 'Gila County Sheriff's Office,' and following our page for real-time emergency notices and regional information including our daily news releases (Further information on social media contact can be found later in this report). In addition, Offender Watch' is an automated sex-offender tracking system where residents can search their neighborhoods and sign up for notifications. We also continue to offer a completely anonymous reporting system for criminal activity, thanks to a partnership with Freeport McMoran called 'WeTip'. Information can be provided online at <https://wetip.com/> or by calling 1-800-78-crime. The Sheriff's Office encourages all county residents to sign up with Everbridge at <http://www.readygila.com/> and follow other information on the site regarding preparedness for emergencies. In addition statewide road conditions can be found through the State of Arizona's information system on the internet at <http://www.az511.gov/traffic/>, or by calling 511.

We are always looking for persons who would like to explore a career in law enforcement, who have served in another jurisdiction or would like to volunteer for the Sheriff's Office. ### **Jail Visitation**

In September of 2018, the Gila County Sheriff’s Office partnered with GTL (Global TeLink) to have a new video visitation system installed in both the Globe and Payson Jails. With this new system, friends and family of inmates can come to the lobby of the Globe or Payson Jails, login to their visitor profile and visit an inmate over a monitor without the need to wait on Jail Staff OR family and friends can visit an inmate remotely from a home computer or smartphone, once they have downloaded the visitation app and created a visitor profile. This new system also allows inmates to send messages (emails) to friends and family for less than the cost of a postage stamp.

**Each Inmate is given one free hour of visitation per week.**

**The fees for visiting longer than one hour and remote visitation are \$0.25 per minute.**

**The fee to send a message (email) is \$0.05 per message.**

Family and friends can download the **GettingOut Visits** app from the app store of their Android or apple device or visit [www.gettingout.com](http://www.gettingout.com) to set up a visitor profile and visit from a home computer. Please understand that visitors must create a visitor profile at the county jail lobbies, on the **GettingOut** website or the **GettingOut Visits** mobile apps before they can visit an inmate.

There is no visitation on Mondays or on a Tuesday following a Monday Holiday due to the high volume of court traffic on those days. Visitation hours are 08:30-10:30, 11:30-3:30, 4:30-6:00 and 6:30-8:30.

# DIVE TEAM

The Gila County Sheriff's Office supports the Dive Team with training, personnel and equipment. The team is made up of seven (7) members. Five (5) of those individuals are Sheriff's Office employees and two (2) are volunteers who donate their time.

In 2018, the Sheriff sent three of his divers to five days of in-class training which included three certifications and one online class. The training included:

- \* 1st and 2nd stage repair.
- \* Cold water diving challenges.
- \* Diver's Alert Network diagnostic skills.
- \* Emergency Action Plan.
- \* Full Face Mask inspection and repair.
- \* Remote operations injury management.
- \* Repeated failures and lost opportunities in social media.
- \* Risk mitigation for the safety conscious dive operation.
- \* Scuba Dive International / TDI / ERDI update.
- \* Top three annoying medical problems for dive professionals.
- \* Valve inspection and repair.
- \* Visual Cylinder Inspection.

Having highly trained divers allows the Sheriff to reduce costs by reducing the amount of gear needed to be serviced elsewhere.
